WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the

Admiralty, dated the 4th day of November, 1922 (C.W. 12168/22), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council, bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, and 11th June, 1920, to sanction, *inter alia*, the grant of Machinery Allowance to Officers and ratings of the Engineer Branch when in charge of machinery of ships in commission and of Senior Engineer's Allowance to Officers (below the relative rank of Commander) and ratings employed as senior Engineers of ships in commission in which an Engineer Commander is allowed in the complement:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, bearing date the 11th day of June, 1920, to sanction the

payment of these allowances to the Engineer Officers and ratings of vessels which are paid off out of commission for refit provided the machinery is not taken entirely in charge by the Dockyard Officers for 'Thorough Repair':

"And whereas we are of opinion that these Allowances should be payable also to the Engineer Officers and ratings of new vessels when the responsibility for the engines and boilers has been taken over from the Dockyard or Contractors prior to commissioning for service:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of Machinery Allowance and Senior Engineer's Allowance being issued, with effect from the 1st day of July, 1922, to Engineer Officers and ratings in new ships prior to commissioning as follows:—

When in charge of machinery of such ships.

When senior of such ships in cases where an Engineer Commander is allowed in the complement,

at the rates and under the conditions for Officers and ratings laid down respectively in Schedule V. (Section VI.) of Order in Council, dated the 22nd January, 1920, and Order in Council of 11th June, 1920, subject to the proviso that they shall not be payable until the responsibility for the engines and boilers has been taken over by the Engineer Officer or rating from the Dockyard Officers or Contractors.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

tioned Act of the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth, Chapter 14.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 2nd day of November, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, and being a Benefice in the Metropolis or in the vicinity thereof as those terms are defined by the Union of Benefices Acts, 1860 and 1898, that is to say, the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 142, and the Act of the 61st and 62nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 23:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, is a New Parish, wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, which is mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and is delineated on the Map or Plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas under the provisions of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 11th day of October, 1921, and published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of the same month, the Benefice of Saint Olave, Hart Street, with All Hallows Stain-

ing, and the Benefice of Saint Catherine Coleman, both in the City of London and in the Diocese of London, were united into one Benefice; and it was by the same Order provided, amongst other things, that one, or if we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and the Bishop of London so decide, two ecclesiastical districts within the limits of the Metropolis or its vicinity should be selected by the Bishop of London as the District or Districts for which a Church or Churches should be built out of the proceeds of the sale or sales (which have been or are about to be effected) of the materials and site of the Church of Saint Catherine Coleman:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected by the Bishop of London as the first District for which a Church shall be built as provided by the said Order in Council:

"And whereas an income of £330 per annum or thereabouts will be available under the provisions of the said Order in Council for the endowment of the said proposed Church and District, and such income will be payable to the Minister or Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the original limits of the Parish of Hammersmith, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London, have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or of some or one of them, and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £70 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £70 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas it is provided by the said Order in Council that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District shall be vested in the Bishop of London for the time being:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Catherine, North Hammersmith,' and that the said District shall be endowed in the manner which is contemplated

by the said Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 11th day of October, 1921.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said lastly mentioned Order of Your Majesty in Council, be vested in and exercised by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or to any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Catherine, North Hammersmith, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the east and upon the north by the District Parish of Saint Stephen, Hammersmith, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west partly by the New Parish of Saint Dunstan, East Acton, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Thomas, Acton Vale, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Acton Vale, from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, crosses the middle of the western end of Steventon Road where such road meets Old Oak Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Steventon Road for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wormholt Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Wormholt Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Yew Tree Road and Bryony Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Bryony Road and along a line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 23 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, from the said District Parish of Saint Stephen, Hammersmith."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the New Parish out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron has signified his assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the Incumbent of the said New Parish has offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since the transmission of such drafts as aforesaid:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order

and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 19th day of October, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Blendworth, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Blendworth is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Mortimer Reginald Margesson, of Number 2, Great Cumberland Place, London, W., Esquire:

"And whereas the said Mortimer Reginald Margesson is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Blendworth now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Winchester for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, now Bishop of Winchester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Blendworth which is

hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Blendworth:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Mortimer Reginald Margesson (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Blendworth, now vested in him the said Mortimer Reginald Margesson as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 19th day of October, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the



Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the 12th day of August, 1907, and published in the London Gazette on the 23rd day of the same month a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Stephen, Brighton, situate in the Parish of Brighton, in the said County of Sussex and in the said Diocese of Chichester, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Brighton':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Brighton, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of Brighton which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, being:—

"An area contained in a portion of the Parish of Brighton, in the said County and Diocese, wherein the present Incumbent of such Parish still possesses the exclusive cure of

souls although it is isolated from the main portion of his Cure: which area is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south by the sea, upon the west partly by the Parish of Hove and partly by the New Parish of Saint Patrick, Hove, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton, and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Brighton, from the said isolated portion of the said Parish of Brighton at the junction of Western Road with Preston Street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Preston Street for a distance of 15½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with King's Road and continuing thence south-westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line to the sea."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 19th day of October, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Wystan, Brethby, situate in the Parish of Repton, in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Wystan, Bretby, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Repton which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Wystan, Bretby, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Bretby.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Wystan, Bretby, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"Provided always that, so long as the Reverend Stephen John Selwyn, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Repton, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said Church of Saint Wystan, Bretby, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Stephen John Selwyn.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Bretby being:—

"All those portions of the Parish of Repton, in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Southwell, which are included in the Civil

Parish of Bretby and are co-extensive with the ancient Chapelry of Bretby."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

(b) In the earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, in which is interred the body of Candler Birdsall, the burial may be allowed at their decease of the bodies of Jane Birdsall and Mary Anne Birdsall, subject to the condition that no part of the coffins containing the bodies shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

#### MERCHANT SHIPPING.

##### REGISTRATION AND MEASUREMENT OF LIGHTERS, BARGES, &c. (PORT OF ROCHESTER).

Order of the Board of Trade, dated 9th November, 1922, under Section 1 (3) of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1921 (11 & 12 Geo. 5, c. 28), relating to the Registration and Measurement of Lighters, Barges, and like Vessels in the Port of Rochester.

Whereas it is provided by Sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1921, that where the Board of Trade are satisfied that there are in force in any port, under any Act or Order, regulations for the measurement or registration of lighters, barges, or like vessels, which provide for the measurement of their tonnage in substantial agreement with the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1920, and for an adequate system of identification of the vessels and their owners, the Board may by Order declare that vessels measured or registered in accordance with such regulations shall, for the purposes of that Act, be deemed to be measured or registered under Part I of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (b).

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied that there are in force in the Port of Rochester under the Medway Conservancy Acts, 1881

and 1919 (a), regulations relating to the measurement and registration of lighters, barges and like vessels which provide for the measurement of their tonnage in substantial agreement with the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1920, and for an adequate system of identification of the vessels and owners:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby declare that vessels measured and registered in the Port of Rochester in the manner provided by Section 5 of the Medway Conservancy Act, 1919, as explained and extended by the regulations dated 10th October, 1922, and made by the Conservators of the River Medway, shall, for the purposes of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1921, be deemed to have been measured and registered under Part I of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (b).

## SECTION III.

Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule a Female Worker entering the Trade for the first time at or over the age of 16 years and a Male Worker entering the Trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years may be employed for a period not exceeding six months at a General Minimum Time-Rate which is less by  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour in the case of Female Workers and less by 1d. per hour in the case of Male Workers than the General-Minimum Time-Rate applicable under Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule.

## SECTION IV.

In cases where a Worker (other than a Worker for whom General Minimum Piece-Rates have been fixed) is employed on piece-work, each piece rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY Worker an amount not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable as set out in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule. Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-Rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall only be had, in the case of female workers, to the earnings of workers of 18 years of age and over, and, in the case of male workers, to the earnings of workers of 21 years of age and over, who in both cases have had not less than six months' experience in the Trade.

## PART III.

## PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

Overtime Rates, calculated on the minimum rates of wages set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule, shall apply as provided below in substitution for the rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Part III of the Schedule to the said Notice R. (25) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade, that is to say:—

(a) In the case of:—

- (i) All female workers (other than Homeworkers) and all male workers employed on time work, and
- (ii) Female and male workers employed on piece-work (other than Female Homeworkers and other than Male Hand-Hacklers to whom the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Part II of this Schedule are applicable and other than Female and Male Workers employed in Hand Machine Braiding to whom the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R. (26) dated 27th June, 1922, are applicable)

in the manner specified in Sub-Sections (A) and (B) respectively of Section II of Part III of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice R. (25) dated 27th June, 1922, and

(b) In the case of:—

Male workers employed in Hand-Hackling on Piece-Work to whom the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Part II of this Schedule are applicable,

in the manner specified in Sub-Section (C) of Section II of Part III of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice R. (25) dated 27th June, 1922, subject to the substitution of the additional payments of One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate proposed in Section I (a) (ii) of Part I of this Schedule, One-Half of such Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or such Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate in place of the additional payments of 3½d., 7½d. or 1s. 2½d. respectively as specified in Sub-section (C) of Section II of Part III of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice R. (25).

## PART IV.

For the purpose of this Schedule:

A Homeworker or Outworker is a worker who works in her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

## PART V.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as amended by the Trade Boards (Made-Up Textiles) Order, 1920, and set out in Section II of Part V of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R. (25), dated 27th June, 1922.

NOTE—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 21st day of November, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS  
EMPLOYED IN HAND MACHINE BRAIDING ON PIECE-WORK.

In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present in operation, and set out in the Notice R (26), issued by the Trade Board and dated 27th June, 1922, the proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed in Hand Machine Braiding on piece-work for which General Minimum Piece-Rates are proposed in Part I of this Schedule, to apply in substitution for the minimum rates which would otherwise be applicable, in respect of all hours worked by a worker in excess of the number declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade as specified in Sections I and III of Part II of their Notice R (26), shall be as follows:—

- (i) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 3d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 1½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.
- (ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for all Overtime on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 6d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 3½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.
- (iii) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 1s. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 6½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.
- (iv) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 3d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and of 1½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of this Part of this Schedule.

## PART III.

### ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH NOVEMBER 1922.)

### REGULATION OF MOVEMENT OF SWINE (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 1).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Movement from Agricultural Shows in Scheduled Area to which the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922 Applies to Places of Destination within such Area.*

1. The restrictions imposed by Article 9 (Chapter II.) of the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) shall not apply to the movement of swine from an agricultural show (not being in any Area declared by an Order of the Minister to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area) which is held with a licence of the Local Authority of the District in a market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area to which the principal Order applies; provided that the swine so moved are accompanied by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which such show is held, or by some person specially authorised by the said Local Authority to grant such licences. In the case of movement from such shows the licence required may be granted without the production of a declaration (Form B).

### Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the REGULATION OF MOVEMENT OF SWINE (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 1), and shall be read with the principal Order.
