“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted that all pay, pensions, grants, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas we consider it desirable, as a measure of economy, to replace the Metropolitan Police employed at certain of Your Majesty's Naval Establishments by a Force of Retired Officers and Pensioners of the Royal Marines, to be known as the Royal Marine Police :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to sanction the formation of a Royal Marine Police Force, consisting of the following ranks, and with the rates of pay shown against each rank respectively :—

“(a) Retired Captains or Lieutenants, R.M.A. or R.M.L.I., employed as Officers of the Royal Marine Police, to be paid £1 per diem :

“(b) *Grade I*, consisting of Retired Warrant Officers, R.M.A. or R.M.L.I., or of Pensioners promoted from *Grade II*, to be paid :—

“(d) *Grade III*, consisting of Long Service Pensioners, R.M.A. or R.M.L.I., to

“ All the said ranks to be provided with Service accommodation, or, if such be not available, to be granted such allowances in lieu as may from time to time be approved by us, with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury.

“ We beg leave further to recommend that Your Majesty may be pleased to direct by Your said Order in Council:—

“(1) That gratuities may be paid at our discretion to members of the Royal Marine Police Force on retirement or discharge from the Force at the following rates for each complete calendar month served in any rank of the Force, the rate of gratuity to depend in each case upon the rank held at the date of retirement or discharge:—

Commissioned Officers: £6 a month up to a maximum gratuity of £1,080.

Grade I: £4 10s. a month up to a maximum of £810.

Grade II: £1 5s. a month.

Grade III: £1 a month.

“(2) That in the event of a member of the Royal Marine Police dying whilst serving in the Force, the amount of the gratuity earned by him may be credited to his estate, and that in the event of death or disability directly attributable to the conditions of service, additional compensation may be paid at our discretion to the member of the Force or to his dependent relatives according to the Regulations in force for corresponding ranks of the Royal Marines:

“(3) That the rates of Retired Pay or Pension granted to members of the Royal Marine Police by virtue of previous service in the Royal Marines, may be paid to them in addition to the special emoluments detailed above, and may be secured to them notwithstanding any breach of discipline committed during the period of their service in the Royal Marine Police, provided that such breach be neither Mutiny nor Felony, nor of such a nature as to be punished by dismissal with ignominy or disgrace.

“ We beg leave further to recommend that Your Majesty may be pleased to direct that the rates of pay, and of gratuity on retirement or discharge, proposed above shall have effect until the 30th day of June, 1924, and shall be liable to revision periodically thereafter, as Your Majesty in Council may be graciously pleased from time to time to direct.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the foregoing proposals, which it is submitted should take effect from August 1st, 1922.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction in the case of Officers' Stewards and Cooks who transfer to continuous service under the terms of Your Order in Council of the 11th October, 1921, the counting of such time for transfer, advancement, progressive pay and all other purposes; the time to be allowed to reckon on the basis of the last rating actually held before such period of employment except where otherwise specially directed by the Admiralty.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

“ Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks, and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

“ And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the pro-

visions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas by an Order in Council of His late Majesty, dated the 28th July, 1906, it is provided, *inter alia*, that the appointment of Receiver and Agent for the Greenwich Estate will not confer any claim to pension or gratuity:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council, dated the 13th October, 1910, it is authorized that the following shall be the maximum limits for the salary of the Receiver and Agent for the Greenwich Estate:—

"When the appointment is held by an Officer whose civil emoluments are subject to a deduction of ten per cent. by the Rules under Section 6 of the Superannuation Act of 1887.	} £338 17s. 9d. per annum with residence or allowance of £50 per annum in lieu thereof.
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"When the appointment is held by an Officer whose civil emoluments are not subject to such deduction.	} £300 per annum, with residence or allowance of £50 per annum in lieu thereof.
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"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable that such appointment should be regarded as an established and pensionable one and that the present salary should be revised:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the appointment of Receiver and Agent for the Greenwich Estate being regarded as an established one and pensionable under conditions similar to those laid down by the Superannuation Acts, and further to authorize the salary attached to such appointment being fixed as from the 1st April, 1922, at a scale of £300 to £400 per annum, rising by annual increments of £10:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to appoint a Clerk to the Receiver and Agent for the Greenwich Estate and a Foreman in charge of Works on the Estate:

"And whereas we are further of opinion that such appointments should be regarded as established and pensionable ones:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the appointment as from the 5th January, 1922, of such Officers on a scale of salary of £200 to £250 per annum, rising by annual increments of £10, and further to authorize such posts being regarded as established and pensionable ones under conditions similar to those laid down in the Superannuation Acts.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their assent to these posts being rendered established."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council, bearing date the 15th day of August, 1918, and the 25th day of March, 1920, to sanction respectively the formation of a Special Reserve of Officers, Royal Marines, and of a Special Reserve of Engineer Officers, Royal Navy, and to provide, *inter alia*, that, subject to certain conditions, Officers of these Reserves should receive a retaining fee when not employed in Your Majesty's Navy and in receipt of pay from Naval funds:

"And whereas we consider that such retaining fees should not be paid to any Officers of these Reserves after the Reserves have been called out for service in war or emergency:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to suspend the issue of retaining fees to all Officers of these Reserves from the date of Your Majesty's Proclamation calling out the Reserves, irrespective of whether particular Officers are actually mobilised or not."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein,

shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by an Order in Council of His late Majesty bearing date the 19th day of November, 1902, sanction was given to the establishment of a Royal Naval Auxiliary Sick Berth Reserve:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of June, 1913, sanction was given to the institution in the Reserve of a superior grade to be known as 'Reserve Wardmaster':

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the titles, pay and allowances of the Royal Naval Auxiliary Sick Berth Reserve should be assimilated to those of the Sick Berth Branch of Your Majesty's Navy:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction:—

(a) the rating and advancement of all men serving in this Reserve on or after the 29th day of January, 1921, in grades corresponding to those of the Sick Berth Branch of Your Majesty's Navy:

(b) the grant of pay and allowances to men of this Reserve as from the 29th day of January, 1921, at the rates and under the conditions set forth in the subjoined schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"ROYAL NAVAL AUXILIARY SICK BERTH RESERVE.

"Regulations as to pay and allowances.

"1. Reservists when undergoing training at a Royal Naval Hospital or on board one of H.M. Ships or when called out on mobilisation will receive the rates of pay in force from time to time for the corresponding Continuous Service ratings of the Royal Navy. They will also be eligible for Marriage Allowance at the rates and subject to the conditions applicable from time to time in the Royal Navy, provided, as regards training, that the period thereof is not less than seven days.

"2. Only actual mobilised service will reckon towards increments of pay in the respective ratings. For this purpose past mobilised service during war or emergency in the ratings of Junior Reserve Attendant, Senior Reserve Attendant and Reserve Wardmaster will be reckoned as follows:—

Service as Junior Reserve Attendant will be reckoned as service as Sick Berth Attendant.

Service as Senior Reserve Attendant will be reckoned as service as Leading Sick Berth Attendant.

Service as Reserve Wardmaster will be reckoned as service as Sick Berth Chief Petty Officer.

Any Reservist with previous service as a Sick Berth rating in the Royal Navy will reckon such service for progressive pay provided that the interval between the dates of his discharge from the Royal Navy and of his entry into the Reserve be less than five years.

"3. Reservists will be eligible for Good Conduct Badges under the Regulations in force

in the Royal Navy except that only mobilised service or service as a Naval rating will be allowed to count towards the prescribed qualifying periods. Whilst undergoing training or when mobilised they will receive pay for such Badges at the rates authorized from time to time in the Royal Navy.

"4. A gratuity of £5 will be paid to each man on being called out provided that he is medically fit.

"5. A Reservist injured on duty while borne on the books of one of H.M. Ships or Establishments for training, and thereby rendered incapable of resuming his civil employment and caused to suffer pecuniary loss may, at the discretion of the Admiralty be granted an allowance for a period not exceeding six months at rates to be settled from time to time with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury.

"6. A similar allowance may at the discretion of the Admiralty be paid to a Reservist who is incapacitated by illness which is proved to the satisfaction of the Admiralty to have been contracted in or by the performance of training while borne on the books of one of H.M. Ships or Establishments.

"7. Payment of the allowance referred to in paragraphs 5 and 6 will be limited to the period during which the Reservist is shown to have been unable to follow his occupation and will not be granted for any period during which he may have been treated in a Naval Hospital or Sick Quarters. No claim for the allowance will be admitted which is not preferred within twelve months of the training in question.

"8. Widows and children, if any, and certain other dependent relatives of Reservists who may be killed in action or die from wounds, injuries, or disease directly attributable to the conditions of service, whether on actual service or under training, will receive pensions and compassionate allowances on the same scale as the widows, children and other dependent relatives of Naval ratings.

"9. A fee of 2s. 6d. for each Reservist under instruction may be paid to a Chief or other Sick Berth Rating of the Royal Navy deputed to give instruction to Reservists.

"10. These regulations will supersede those laid down in Order in Council of the 19th November, 1902, with effect from the 29th January, 1921."

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are, from time to time, directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 7th February, 1921, to sanction, *inter alia*, an improved scale of Long Service Pension to Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Royal Navy and Royal Marines:

“And whereas Your Majesty was further graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council dated the 6th February, 1922, to sanction an improved scale of pensions and gratuities to Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, Seamen, Marines and Boys, who, consequent on wounds, hurts, or disability, are invalided from Your Majesty's Naval Service:

“And whereas we have had under our consideration the Regulations governing the grant of Naval Pensions for long service, or on invaliding, to Native Petty Officers and men, other than Europeans, of Your Majesty's Naval Service, and are of opinion that the grant of pensions and gratuities at the full rates allowable by Your Majesty's Orders in Council of 7th February, 1921, and 6th February, 1922, is inexpedient:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with retrospective effect from 1st April, 1919, the following modifications in the rates and scales of pensions or gratuities when they are applied to natives, other than Europeans, who are entitled thereto under existing regulations:—

(1) The basic scale of long service pension to be three farthings a day for each complete year of pensionable service, instead of three halfpence.

(2) Disability pensions or gratuities to be at one half of the amount ordinarily allowable for length of service and/or disablement to Europeans in similar circumstances, plus the full rank element when permissible.

(3) The gratuity issuable on award of Good Conduct Medal to be ten pounds, instead of twenty pounds.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of September, 1922 (N. 8302/22), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, grants, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, a Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are, from time to time, directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas in view of the reduced requirements of Your Majesty's Naval Service a reduction has become necessary in the personnel of certain Naval ratings and Marine ranks:

“And whereas we are of opinion that compensation for the loss of advantages which would have accrued to them in Your Majesty's Service should be paid to such men (with certain specified exceptions) as have been or may be selected for discharge for the purpose of such reduction:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of pensions, gratuities and bonuses at the rates, and subject to the restrictions, conditions and provisions set forth in the annexed Schedule, to those men who have been selected for discharge subsequently to the 12th May, 1922, in consequence of the reduction of Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force, or who may, at our discretion, hereafter be selected for discharge in order to complete that reduction, except in the following cases, viz. :—

(i) men who are pensioners, or who have completed their engagements and have not re-engaged, unless they have become time-expired during the period of reduction and were not debarred from re-engagement by existing Regulations;

(ii) men who have undertaken to serve only during a Ship's commission;

(iii) foreigners or men of colour.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“SCHEDULE.

“SECTION A.

“1. Continuous service ratings (except those serving under Short Service engagements for definite periods of seven years or less), non-continuous service ratings and Marine ranks, with 12 or more years' pensionable service, reckoned up to the 11th August, 1922, to be eligible for pensions, to date from the day after ceasing pay, at the rates shown below. For the purpose of time to count for pension, the period up to the 11th August, 1922, to be reckoned in full, although discharge may have taken place before that date.

“If a man was detained beyond the 11th August, 1922, through causes not under his

own control, the time for pension purposes to count to the date of his discharge.

"2. The usual additions for Petty Time allowances, viz.:—Chief Petty Officer after 12 years' pensionable service, Petty Officer, and leading rate service, to be allowed as under existing Regulations.

"Additional allowances for Good Conduct Badges and Good Conduct Medal to be granted at the rates approved in Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 7th February, 1921, but to be based on the men's qualifications at the date of actual discharge.

"Men who can show 22 years' pensionable service to be entitled to 1d. a day addition to their pension provided their character has been assessed as 'Very Good' throughout their service.

"3. Men pensioned under this Section to receive a gratuity equal to the difference for 21 months between the substantive rate of pay of their rating, whether 'acting' or confirmed, and the basic rate of pension, unless they are within 21 months of completing time for pension, when gratuities will be similarly calculated on the difference of time between the actual date of discharge and the date they would have completed time for pension.

"4. Men with less than 12 years' pensionable service who would have completed 12 years by the 11th August, 1922, will not be eligible for benefits under this Section if they fall within any of the following categories:—

(a) Men with character assessed below 'Good' for two out of the three consecutive years immediately preceding discharge;

(b) Men with ability assessed below 'Satisfactory' for two out of the three consecutive years immediately preceding discharge.

(Note to (a) and (b)—Assessment due for the portion of 1922 served up to the date of discharge to be considered the last yearly assessment.)

(c) Men sentenced by Court Martial or Warrant, or its equivalent in the case of Royal Marines serving under the Army Act, on more than two occasions during the 24 months immediately preceding discharge;

(d) Men marked 'Run' between the 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, unless the 'Run' has subsequently been removed by proper authority.

"5. In the case of Officers' Stewards and Cooks, the period by which pensionable service in sea-going ships in commission falls short of seven years to be deducted from the total pensionable Service.

"6. The foregoing rates of pension not to be liable to reduction hereafter in respect of reduced cost of living.

"7. Time served in the Army and the Royal Air Force to count towards pension, or bonus under Sections (B) and (C) below, as under existing Regulations.

"8. In the event of a man who has accepted discharge under these conditions being allowed to re-enter, he may be required to refund the whole of any payment made to him in respect of gratuity under paragraph 3 above, or bonus under Sections (B) and (C) below, as a condition of reckoning his former service for any further pension or gratuity.

" SECTION B.

"1. Continuous Service ratings, except those serving under Short Service engagements for definite periods of less than seven years, non-continuous service ratings and Marine ranks ineligible for pension under Section (A), but with at least five years' pensionable service reckoned up to the 11th August, 1922, or to date of discharge if detained later through causes not under their own control, to be eligible for bonuses at the following rates:—

Men with at least 11 years' pensionable service, unless they fall within any of the categories referred to in Section (A), paragraph 4, to be eligible for 24 months' (730 days) substantive pay.

Men with 10 but under 11 years, except men with 10 years' service to date of application who fall within any of the categories referred to in Section (A), paragraph 4, to be eligible for 21 months' (638 days) substantive pay.

Men with 9 but under 10 years to be eligible for 18 months' (547 days) substantive pay.

Men with 8 but under 9 years to be eligible for 15 months' (456 days) substantive pay.

Men with 7 but under 8 years to be eligible for 12 months' (365 days) substantive pay.

Men with 6 but under 7 years to be eligible for 9 months' (273 days) substantive pay.

Men with 5 but under 6 years to be eligible for 6 months' (182 days) substantive pay.

"The restrictions referred to in Section (A), paragraph 4, not to apply to men with under 10 years' pensionable service at the date of application.

"2. Men serving under short service engagements for definite periods of seven years not to count more than 11 years' service in all for the payment of bonus under this Section.

" SECTION C.

"1. The following classes, viz.:—

(1) Naval ratings and Marine ranks who have less than 5 years' pensionable service, reckoned up to the 11th August, 1922, or to the date of discharge in the case of men detained later through causes not under their own control;

(2) Special Service ratings, and Continuous Service ratings serving under Short Service engagements for definite periods of less than 7 years, whatever their previous length of service;

(3) Men with from 10 to 12 years' pensionable service at the date of application who fall within any of the categories (a) to (d) of Section (A), paragraph 4, to be eligible for a bonus of £20 only.

"2. Debts due to the Crown not to be recoverable from bonuses of £20 payable under this Section."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by His Majesty's vessels, and other vessels, navigating the waters of the Port and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain Regulations and Rules were made by Orders in Council dated the 16th day of December, 1912, the 9th day of February, 1914, the 4th day of September, 1918, and the 21st day of December, 1920, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth:

And whereas it appears expedient to amend such Rules as hereinafter provided:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.

2. Clause 17 of the Second Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 16th day of December, 1912, as amended by the said Order in Council dated the 4th day of September, 1918, and Clause 20 of the Second Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 16th day of December, 1912, as amended by the said Order in Council dated the 9th day of February, 1914, are hereby repealed.

3. The following Rules shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth, and shall be read and construed as though inserted in the Second Schedule of the said Order in Council dated the 16th day of December, 1912, in the position indicated by the numbers prefixed thereto:—

17. When one of His Majesty's vessels or other vessel being either in charge of His Majesty's Officers or over 2,500 tons gross register intends to pass in or out of the Harbour she shall hoist the Red Ensign over "M" flag (International Code—alphabetical) by day, or a red light by night at

the foremast head, and all other of His Majesty's vessels present in the port shall hoist the Pilot Jack by day, or show position lights (two white lights vertical 8 feet apart, hoisted at the peak, or if no gaff, hoisted abreast of the maintop in the middle line of the ship or on the *Ensign Staff*) by night, as a general warning. The Pilot Jack shall be hoisted by day, or position lights by night at the sub-signal station, King's Stairs, and at Fort Blockhouse, and position lights shall also be shewn at the Horse Fort by night, for the same purpose, and all other vessels under way in the harbour shall keep out of the way of the said vessel flying the Red Ensign over "M" flag by day, or showing the red light by night, at the foremast head; provided always that the said vessel shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.

20. When it is specially necessary to keep the harbour channel clear owing to a very large vessel or royal yacht entering or leaving harbour, a red oblong flag with a white diagonal bar from the outer upper corner will be hoisted by day, or three green lights vertical by night, at the sub-signal station, King's Stairs, Fort Blockhouse and Horse Fort, and while this flag is flying or those green lights are being shewn, no vessel is to enter the harbour from either end.

1. The Principal Order shall extend to the Free City of Danzig as if it were amongst the Foreign Countries of the Copyright Union therein named, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) The provisions of Article 2, proviso (iii) (a) shall apply as if the Free City of Danzig were included amongst the Foreign Countries named in those provisions.

(b) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is the Free City of Danzig the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act and for the Commencement of the Principal Order.

(c) In the application to such works of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever that expression occurs, and the 24th day of June, 1922, for the passing of the Act.

(d) In the application to such works of the provisions of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in Sub-section (1) (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in Sub-section 1 (b).

2. This Order may be cited as the Berne Copyright Convention (Free City of Danzig) Order, 1922.

The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, shall apply to the parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

And whereas the Colonies concerned have agreed to the payment and apportionment of such expenses in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers on this behalf, by the said West Indian Court of Appeal Act, 1919, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the West Indian Court of Appeal (Expenses) Order in Council, 1922.

2.—(1) All fees paid in pursuance of any Rules of Court made under the provisions of the West Indian Court of Appeal Act, 1919, shall be paid into an Account to be called the Court Fees Account and shall be applied and dealt with as follows:—

(a) The expenses of the Court for each year ending the 31st day of December shall be paid out of the said Account, and any balance remaining unexpended at the end of any year shall be carried forward and applied to the like purpose in the ensuing year.

(b) If the moneys standing to the credit of the said Account shall be insufficient to pay the expenses of the Court in any year, the sum required to satisfy the balance of such expenses remaining unpaid (hereinafter called the unpaid balance) shall, until a further provision in that behalf shall be made, be paid and borne by the Colonies concerned in the proportions specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

(2) The judges of the Court, or a majority of them of whom the president shall be one, may make regulations with regard to the management and supervision of the said Account, and every year not later than the 30th day of June an Annual Statement, to be signed by three judges of the Court, of whom the president shall be one, shall be issued setting forth (a) the amount standing to the credit of the said Account on the 31st day of December in the preceding year, (b) the total amount of the expenses of the Court for the year ending on the said 31st day of December, and (c) the apportionment of the unpaid balance (if any) amongst the Colonies concerned in accordance with the Schedule hereunto annexed, and every such Annual Statement shall be binding upon each of the Colonies concerned.

3. This Order shall be published in the Gazette in each of the Colonies concerned and shall be deemed to have commenced and come into operation in each of the said Colonies on such day, whether before or after the passing of this Order, as shall be named for that purpose by a Proclamation to be issued by the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony.

Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 27th day of July, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Dore and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint John, Abbey Dale, both in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Southwell:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Dore and the said New Parish of Saint John, Abbey Dale, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Dore and the said New Parish of Saint John, Abbey Dale, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas by an Instrument dated the 13th day of July, 1922, and published in the London Gazette on the 21st day of the same month, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in consideration of a benefaction of £1,200 sterling paid to us for the spiritual benefit of the Hamlet or Township of Totley, in the said Parish and Benefice of Dore, and in respect of which we have agreed and undertaken to make a yearly payment of £60, did in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111, grant to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Dore one yearly sum or stipend of £60, such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated from the 1st day of June, 1922, and to be paid only upon the production of a certificate that an Assistant Curate in receipt of a salary of not less than £120 per annum and duly licensed by the Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwell has been employed in the said Hamlet or Township of Totley, and such yearly sum or stipend and also the annual payment of £60 in respect of the benefaction aforesaid to continue payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Dore only until the constitution of the said proposed separate Ecclesiastical District of Totley and the licence of a Minister to such District in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinmentioned Act when the said yearly sum or stipend and the said annual payment shall become payable to the Minister of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a new Parish, to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof for the time being:

“ And whereas in accordance with the terms of the Will of Ebenezer Hall, deceased, late of Sheffield, a capital sum of £1,380 has been offered to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commis-

sioners, as a benefaction with a view to obtaining a grant from us towards the endowment of the said proposed District or New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being and we have agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay as from the date of the payment of such capital sum to the credit of our account at the Bank of England (which date must under the terms of the said Will be subsequent to the date of the formation of the said proposed District) a yearly sum of £69 by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August, and the 1st day of November in each year so long as such capital sum shall remain in our hands:

“ And whereas in consideration of the payment of the said capital sum of £1,380, we have agreed to grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of £700, in respect of which a yearly sum of £35 will be paid by us to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish, when duly licensed as before mentioned:

“ And whereas the said grant of £700 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ And whereas William Aldam Milner, of Totley Hall, in the said County of Derby, Barrister-at-Law, has conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, a plot of land situate within the said proposed District as the sites for a permanent Church for such District and for a Parsonage or House of Residence for the Minister or Incumbent thereof and he has also contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church:

“ And whereas the said plot of land has been conveyed and the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas the said William Aldam Milner has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Southwell as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edwyn, now Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Dore and of the said New Parish of Saint John, Abbey Dale, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty

in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Totley.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of such New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto, shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edwyn, Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwell, and his successors, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Totley, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Dore and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint John, Abbey Dale, both in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Southwell, which, taken together, are comprised within and are co-extensive with the Civil Parish of Totley."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

(18) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

SECTION II.

MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK.

The Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-Work, to apply in respect of all hours worked by such workers in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J. (19), dated 8th March, 1922, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be rates calculated on the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner set out in Section II of Part I of the Schedule to the said Notice J. (19).

PART IV.

The Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate adjustment according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART V.

For the purpose of this Notice a FEMALE WEAVING LEARNER means a Female Worker who is:—

- (a) Definitely and effectively learning weaving under the immediate instruction of a Weaving Mistress; and
- (b) Employed under conditions such that she shall cease to be employed on time-work and shall be employed on piece-work at the earliest date practicable.

PART VI.

The respective Proposed Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, and set out in Part VI of the Schedule to the Trade Boards Notice J (18) dated 7th February, 1922.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 17th October, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address, and should be sent to The Secretary of the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

SECTION II.

(b) The expressions "Apprentice" and "Learner" shall include all persons who in fact have been employed as Apprentices and/or Learners in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, whether or not employed as Apprentices or Learners as defined by the Trade Board.

(c) In the case of Apprentices, Learners or Improvers who have served under a contract in writing entered into prior to the 10th October, 1921, providing for their effective instruction in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade for a period exceeding five years but not exceeding seven years, the period specified in the contract shall be substituted for the period of five years' employment referred to in such Section.

BIRMINGHAM (MONTAGUE STREET
MARKET) (SWINE FEVER) ORDER
OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Special Facilities for Movement of Swine to Corporation Pig Market.

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, swine intended for immediate slaughter may be moved from any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area to which that Order applies, to the Corporation Pig Market at Montague Street, in the City of Birmingham, if they are accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule to that Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the market, fairground, or saleyard is situate. A copy of every licence granted under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Market Superintendent, Moat Lane, Birmingham.

Movement of Swine from Corporation Pig Market for Slaughter only.

2.—(1) Swine shall not be moved from the Corporation Pig Market except to lairs within the City of Birmingham licensed by the Local Authority of the City for the purposes of this Order or of any other Order of the Minister relating to Swine Fever or to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only if accompanied by a licence in the Form C specified in the Second Schedule to the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City. Swine so moved to licensed lairs shall not be moved therefrom except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to the Corporation Pig Market, and unless accompanied by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City.

(2) Swine shall, before movement with a licence under this Order, be marked, by and at the expense of the owner, by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(3) Swine moved under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(4) A copy of every licence under this Article authorising the movement of swine to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall be sent forthwith by the Inspector granting it to the Local Authority for the District in which the bacon factory or slaughterhouse is situate in every case in which the bacon factory or slaughterhouse is situate in another District.

(5) A Movement Licence shall not be granted by an Inspector under this Order if, in his opinion, it is undesirable to grant it.

3. The Birmingham (Swine Fever) Order of 1912 is hereby revoked.
