THIS day the Honourable William Watson, K.C., Lieutenant-Colonel Sir John Gilmour, Bt., D.S.O., M.P., Sir Samuel Roberts, Bt., M.P., Sir Archibald Tutton Salvidge, K.B.E., Sir William Sutherland, K.C.B., M.P., William Dudley Ward, Esquire, and Lieutenant-Commander Edward Hilton Young, D.S.O., D.S.C., M.P., were, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their places at the Board accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the

Admiralty, dated the 4th day of November, 1922 (C.W. 12168/22), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council, bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, and 11th June, 1920, to sanction, inter alia, the grant of Machinery Allowance to Officers and ratings of the Engineer Branch when in charge of machinery of ships in commission and of Senior Engineer's Allowance to Officers (below the relative rank of Commander) and ratings employed as senior Engineers of ships in commission in which an Engineer Commander is allowed in the complement:
