“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas owing to the amalgamation of Your Majesty's Marine Artillery and Marine Light Infantry and the consequent re-organisation of Your Majesty's Marine Force a number of Officers on the Active List of that Force have become surplus to requirements :

“And whereas we consider it desirable that special provision should be made in order to reduce the several lists on which a surplus of Officers is borne :

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the regulations contained in the annexed Schedule, which have been framed for that purpose.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have expressed their concurrence therein.

" SCHEDULE.

" TEMPORARY SPECIAL RETIREMENT SCHEME (1923) FOR ROYAL MARINE OFFICERS.

" Except where otherwise expressly provided hereunder, the Regulations contained in this Schedule shall have effect from the 24th August, 1923, until the 31st March, 1924; but the Admiralty shall have discretionary power to terminate the operation of each Section or part of a Section, other than Section VII, at such date earlier than the 31st March, 1924, as they may consider desirable.

" Section I.

" Colonels 2nd Commandant, R.N.:

" Colonels 2nd Commandant may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, to retire on the rates of retired pay for which they would be eligible under Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, Schedule V, Section IX, Sub-Section XIV, if they retired on the 24th November, 1923, together with an addition of £100 per annum, subject to a maximum of £900 per annum.

" Section II.

" Lieutenant-Colonels, R.M.

" Lieutenant-Colonels may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, to retire on the rates of retired pay for which they would be eligible under Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, Schedule V, Section IX, Sub-Section XIV, if they retired on the 24th November, 1923, together with an addition of £100 per annum, subject to a maximum of £750 per annum.

" Section III.

" Majors, R.M.

" 1. Majors who have qualified or will have qualified by age and service on the 24th November, 1923, under Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, Schedule V, Section IX, Sub-Section XIV for the maximum rate of retired pay of their rank, may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, to retire on this rate of

retired pay, and may be granted in addition a gratuity on retirement of £62 10s. 0d. for each complete period of three months intervening between the day preceding the commencement of retired pay and the date on which they would reach the age of compulsory retirement, subject to a maximum gratuity of £750 in each case.

" 2. Majors who are not so qualified under Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, Schedule V, Section IX, Sub-Section XIV, for the maximum rate of retired pay of their rank may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, to retire on the rate of retired pay for which they would be eligible under the Sub-Section if they retired on the 24th November, 1923, together with an addition of £100 per annum, subject to a maximum of £600 per annum.

" Section IV.

" Paymasters and Barrack Masters, R.M.

" 1. Lieutenant-Colonels may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, to retire on the rates of retired pay for which they would be eligible under Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, Schedule V, Section IX, Sub-Section XIV, as amended by Order in Council of the 11th June, 1920, if they retired on the 24th November, 1923, together with an addition of £100 per annum, subject to a maximum of £750 per annum, and provided that the total retired pay awarded in each case shall not exceed the rate for which the Officer would be eligible by age and service, under the regulations quoted, if he had continued to serve on full pay until he attained the age of compulsory retirement.

" 2. Majors may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, to retire on the terms provided in Section III of this Schedule for other Majors, R.M.

" Section V.

" Captains, R.M. and Lieutenants, R.M. other than Quartermasters, Officers promoted under Order in Council of the 11th February, 1913, and Officers formerly of Warrant rank promoted for long and zealous service or after examination.

" 1. Captains, R.M., of seniority the 1st September, 1914, to the 30th January, 1917, ranking with Lieutenant Commanders, R.N., afloat of the same seniority, may be allowed at Admiralty discretion, to retire on the following rates of retired pay and gratuities:—

or earlier, may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion to retire on the following rates of retired pay and gratuities :—

" Section VI.

" Captains, R.M., granted Commissions under the Provisions of Paragraph (1) of Order in Council of the 11th February, 1913.

" Such Officers may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, to retire on retired pay in accordance with the following scale, plus a gratuity of £500 :—

" Section VII.

" Quartermasters, R.M., Sergeants-Major, R.M., and Superintending Clerks, R.M.

" 1. Officers of these ranks or classes of the age of 50 or above on the 24th November, 1923, may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, to retire on the rates of retired pay for which they would have been eligible under the regulations now applicable to them on attaining

the age of 55, had they continued to serve until reaching that age, but in assessing such rates no promotions other than automatic promotions shall be taken into account. For this purpose, promotion from Warrant Officer to Commissioned Officer from Warrant rank shall be regarded as automatic on the attainment of ten years' seniority as Warrant Officer, provided the Officer's record is satisfactory.

These Officers may be granted, in addition to these rates of retired pay, a gratuity on retirement of £37 10s. for each complete three months intervening between the day preceding the commencement of retired pay and the day on which they would attain the age of 55, subject to a maximum gratuity of £500 in each case.

" 2. Officers of these ranks or classes who will not have reached the age of 50 on the 24th November, 1923, may be allowed at Admiralty discretion, to retire with the rates of retired pay for which they would have been eligible by rank and service had they continued to serve on full pay until the 24th November, 1925, subject, in each case, to the maximum rate of retired pay laid down for the rank held on the 24th August, 1923. A gratuity of £500 may be granted in each case in addition.

" Section VIII.

" As from the 24th November, 1923, the age of compulsory retirement shall be reduced to 50 years as a permanent measure for :—

" Section IX.

" Directors of Music.

" Directors of Music may be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, to retire on the rates of retired pay for which they would have been

eligible on the scale provided in Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, Schedule V, Section IX, Sub-Section XVII, on attaining the age of 60, if they had continued to serve on full pay until attaining that age, and to receive, in addition, a gratuity on retirement at the rate of £37 10s. for each complete period of three months intervening between the day preceding the commencement of retired pay and the day on which they would attain the age of 60, subject to a maximum gratuity of £500 in each case.

“ Section X.

“ *Quartermasters, R.M., Chief Schoolmasters, R.M., Directors of Music, R.M., Sergeants-Major, R.M., and Superintending Clerks, R.M.*

“ Should the number of voluntary retirements of Officers of these ranks or classes be insufficient for the purposes of this Order, a further number of such Officers may be retired, at Admiralty discretion, on the same terms as if they had retired voluntarily under the provisions of this Order.

“ Section XI.

“ *General.*

“ 1. All rates of retired pay granted under the provisions of this Schedule, other than those granted under the provisions of paragraph 2 of Section V thereof, shall be subject to revision on the 1st July, 1924, and subsequently.

“ 2. In all cases where it is prescribed in this Schedule that the service of an Officer for retired pay is to be reckoned as if he retired on the 24th November, 1923,

(a) any time intervening between the actual date of retirement, if prior to that date, and the 24th November, 1923, is to be reckoned as full time in the case of an Officer on full pay on the day previous to the date of his retirement, and as one-third of full time in the case of an officer on un-employed pay or on half-pay on the day previous to the date of his retirement;

(b) any time intervening between the 24th November, 1923, and the actual date of retirement, if later, is to be ignored for purposes of retired pay.

“ 3. All Officers serving abroad who are retired on or before the 31st March, 1924, under the regulations of this Schedule are to be eligible for foreign service leave on full pay on the usual scale. They will also be eligible for full pay to the date of arrival in England provided that they proceed direct, or for the estimated period of passage to England, if they elect to find their own way, provided that they return without delay on vacating their appointments.

“ 4. The Admiralty reserve the right of withholding permission to retire under these regulations from any Officer.

“ 5. Nothing in these regulations shall preclude the Admiralty from discharging or retiring any Officer under any other regulations which may be applicable to his case.”

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

“ And whereas we consider it desirable that the periods of qualifying service required for the award of Greenwich Hospital Pensions in the different branches of the Royal Navy and Marines should be assimilated as far as possible:

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve the proposals set forth in the annexed Schedule.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ (1) The following Greenwich Hospital Pensions to be established for Officers of all ranks in lieu of those established at present:—

Lieutenant-Commanders and Lieutenants: 17 of £50 per annum each.

Chaplains and Instructor Officers: 5 of £50 per annum each.

Surgeon Captains and Medical Officers of higher rank: 2 of £100 per annum each.

Other Medical Officers: 11 of £50 per annum each.

Paymaster Captains and Accountant Officers of higher rank: 2 of £100 per annum each.

Other Accountant Officers: 13 of £50 per annum each.

Engineer Captains and Engineer Officers of higher rank: 3 of £100 per annum each.

Other Engineer Officers: 23 of £50 per annum each.

Field Officers and Captains, Royal Marines: 10 of £65 per annum each.

Lieutenants and Lieutenant-Commanders, R.N., and Officers of equivalent rank promoted from Warrant rank: 19 of £40 per annum each.

Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank and Warrant Officers, R.N., of all branches: 56 of £30 per annum each.

Quartermasters, R.M.: 2 of £40 per annum each.

Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank and Warrant Officers, R.M.: 3 of £30 per annum each.

Officers of H.M. Coastguard (Old Force): 12 of £25 per annum each.

“ (2) The changes necessary to effect the re-allocation of pensions to be made gradually on the occurrence of vacancies in such manner as the Admiralty may think fit.

“ (3) The pensions for Officers of Warrant rank and Officers promoted therefrom to be allotted to the several branches at Admiralty discretion, due regard being had to the number of Officers of the different branches on the retired list at the time.

“ (4) Officers on the Retired List of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines to be eligible for consideration for the award of Greenwich Hospital Pensions, according to the last sub-

stantive rank held on the active list, provided that they have the following qualifying service:—

(i) Officers of the equivalent rank of Flag Officer or Captain, except Instructor Officers: 15 years.

(ii) Officers of the equivalent rank of Commander, except Instructor Officers: 12 years.

(iii) Lieutenant-Commanders and Lieutenants and Officers of equivalent rank (excluding Officers promoted from Warrant rank for long and zealous service, after examination or under special rules during the late War); Navigating Officers: 9 years.

(iv) Chaplains and Instructor Officers of all ranks: 9 years.

(v) Field Officers, R.M.: 12 years.

(vi) Captains, R.M. (except as provided in (vii) below): 9 years.

(vii) Warrant Officers, Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank, R.N., and Officers promoted from those ranks; Warrant Officers, Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank and Quartermasters and corresponding ranks, Royal Marines; Officers of the Coastguard and Coastguard Cruiser Service: 5 years.

Service in cases (i) to (vi) to be calculated according to the rules laid down for the calculation of service for retired pay, and in case (vii) the aggregate of service in each rank from Warrant Officer or equivalent rank upwards, calculated according to the rules for retired pay, to be taken.

Officers who have received severe wounds or disabling hurts from active service, or Officers retired for physical unfitness which arose in and is directly due to the Service, to be exempt from the foregoing rules for qualifying service.

“ (5) In the event of an Officer being selected for a Greenwich Hospital Pension, who has retired from the Lieutenants' List or the List of Officers of equivalent rank in the Engineer, Medical, Accountant or Instructor Branches, the rate of pension to be £40 instead of £50.

“ (6) In the event of an Officer retiring from the rank of Captain, R.M., being awarded one of the pensions for Field Officers and Captains, R.M., his pension to be £50 instead of £65.”

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Bishops Resignation Act, 1869, a Representation has been made to His Majesty by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, at the instance of the Right Reverend Frederic Henry Chase, by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Ely, and as such a Bishop of a Diocese within and of the Province of Canterbury, that the said Bishop is desirous of resigning his Bishopric (such resignation to take formal effect on the 5th day of February, 1924), by reason that he is incapacitated by age and permanent physical infirmity from the due performance of his duties as Bishop:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity, and that the said Bishop has canonically resigned:

"And whereas the said Consolidated Chapelry of Headless Cross has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"*The First Schedule.*

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Headless Cross, situate partly in the County of Warwick and partly in the County of Worcester and wholly in the Diocese of Worcester, comprising:—

"1. All that portion of the Parish of Feckenham, in the said County of Worcester and in the said Diocese of Worcester, which is bounded upon the east partly by the Parish of Coughton, in the said County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Coventry, and partly by the Parish of Ipsley, situate partly in the said County of Warwick and partly in the said County of Worcester and wholly in the said Diocese of Worcester, upon the north-east and upon the north by the said New Parish of Headless Cross, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south-west and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Headless Cross from the said Parish of Feckenham at a point in the middle of Walkwood Lane opposite to the middle of the footpath leading from Grinsty Farm, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Walkwood Lane for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading into Love Lane near its junction with Dirty Lane, and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to the point where such footpath meets Love Lane, and extending thence first southward to and then first north-westward and then south-westward

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, now Bishop of Liverpool, and it has been made to appear to us, that the said house and appurtenances are no longer desirable for use as such Episcopal Residence:

"And whereas in the circumstances hereinbefore set forth it appears to us to be expedient and likely to conduce to the permanent benefit of the See of Liverpool that the sale of the said house and premises known as The Palace,

Number 19, Abercromby Square, Liverpool, with the appurtenances thereto belonging, should be effected in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, (in testimony of which consent he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"That the said house and premises known as The Palace, Number 19, Abercromby Square, Liverpool, with its appurtenances, may be sold for such price or prices, and at such time or times, and in such manner, as shall be approved by us, and be transferred and conveyed to any purchaser or purchasers by an assurance or assurances to be made in manner and form approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, and that all moneys received by or on account of the said house and premises, and the appurtenances thereto belonging, or of any part thereof, shall be paid over to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall be applied by us for the purposes and in the manner next hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, first, in defraying all costs, charges and expenses of and incidental to the sale of the said Residence known as The Palace, Number 19, Abercromby Square, Liverpool, and secondly, in payment to the Liverpool Bishopric Endowment Fund held by us under the Bishoprics Act, 1878, for the purpose of defraying the cost of providing, in such manner, and at such times as shall be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, another Episcopal Residence, with the appurtenances thereto, for the Bishop of Liverpool.

"And we further recommend and propose that, as soon as the above mentioned new Episcopal Residence shall have been provided,

THE HORSES (IMPORTATION) ORDER, 1924.

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to make an Order for regulating the importation of Horses into this Island.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, do hereby Order as follows:

1. No horse shall be landed in this Island unless accompanied by a Licence issued by the Government Secretary or the Chief Clerk, Government Office.

2. A horse shall only be landed in this Island at the Port named in the Licence, and travel by the route specified in the Licence.

3. The Licence must accompany the horse on the voyage, and must be delivered by the Master of the vessel or his representative, to the Police Officer in charge of the Police Station at the Port of Arrival.

4. A horse will be liable to detention at the Government Lairs or other place if found by an Inspector under the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts to be suffering from contagious or infectious disease, or is suspected of having been in contact with an animal suffering from such disease, and will be subject to such special treatment and isolation as may be approved by the Lieutenant-Governor.

5. A horse will be liable to detention at the Government Lairs or other place if an outbreak of a scheduled disease has occurred in or near the district from which the horse has been brought whilst the horse is in transit.

6. A Licence to import a horse will expire at the end of eighteen days from the date of issue.

7. A horse landed under this Order and removed into the Government Lairs shall, while detained in such Lairs, be supplied with a proper and sufficient supply of food and water by the owners or consignees thereof.

8. It shall not be lawful to land in this Island:—

(a) The carcass of a horse which has died or been slaughtered on board a vessel while in a port in any country, or during the passage from any such port to this Island, or thereafter while in any port in this Island; or

(b) The dung of any such horse.

(c) Any fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils used for or about any such horse unless they have been scraped and then thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water, and subsequently disinfected,

and unless the permission of an Inspector under the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts has been obtained.

9. The Principal Officer of Customs and Excise in this Island, or any Officer of Police, may seize and detain any carcase, dung, fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils landed in contravention of this Order, and he shall forthwith report the facts to the Government Office, with a view to the destruction or disposal of such carcase, dung, fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order—

“ Government Lairs ” means such place or places as the Lieutenant-Governor may from time to time appoint for the detention of animals under this Order.

“ Horse ” for the purpose of this Order means any horse, mare, gelding, colt, or foal.

“ Disease ” for the purpose of this Order means Cattle Plague (that is to say, Rinderpest, or the disease commonly known as Cattle Plague), Contagious Pleuro-Pneumonia of Cattle, Foot-and-Mouth Disease, Sheep-pox, Sheep Scab, Swine Fever (that is to say, the disease known as Typhoid Fever of Swine, Soldier, Purples, Red Disease, Hog Cholera or Swine Plague), or Anthrax.

“ Carcase ” means the carcase of an animal, and part of a carcase, and the meat, flesh, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of an animal, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof.
