The following Addresses were presented to HIS MAJESTY, at Buckingham Palace, on Tuesday, the 19th instant:—

## CONVOCATION OF CANTERBURY.

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with the dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

The new Convocation, concurrent with the new Parliament, gives us the privilege of addressing Your Majesty for the second time

within a single year.

The changes which have taken place in the political life of England, the emergence of new factors and the dominance of new forces, give us occasion to say afresh what we have said in former years. We desire again to assure Your Majesty, although we believe the assur-

ance to be unnecessary, that it will be our continuous endeavour, in reliance upon the help of God the Holy Spirit, to secure that amongst the changes and chances of the Nation's life the National Church may be enabled worthily to do its part in promoting whatsoever things are just and lovely and of good report.

Your Majesty will believe us when we say that our co-operation may be counted upon in every wise and well-considered effort to reestablish peace and goodwill among those who are still suffering from the outcome of the Great War, to promote the revival of wholesome trade and commerce between Nation and Nation, and by these and other means to bring to an end among our own people the unemployment which hangs as a dark cloud over thousands of homes.

We further assure Your Majesty of the sympathy with which we regard every wise effort to mitigate the suffering due to the lack of houses in this Country.

We pray to Almighty God, from Whom alone come wisdom and power, that He will give to our country, and especially to the leaders of its public life, such grace and guidance as these anxious years require, and that He will enable us who now address Your Majesty as Ministers of the Lord Jesus Christ to bear faithful witness both in word and life to the Gospel of His love.

As we enter upon a new Session in the sixth Convocation of Your Majesty's reign we find various tasks awaiting us. Large questions of Christian Unity in relation to our brethren of the Free Churches in England and of the

Churches overseas are occupying many minds. The Revision and Enrichment of our Book of Common Prayer is, we would fain hope, approaching its last stage after the painstaking steps of busy years. Valuable suggestions as to the better use of Music in our public Services have been made to us by a duly appointed group of experts and students. The Committee upon the Property and Revenues of the Church, to which we ventured to call Your Majesty's attention last year, is about to publish a Report which will, as we hope, lead to improvement in the use of our resources. Measures recently adopted by the Church Assembly for helping the Clergy in the care of their houses of residence and for the uniting of small parishes are awaiting the approval of Parliament, and, as we hope, the Assent of Your Majesty.

An urgent problem affecting the innermost life of the Church is the supply of duly qualified men for the Sacred Ministry. The War and other causes have brought about a condition of things which calls for our immediate attention. In response to a request from the Convocations, a strong Committee has been formed to investi-

gate and report upon the subject.

In these and all other matters it is our earnest desire that, carrying the commission which Christ has given us, we may be enabled with necessary earnestness and usefulness to contribute to the furtherance of the Eternal Gospel on which rests, as we believe, the one sure and lasting hope for mankind.

We would conclude, as always, with the humble prayer that the blessing of Almighty God our Heavenly Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, may rest upon Your Majesty and upon every member of the Royal House.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

I thank Your Grace and the Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled, for your loyal and dutiful Address.

You approach me at a time when the country is faced with various problems; and when life is difficult for many of my people. I am confident that the National Church, which from the earliest days has been so closely identified with the history of our country, will ever strive to raise the minds and hearts of the Nation above and beyond material ends.

It is a matter of personal concern to me that unhappily so considerable a proportion of the population is still out of work; and I deplore the suffering and harm caused to the community by the scarcity of houses. I thank you for your assurance of sympathy and active cooperation in any well-considered measures which will lead to the improvement of the present conditions in these and other respects.

Your account of the work already accomplished, and still being continued by Convocation and by the Church Assembly deeply interests me. It is gratifying to know that the Governing Bodies of the Church regard with watchful care every aspect of its manifold life: and that you are earnestly endeavouring to strengthen and improve every instrument needful to carry out its Divinely appointed purpose.

I observe with special satisfaction that you have placed foremost among the tasks awaiting you, the vital question of Christian Unity. It has always been my fervent hope that a greater

measure of unity might be promoted among the different religious communions: and I trust that your deliberations may be so guided as to lead to closer fellowship between Christian people.

I pray that the Divine Blessing may rest upon you and assist you in all your under-

takings.

## CONVOCATION OF YORK.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY.

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of York in Convocation assembled approach Your Majesty with the dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

We earnestly desire and pray that the conditions of stable Peace in Europe, still so evidently endangered, may be restored and that in this endeavour the Government and peoples of this Realm and of France may be joined together as they were in the time of trial which

they endured as friends and allies.

We have noted with profound satisfaction the declaration of Your Majesty's Government with respect of the League of Nations. We believe that the peace of the World can only be securely based on a foundation of Justice, mutual understanding and good will. regard with dismay the disposition, but too apparent in some quarters, to return to that state of suspicion, competing armaments, and secret alliances, which the League of Nations was designed to replace by a saner and more hopeful ordering of international life. believe that by strengthening and using the League of Nations Your Majesty's Government will secure the peace of the World, and therein also serve the best interest of Your Majesty's Empire.

Another ground for hope which we greatly value is that cordial co-operation between the two great English speaking Nations on which the best interests of the world so greatly depend and we rejoice that Your Majesty's Government has concluded an arrangement with the Government of the United States of America, by which the disgraceful smuggling of alcoholic liquors into the Republic in defiance of its laws will be effectually

restrained.

The signature of a Treaty of Peace with Turkey will we hope bring to the sorely tried Churches of the East some security from the troubles by which they have been afflicted so that by the Blessing of God Christianity may yet flourish in its ancient seats.

We trust that the proceedings of the recent Imperial Conference of the Nations united under Your Mujesty's Sovereignty may result in strengthening the ties which bind these Nations together and in making the principles and ideals which are cherished within the British Empire a power in the world.

Here in England unemployment continues to depress and disorganise the life of the populous communities in which we live and work. We observe with distress its ill effects not only on the general life but more particularly on the life of the young in the critical years of adolescence, when the disciplines of school have been outgrown, and the habit of self-

respecting citizenship ought to be formed, great numbers of English youths are now condemned to the demoralization of continuing We believe that the revival of the idleness. national industries by providing employment would not only improve the material conditions of our people but also arrest the danger of the moral deterioration of the young which is We are confibecoming only too apparent. dent that Your Majesty's Government will continue to use every effort to find a solution for this most urgent problem. We cannot conclude our Address to Your Majesty without directing attention to the tragic and ever waxing urgency of the need for more and better houses in our great industrial centres. believe that a principal cause of the social unrest is the discomfort and degradation inflicted on large numbers of the people by the wretched conditions under which they are compelled to live. Family life in any tolerable sense is rendered impossible by overcrowding. morals of the young are endangered by it and the whole standard of Citizenship is lowered by the practical disappearance of the home over large areas of civic life.

The Church in this Northern Province continues in spite of many difficulties to do its utmost to bring to the people the strength and stay of faith in God and in the Gospel of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We thank Your Majesty for the example of dutifulness which from the altitude of the Throne has been steadily presented to Your people ever since Your Majesty was called to reign over us. We have been comforted and strengthened in our labours by the knowledge that we always possess the sympathy and support of our Sovereign. We pray always that the blessing of Almighty God may rest abundantly on Your Majesty's Person, Home and Realm.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

It gives me great pleasure to receive this loyal and dutiful Address from Your Grace and the Bishops and Clergy of the Province of York, in Convocation assembled.

I join with you in praying that Almighty God may be pleased to give His Blessing to those men of goodwill who are earnestly striving to secure the peace of the world. To that end I heartily agree with you as to the importance of maintaining between ourselves and the Allied Peoples, especially France and the United States of America, those ties of friendship and co-operation so greatly strengthened by the common endurance of the hardships and perils of war.

I share your confidence in the ability of the League of Nations to foster that spirit of reliance on right and forbearance, instead of suspicion and armed strength, and thus to contribute effectively towards the establishment of Peace on a firm and lasting foundation.

Throughout the land, the terrible effects of continued unemployment are alas! only too apparent. My Ministers are devoting their full energies to remedy this, the greatest of our domestic problems; and I earnestly trust that, under God's guidance, their endeavours may be blessed with success.

The conditions arising from the shortage of houses, to which you refer, are also receiving

the unremitting attention of my Government.

I am fully sensible alike of the difficulties confronting the Church and of the manner in which they are being overcome. May the Blessing of The Almighty ever rest on you and

your labours.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 7th March, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for
  - (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and
  - (b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.
- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

## Whitehall, February 28, 1924.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to William Henry Lee, a labourer employed by Messrs. Goodall and Simpson, of Cardiff, in the following circumstances:

On October 31st, 1923, while three men were engaged on the cleaning of a tank at the premises of the National Benzol Company at Cardiff they were overcome by the benzol fumes. One of them who was near a manhole managed to escape, but the other two men were rendered unconscious. The manager of the depôt, Mr. Roberts, first attempted a rescue, but both he and another workman named Simpson were forced to withdraw overcome by the fumes. Lee then attempted to effect a rescue and entered the tank no less than five times, coming out for short intervals to inhale fresh air. He eventually succeeded in placing a rope round the unconscious men and they were hauled out of the tank.

The rescuers from their previous experience were all well aware of the great risk they ran in entering the tank without a gas mask or life line and hazarded their lives. Lee, in particular, showed calm courage and indomitable perseverance in entering the tank again and again, and undoubtedly saved the life of one of the rescued men. The other, unfortunately, did not recover consciousness.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A SPECIAL ORDER TO BE CITED AS THE TRADE BOARDS (STAMPED or Pressed Metal-wares) Order, 1924.

Whereas the Minister of Labour on the 28th day of March, 1923, published notice of his intention to make a Special Order, pursuant to his powers under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, varying the description of the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Trade contained in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1919;

And whereas objections were made with respect to the draft Order;

And whereas, the draft order not having been amended or withdrawn after consideration of these objections, the Minister of Labour in accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1918, appointed Sir William Warrender Mackenzie, K.B.E., K.C., to hold an enquiry with regard to the said draft order and to report to him thereon:

And whereas Sir William Mackenzie duly held an enquiry in public with regard to the said draft order on the 6th, 7th, 19th and 20th June, 1923, and reported to the Minister of Labour thereon;

And whereas the Minister of Labour has considered this report;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that, with a view to varying by way of correction the description of the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Trade contained in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1919, he intends, pursuant to the powers conferred upon him by Section 1 and Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order varying the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1919, and the Trade Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1919, in the manner shown in the Draft Special Order contained in the Appendix hereto.

Further copies of the Draft Special Order may be obtained on application in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Labour, Montagu House, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1.

Objections to the Draft Special Order must be sent to the Minister of Labour at the above address within 42 days from the 29th day of February, 1924. Every objection must be in writing and must state:

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

Draft Special Order made in pursuance of SECTIONS 1 AND 2 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, WITH RESPECT TO THE STAMPED OR PRESSED METAL-WARES TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, have been applied to the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade by the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1919;

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Special Order;

And whereas the Minister of Labour is of opinion that it is desirable to vary the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-wares) Order, 1919, with a view to correcting the description of the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Order;

And whereas the Minister of Labour is further of opinion that it is desirable to vary the Trade Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1919, in so far as it may apply to any operations or processes specified in the Appendix to this Order;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in him vested, as before recited, does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the day of , 1924, the following provisions shall

have effect (that is to say):—
Article 1.—The description of the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-wares) Order, 1919, is hereby varied by the substitution therefor of the description set out in the

Appendix to this Order.

Article 2.—The Trade Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1919, is hereby varied by the exclusion therefrom of any operations and processes comprised therein which may be included in the Appendix to this Order.

Article 3.--This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metalwares) Order, 1924.

### APPENDIX.

The Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade, that is to say:—

- (1) the manufacture from metal in sheet or strip form by cold stamping or cold pressing of articles known in the trade as metal small wares;
- (2) the cutting, shearing, annealing and hardening of metal in an establishment in which the metal is used for such manufacture;

(3) the covering of corset steels prior to capping or tipping in an establishment in which the steels are capped or tipped;

- (4) finishing (including dipping, nickelling, plating, tinning, japanning, stovenamelling, lacquering, bronzing, colouring, painting, varnishing, barrelling, burnishing, grinding, planishing, polishing, and the capping, counting, looping, studding, or tipping of corset busks or steels) and similar operations when done in conjunction with such manufacture;
- (5) viewing, inspecting, testing, sorting, boxing, carding, carrying, delivering, despatching, labelling, packeting, packing, portering, warehousing, weighing and similar processes or operations when done in conjunction with such manufacture;

(6) the assembling of the above mentioned wares or parts thereof, whether the things assembled are made inside or outside Great Britain, and

(7) any process or operation which is included in the Button-making Trade, as defined for the purposes of the Trade Boards Acts, when carried on in an establishment mainly engaged in any of the processes or operations defined in the preceding paragraphs hereof;

Excluding: —

(i) the production by the processes and operations defined in paragraphs (1) to (6) above of any article or part of any article in an establishment in which such article or part is incorporated with or fitted to any other article made in that establishment or part of any other article made in that establishment

#### unless

- (a) such other article or part is wholly or mainly made by the processes or operations specified in paragraphs (1) to (4) and (6) above, or
- (b) the establishment is mainly engaged in the processes or operations specified in paragraphs (1) to (7) above and/or in brass founding;
- (ii) any processes or operations included in the following Orders or any amendments or variations thereof:—

the Trade Boards (Coffin Furniture and Cerement-making) Order, 1919;

the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1913;

the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order, 1919;

the Trade Boards (Pin, Hook and Eye and Snap Fastener) Order, 1919;

the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920; (iii) (a) the manufacture of articles known in the trade as real or imitation jewellery, and (b) the manufacture of any article or part of any article in an establishment mainly engaged in the manufacture of such jewellery;

(iv) (a) the manufacture of steel and base metal pens and loose leaf metals, and (b) the manufacture of any article or part of any article in an establishment mainly engaged in the manufacture of such pens or metals;

(v) (a) the manufacture of locks and latches (other than locks which are parts of fittings of bags or cases), and (b) the manufacture of any article or part of any article in an establishment mainly engaged in the manufacture of such locks or latches;

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Special Order;

And whereas by the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-wares) Order, 1924, the Minister of Labour varied the said Trade Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1919;

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable further to vary the said Trade Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1919, with a view to correcting the description of the Trade specified in the Appendix to the said Order;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in him vested, as before recited, does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the day of 1924, the following provisions

shall have effect (that is to say):

Article 1. The description of the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Trade Boards |

(Button-Making) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metalwares Order, 1924, is hereby further varied by the substitution therefor of the description set

out in the Appendix to this Order.

Article 2. This Order may be cited as the
Trade Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1924.

The manufacture of buttons, button moulds, upholsterers' buttons or upholsterers' buttonheaded nails (excluding the shanks), from any material by the processes of cutting, sawing, stamping, pressing, turning, drilling, fancying, grinding, barrelling, polishing, japanning, lacquering, dyeing, colouring, painting, varnishing, sewing, crocheting, or the covering of button moulds; including:

(a) the manufacture of studs, links or parts thereof from any material other than metal, where such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers;

(b) the manufacture of shanks for buttons where carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;

(c) the carding of any of the above articles wherever carried on;

(d) all despatching, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles;

(e) the processes or operations specified in paragraphs (1) to (6) of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-wares) Order, 1924, in any establish-ment mainly engaged in any of the other processes or operations which are included in the trade defined by this Draft Order;

but excluding:—

(f) the manufacture of wooden button moulds;
