The Right Honourable Rowland Thomas, Earl of Cromer, G.C.I.E., C.V.O., to be Lord Chamberlain.

The Right Honourable Anthony, Earl of Shaftesbury, K.P., G.C.V.O., C.B.E., to be Lord Steward.

The Right Honourable Bernard Arthur William Patrick Hastings, Earl of Granard, K.P., G.C.V.O., to be Master of the Horse, in the room of the Right Honourable Thomas Henry, Marquis of Bath, K.G., C.B, resigned.

Thomas Walter, Viscount Hampden, K.C.B., C.M.G., and The Right Honourable Edward Arthur, Baron Colebrooke, K.C.V.O., to be Lords in Waiting.

Navy.—Officers, R.N., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R., in possession of Full Dress Uniform—No. 1 Dress (Full Dress).

Officers, R.N., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R., not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—No. 3 Dress (Frock Coat with Epaulettes).

Army.—Officers in possession of Full Dress of their rank—Levée Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform of their rank—Service Dress.

Air Force.—Officers in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Full Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Service Dress.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

- 1. Gentlemen who have been presented and who wish to attend a Levée, should make a written application, as detailed below.
- 2. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials
