The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Pembroke College, Cambridge, on the 14th day of November, 1922, and sealed on the 4th day of December, 1922, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of the College of Valence Mary, commonly called Pembroke College, in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statutes were duly made at a Meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for this purpose, and held on the 14th day of November, 1922, and having been passed at such Meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of the persons present and voting, are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master or Keeper and Fellows and Scholars of the said College, in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in manner following:—

By adding at the end of Section 20 in Chapter III, intituled "Of the Fellows," the words "Save as provided in Section 28 of this

By repealing the last sentence of Section 28 of the same Chapter containing the words "Such Fellow, however, shall not be taken into account in estimating the number of the Fellows as provided in Section 6 of this Chapter," and adding to such Section, and at the end thereof, the following:—

"Such Fellow may at any time during the last year before the expiration of his Fellowship, or at any subsequent time, be reelected to a Fellowship without stipend, as defined above, for the reasons and under the conditions prescribed in Sections 20, 20a, 20b, 20c and 20d of this Chapter, provided that the number of Fellows re-elected to Fellowships without stipend shall not at any A Fellow holding a time exceed two. Fellowship without stipend under Section shall not be taken into account in estimating the number of Fellows as provided in Section 6 of this Chapter and Section 3 of Chapter I, nor in estimating the number of Fellows holding Fellowships under Section 20 of this Chapter."
