DRESS—LEVÉE DRESS.

Navy.—Officers, R.N., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R., in possession of Full Dress Uniform—No. 1 Dress (Full Dress).

Officers, R.N., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R., not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—No. 3 Dress (Frock Coat with Epaulettes).

Army.—Officers in possession of Full Dress of their rank—Levée Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform of their rank—Service Dress.

Air Force.—Officers in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Full Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Service Dress.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Gentlemen who have been presented and who wish to attend a Levée, should make a written application, as detailed below.

2. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials

connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned hereafter, should communicate with the Comptroller, Ceremonial Department, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, War Office.

Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Ceremonial Department, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers of the Royal Air Force, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels.

6. All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

7. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Secretary, War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

8. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for the Home Department.

9. Chairmen of County Councils, and all gentlemen connected with the Ministry of Health, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.

10. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

11. All gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office or any other Government Department will adopt the same procedure, and will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

12. The names both for attendance and presentation must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than ten days prior to the date of each Levée.

ORDER OF 1924.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Prohibition of Landing except for Slaughter
within Landing Place.*

1.—(1) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland and the Isle of Man shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Minister, be landed after the date hereof at any approved landing place in Great Britain except for the purpose of slaughter within the landing place.

(2) The landing of any animals under this

Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the landing place.

(3) Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, except that the animals shall not be moved from the landing place, and shall be slaughtered therein within ninety-six hours after their landing.

*Prohibition of Importation of Store Cattle
from Canada.*

2. The importation of store cattle from Canada under and in accordance with the provisions of the Importation of Canadian Cattle Order of 1923 is hereby prohibited unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Minister.

*Special Provision as to Animals destined for
Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place.*

3. Animals, if intended to be landed at the approved Landing Place at Manchester under this Order shall not be carried through the Eastham Lock until they have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and unless and until the Inspector certifies that his examination and information do not show that there is, or during the voyage has been, an animal on board affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

Suspension of Order.

4. The Imported Animals Order of 1923 (No. 2) shall not operate during the continuance of this Order, so far as it relates to animals landed from Ireland, Canada, and the Isle of Man.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

6. If any animal shall be landed or moved in contravention of this Order, or is not slaughtered as hereby required, the owner thereof and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing or movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so slaughtered, and the owner and the charterer, and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed as the case may be shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

KING'S LYNN GAS.

(APPLICATION FOR SPECIAL ORDER UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the King's Lynn Gas Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company"), whose address is No. 20, St. James' Street, King's Lynn, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, for the following or some of the following among other purposes (that is to say):—

To convert or provide for the conversion of the existing general capital stock of the Company (hereinafter referred to as "the existing capital stock"), into stock of another class or denomination (hereinafter referred to as "converted stock"), of increased nominal amount

but to be entitled to a lower standard rate of dividend than the existing capital stock.

To create or provide for the creation of converted stock requisite for the purposes of such conversion, and to provide for the issue to the holders of existing capital stock in substitution for that stock of such amounts of converted stock as may be specified in the Order.

To authorise and require the holders of existing capital stock (including trustees and others acting in a fiduciary capacity) to accept such amounts of converted stock as may be provided for by the Order in substitution for the existing capital stock held by them respectively, and to define the rights *inter se* and otherwise of the holders of converted stock.

To provide that converted stock substituted for existing capital stock shall be held on the same trusts and for the same purposes and in the same manner as the stock for which it is substituted, and that transfers of existing capital stock shall, after the date of conversion, take effect as transfers of the appropriate amounts of converted stock.

To require the delivery up of certificates for existing capital stock, and to provide for the issue in substitution therefor of certificates for converted stock and to authorise the Company to withhold dividends on converted stock issued in substitution for existing capital stock, for which certificates are not delivered up within the prescribed period.

To prescribe the minimum amounts of converted stock in respect of which a holder may be registered, and multiples in which such stock shall be transferable.

To alter the scale of voting in respect of the existing capital stock and (if thought fit) of any unissued capital of the Company and to make other provisions with reference to voting in respect of capital of the Company including converted stock.

To authorise the Company to raise by the creation and issue of further amounts of converted stock any moneys which they are empowered by the King's Lynn Gas Order 1906 (confirmed by the Gas Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act 1906) to raise by the creation and issue of new Ordinary shares or stock or Preference shares or stock, but have not so raised.

To make further provision as to the rate of interest which may be paid by the Company on moneys borrowed by them whether on mortgage or by the creation and issue of debenture stock and to amend or repeal Section 20 of the said Order of 1888 Section 22 of the King's Lynn Gas Order 1898 (confirmed by the Gas Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act 1898) and Section 21 of the said Order of 1906.

To authorise the Company to borrow additional sums of money in respect of their existing capital and to increase the amount which the Company may borrow in respect of their authorised but unissued capital and to confer upon the Company further powers with reference to the creation and issue of debenture stock and to make provision as to the ranking thereof and of the interest thereon.

To repeal alter or amend all or some of the provisions of Sections 10, 11, 12, and 13 of the Order of 1906 and to enact new provisions with respect to the mode and conditions of issue of shares or stock under the powers of that Order.

To empower the Board of Trade to waive the intended requirements as to mode of issue of stock and to sanction the issue of stock by subscription and to authorise the Company to pay commission to any person in respect of subscriptions or the procuring of subscriptions.

To authorise the Company to raise by the creation and issue of redeemable Preference Stock or redeemable Debenture Stock, all or any monies which they are or may be from time to time authorised to raise by the creation and issue of Preference or Debenture Stock; to provide for the redemption of such redeemable stock either by payment in cash or by the issue (free from the provisions relating to the mode and conditions of issue of stock) of substituted stock, whether redeemable or irredeemable; to enable the Company to raise any sums in cash required for such redemption, either by the creation and issue of new Ordinary or Preference Stock or new Debenture Stock as the case may be (and in the case of Preference Stock or Debenture Stock, either redeemable or irredeemable).

To authorise the Directors to declare and pay half-yearly or interim dividends on the converted Stock and also on any other Shares or Stock of the Company whether ordinary or preference, and to make provisions with respect to the dividends to be declared at the annual general meetings of the Company.

To authorise the Directors of the Company to close the register of transfers at such times and for such periods as may be specified in the Order and to make provisions as to transfers tendered to the Company during any period while the register is so closed.

To authorise the directors to appoint any member of their body to be a managing director of the Company, to provide for the remuneration of such managing director and to provide that he shall not be liable to retirement by rotation, and to authorise the delegation to such managing director of all or some of the powers of the directors.

To authorise the directors to determine from time to time the remuneration of the Secretary and Auditors of the Company.

To authorise the directors to grant gratuities and pensions or allowances or to make such other payments as they think fit to officers and servants of the Company in such circumstances as may be prescribed in the Order, and to subscribe or make donations to hospitals and similar institutions and to superannuation, benevolent and sick funds of employees of the Company, and to apply the funds and revenues of the Company for the said purposes or any of them.

To authorise the Company or the Directors to establish a scheme of co-partnership for their employees and to provide for the allocation to or for the benefit of the employees participating in any scheme of co-partnership established under powers to be conferred by the Order or otherwise of moneys out of the funds and revenues of the Company.

To authorise the Company or the Directors either in connection with any such scheme as aforesaid or otherwise to accept from their employees sums of money on deposit and to pay interest thereon out of the revenue of the Company and to issue to any such employee Stock of the Company with such rights as to dividend or otherwise as may be specified in the Order and to make provision as to the transmission of any Stock so issued.

To entitle the Company to require the payment of a minimum annual or other periodical sum where they are required to supply gas for purposes of a stand-by only to persons having a supply of gas from an installation other than that of the Company or a supply of electricity.

To confer further powers on the Company for the purchase of lands by agreement for the purposes of their undertaking.

To relieve the Company in certain cases from the obligation to supply gas from mains of which the capacity is insufficient for the purpose.

To confer powers upon the Company as to breaking up streets laid out but not dedicated to public use and the laying and maintenance of pipes and apparatus therein.

To empower the Company to lay down, maintain, repair, remove and renew pipes for procuring, conducting or disposing of oil and other materials and for any such purpose to open and break up streets and roads.

To make further provisions as to the construction and placing of pipes and fittings and to authorise the Company to specify the size and materials thereof and to provide for enforcing any such specification.

To make provision for the use of proper anti-fluctuators with gas engines and the inspection and testing thereof.

To empower the Company to require the provision of efficient non-return or other valves or apparatus where air at high pressure is used in connection with the supply of gas and to inspect any such valve or apparatus.

To provide that any meters, fittings, stoves, engines, apparatus or appliances let for hire by the Company shall remain the property of and be removable by them notwithstanding that they be fixed to the premises in which they are situate.

To make further provision as to the period during which in the case of a defective meter erroneous registration shall be deemed to have taken place.

To make provision as to Notice to be given to the Company by consumers of gas before removing from premises and the notice to be given to the Company by consumers discontinuing to take a supply of gas and to authorise the Company to refuse to supply gas to any person who has previously quitted premises without paying all charges due to the Company.

To authorise the Company to cut off and discontinue the supply of gas in certain cases of default by the occupier of any premises.

To authorise the Company to enter upon premises for the purposes or some of the purposes hereinbefore referred to or for exercising the powers proposed to be conferred upon the Company by the Order, and to authorise the Company to enter any premises on which there are any pipes, meters, fittings or apparatus of

the Company for the purpose of removing the same in any case in which a person entering into occupation of such premises does not require to take a supply of gas or to hire such pipes, meters, fittings, or apparatus.

To make provision as to the payment by the occupier of premises from which the supply of gas has been cut off of the costs of re-connection.

To authorise the Company to purchase, take on lease, or erect houses and buildings for persons in their employ and offices, showrooms and other buildings and to maintain and let any such houses or buildings.

To authorise the Company and any local authority, Company, body or person to contract or enter into and carry into effect agreements for the supply of gas in bulk to or by the Company by or to such local authority, Company, body, or person.

To empower the Company to acquire and use licences or other authorities to work patents in connection with their undertaking.

To authorise or provide for the making of bylaws and regulations for the purpose of enforcing the provisions or some of the provisions of the Order and to provide for the imposition of penalties for breach of such bylaws and regulations and to provide for the enforcement of the provisions of the Order or some of them by penalties or otherwise and to provide for the recovery of any such penalties.

To confer upon the Company all such powers as are now usually conferred upon Gas Companies and to make all such provisions as may be necessary for giving effect to the purposes aforesaid or as may be incidental thereto.

To make provisions with respect to the authentication and service of notices by the Company and the recovery of demands.
