#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to alter the number and boundaries of the Districts and the place of holding any Court and to order the discontinuance of the holding of any Court and the consolidation of any two or more Districts and the division of any District and to order by what name and in what towns and places a Court shall be held in such District:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:----

order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:— 1. The County Court of Lancashire, held at Blackburn, shall be held at Clitheroe as well as at Blackburn, by the name of the County Court of Lancashire held at Blackburn and Clitheroe.

burn and Clitheroe. 2. The District of the County Court of Shropshire, held at Wem, except the parishes detached therefrom by paragraph 3 hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Shropshire held at Shrewsbury, and from the 30th day of June, 1923, the holding of the said Court at Wem shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdictions theretofore exerciseable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Shrewsbury, and the said Court held at Shrewsbury shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

3. The Parishes set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall, save as to any cases pending upon the 30th day of June, 1923, be detached from and cease to form part of the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the second column of the said Schedule, and shall be transferred to, and form part of the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the third column thereof.

In this Order "Parish " shall have the same meaning as in the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899 (S.R. & O., 1899, No. 178), provided that the boundaries of every Parish mentioned in this Order shall be those constituted and limited at the date of this Order.

This Order may be cited as "The County Court Districts (Miscellaneous No. 1) Order in Council, 1923," and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1923, and the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, as amended, shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Children Act, 1908, it was, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council under the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840, provide for the establishment of one or more separate Juvenile Courts for the Metropolitan Police Court District, and for assigning as a division to each such Court such portion of that district as may be specified in the Order:

And whereas by the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, with the advice of His Privy Council, to alter the number of Magistrates appointed to any of the Police Courts theretofore established, and to order that a Police Magistrate or Magistrates shall attend regularly at any Police Court or Courts thereafter to be established, either daily or on such days or times as His Majesty, by the advice aforesaid, shall order:

And whereas by divers Orders in Council made under the said Acts such Police Court Divisions as to His Majesty from time to time has seemed fit have been constituted within the Metropolitan Police District and the extent thereof defined respectively, and such divisions have been assigned to the Police Courts continued or established under the said Acts:

And whereas by the Juvenile Courts (Metropolis) Act, 1920, it was, amongst other things, enacted that an Order in Council made under the Children Act, 1908, for the establishment of Juvenile Courts for the Metropolitan Police Court District may, notwithstanding anything in the Metropolitan Police Courts Act, 1840, provide for such Courts being held elsewhere than in the buildings used as Metropolitan Police Courts, and for every such Court being constituted of a Police Magistrate nominated by the Secretary of State, and two Justices of the Peace for the County of London, of whom one shall be a woman, and both of whom shall be chosen from amongst a panel of such Justices, nominated for the purpose by the Secretary of State:

His Majesty is pleased, therefore, with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that—

(1) Juvenile Courts for the Metropolitan Police Court District shall be established as in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be held in the buildings mentioned in the first column of that Schedule; and divisions shall be assigned to them as described in the second column of the said Schedule.

(2) The said Juvenile Courts shall be held on the days and at the hours specified in the third column of the said Schedule or on such other days and at such other hours as may from time to time be approved by a Secretary of State: provided that a Juvenile Court which would in pursuance of the foregoing provision have been held on a day when the Metropolitan Police Courts are closed may be held on the preceding day, or if the preceding day is a Sunday, on the day following.

(3) Each Court shall be constituted of a Police Magistrate nominated by the Secretary of State and except in the case of the Greenwich and Woolwich Courts of two Justices of the Peace for the County of London, of whom one shall be a woman, and both of whom shall be chosen from amongst a panel of such Justices nominated for the purpose by the Secretary of State.

Provided that a Police Magistrate may sit alone in any case where he considers that it would be impracticable for the Court to be constituted in manner aforesaid, or that it would be inexpedient in the interests of Justice to adjourn the business of the Court.

(4) The Justices who are to sit at the several sittings of the Courts aforesaid shall be chosen by the panel, or, if necessary, by the Police Magistrate, and in the case of the absence of the Police Magistrate through illness, leave, or other cause, his place shall be taken by another Police Magistrate, or by a barrister-at-law in practice for at least seven years appointed, or a Justice of the Peace approved, by the Secretary of State.

(5) The Orders in Council made on the 12th day of August, 1913, and the 13th day of December, 1921, are hereby revoked.

This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1923.

SHEEP-DIPPING (BLACK MOUNTAIN DISTRICT) ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

#### Application of Part I of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.

1.-(1) Part I (Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," is referred to as "the Principal Order," is hereby applied to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Movement Area for the purposes of that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the tenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, and shall cease to operate on the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

#### Application of Part II of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, subject to certain modifications.

2. Part II (Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area) of the Principal Order is hereby applied, subject to the modification hereinafter appearing, to the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, which shall comprise a Double Dipping Area for the purposes of that Order.

#### Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

3.-(1) The dates between which all sheep on lands in the Double Dipping Area described in the Second Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the Principal Order are hereby fixed to be the tenth day of August and the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

(2) Each dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District wherein the sheep are, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice.

(3) Each dipping shall, where practicable, take place on lands to which this Article applies, but where such dipping is not prac-ticable, the Notice may require the dipping to be carried out on other premises specified in the Notice, and may impose any conditions as to movement, detention, isolation and dipping of the sheep which the Inspector may consider desirable and specify in the Notice.

(4) If the owner or person in charge of sheep to which a Notice served under paragraph (2) of this Article relates fails to comply with any condition specified in such Notice he shall, according to his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4.--(1) The provisions of Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall apply also to any lands in the neighbourhood to which they may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such Notice, and shall cease to apply to any such lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) A copy of every notice served under this Article by an Inspector of the Local Authority shall forthwith be sent to the Ministry by the Inspector signing the same.

#### Power to Prohibit Exposure of Undipped Sheep on Lands in Double Dipping Area.

5.--(1) The Local Authority may, by notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority, and served on any person entitled to turn out sheep on any lands in the Double Dipping Area described in the Second Schedule hereto, prohibit such turning out during the then current year after the expiration of the double dipping period unless the sheep have since the tenth day of July in the current year been dipped twice by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Minister for sheep scab or purporting to be so approved with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the two dippings, and have since the second dipping been kept separate from sheep which have not been so dipped.

(2) If any person served with a Notice under this Article turns out or causes or permits to be turned out, sheep in contravention of the Notice, he shall, in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
