The following amendments to a Statute of Queen's College, Oxford, made by the Governing Body of the College, on the 27th day of March, 1923, and sealed on the 3rd day of May, 1923, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Whereas it is expedient to provide that Professorial Fellows may be elected without emolument, and that they shall not be counted in determining the total number of Fellowships at present allowed by Statute, and to make regulations.

The College, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of any other power enabling it at a General Meeting of the Governing Body, specially summoned for the purpose, and after due notice, held upon the 27th day of March, 1923, by the unanimous vote of the persons present and voting, made the following amendments to a Statute made by the University Commissioners for The Queen's College, Oxford, and ordered them to be submitted to His Majesty in Council, to be dealt with as provided by the said Act.

In the College Statutes Title 1, Sectio ii, "The Fellows" after clause 8, insert the following new clause:—

8 bis. It shall be lawful for the Provost and Fellows at a Stated General Meeting by a majority of not less than three-fourths of the votes of those present and voting to elect any Professor of the University to an ordinary Fellowship without emolument.

Any such Professor who shall be so elected shall *ipso facto* vacate his Fellowship upon ceasing to be such Professor.

Such Fellows shall not be subject to any restrictions in regard to marriage, or private income, and they shall not be entitled to occupy rooms rent free in College, unless they be unmarried and resident in rooms in the College.

Any Fellowship held by a Professor under the provisions of this Clause shall not be counted among the number of Fellowships of the College for the purpose of Clause 1 of this Statute.

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

Indian Civil Service Examinations.

In conformity with the provisions of the Statute 56 & 57 Victoria, Chapter 66, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes, with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiration of 40 days from the date of this Gazette, to make under Section 97 (1) and (2) of the Government of India Act, changes as indicated below in the Regulations for the examination in London of candidates for admission to the Indian Civil Service.

In Rule 3, which at present is as follows:-

"(3) A candidate must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 24 on the 1st day of August of the year in which the examination is held, or must be in a position to claim such a concession under the provisions of the Appendix to these Regulations as will render him eligible,

it is proposed to cancel all words after "held."

For Rule 6, which at present is as follows:-"(6) A candidate must be of good moral

character,'' it is proposed to substitute the following:-

(6) A candidate shall satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that his character is such as to qualify him for employment in the Indian Civil Service."

It is also proposed to cancel the following rule:

(7) No person will be eligible for admission to the Indian Civil Service who has made before any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916, an application for the issue to him of a certificate of exemption from the provisions of those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of combatant service.

"(11) The auxiliary language in Section A or Section C will be tested by means of translation from the language. The following languages may be offered: French, German, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Dutch, Norwegian, Swedish, Danish, Russian, Latin, Ancient Greek; provided that-

(b) No candidate offers in Sections A and C together two languages of the group Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, or two of the group Norwegian, Swedish, Danish.

(c) Only a candidate who takes two modern languages in Section B may offer Latin or Ancient Greek as an auxiliary

language.

Instead of an auxiliary language, a candidate whose mother tongue is an Indian language may offer as Subject 5 either Physical Anthropology or Social Anthropology, provided he does not offer the subject elsewhere,

it is proposed to substitute the following:-(11) The auxiliary language in Section A or Section C will be tested by means of translation from the language. The following languages may be offered: -French, German, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Dutch, Norwegian, Swedish, Danish, Rus-

sian, Latin, Ancient Greek.
"No candidate may offer any language or Physical Anthropology or Social thropology twice in the examination.

"No candidate may offer in Sections A and C together two languages of the group Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, or two of the group Norwegian, Swedish, Danish. Only a candidate who takes two modern languages in Section B may offer Latin or Ancient Greek as an auxiliary language.

"Instead of an auxiliary language, a candidate whose mother tongue is an Indian language may offer as Subject 5 either Physical Anthropology or Social Anthropology.

It is intended that the amended Regulations shall apply to candidates at the Open Competitive Examination to be held in London in the year 1924.
