(3) All that piece of land belonging to the Company situate at Castleford aforesaid containing 660 square yards or thereabouts bounded on or towards the North by property of the United Glass Bottle Manufacturers Limited on or towards the East by property of the London and North Eastern Railway Company on or towards the South by other property of the Company and on or towards the West by property of the Aire and Calder Navigation.
