REGULATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT AS NATU-RALIST ON THE SCIENTIFIC STAFF OF THE FISHERY BOARD FOR SCOTLAND.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

- 1. Application for appointment must be made to the Secretary of the Fishery Board for Scotland at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Fishery Board. When vacancies occur, the Fishery Board will cause notice to be given by advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.
- 2.—(a) Candidates must be between 22 and 26 years of age on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications. If that date were the twenty-second anniversary of a candidate's birth he would be within the limits of age; if it were the twenty-sixth anniversary he would be beyond them. A candidate who has served in H.M. Forces between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, may deduct from his actual age any period of such service between 4th August, 1914, and 31st December, 1919.
- (b) No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.
- 3. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects, provided that exception to the latter condition may be made in the case of a candidate who served in His

Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

In the selection of candidates preference will be given to ex-Service men.

- 4. Candidates must have studied science at a university and proceeded to a degree. Account will be taken of the ability indicated by the degree and of the suitability of the sciences studied to the work of a naturalist. The most suitable sciences are natural history, biology and chemistry.
- 5. The completed application forms will be scrutinised by the Fishery Board, and those candidates who appear to satisfy the conditions of these regulations will be interviewed by a Selection Board consisting of representatives of the Fishery Board and a representative of the Civil Service Commission.

6. The Selection Board will prepare a list in order of merit of those candidates whom they consider suitable for appointment.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.

- 7. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they fulfil all the conditions laid down in these regulations and are eligible in respect of health and character. Candidates appointed will be on probation for two years; if during that period a probationer is found not to be suitable or satisfactory, the appointment will be terminated. If the service is approved at the termination of the probationary period, a cer-tificate of qualification for the establishment of the probationer will be issued by the Civil Service Commissioners, subject to such further inquiry as they may think fit. Pension rights under the Superannuation Acts will then accrue as from the date of the original appointment.
- 8. A fee of £1 10s. will be payable by each candidate admitted to interview by the Selection Board. A further fee of £1 10s. (being the balance of the fee of £3 prescribed for this situation) will be payable on the issue of the certificate of qualification.
