"And whereas Eliza Jane Dixon, late of Number 121, Ormerod Road, Burnley, in the said County of Lancaster, Spinster, who died on the 19th day of May, 1915, by her will dated the 7th day of January, 1915, directed that if within a period of twenty-one years after her decease and under or in pursuance of The New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856, or any of them or any Act or Acts consolidating or amending the same respectively or other legal authority any part or parts of the following existing Ecclesiastical Parishes, namely, Great Marsden; Little Marsden; Saint Mary, Nelson; Saint Philip, Nelson; and Brierfield, all in the said County of Lancaster, or of any one or more of them should be duly constituted a separate District or separate Districts for spiritual purposes the Trustees or Trustee for the time being of her Will should transfer to or vest in the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England or any other Commissioners, Corporation, or public body, who may be legally authorized in that behalf, out of her residuary estate the sum of Three thousand pounds free of duty for or towards the provision of a Church or Chapel, Churches or Chapels, for such District or respective Districts or for such one or more of them as the said Commissioners, Corporation or other public body should in their discretion think fit and for or towards the endowment or augmentation of the income of the Minister or perpetual Curate, Ministers or perpetual Curates, thereof or for either of such purposes respectively and if for both such purposes or for more than one such District then in such proportions as such Commissioners, Corporation or other public body as aforesaid should in their discretion think most beneficial:

"And whereas Walter Southern, of The Craven Bank Chambers, Burnley, in the said County of Lancaster, Solicitor, being the surviving Trustee of the said Will, has agreed, with the approval of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the appropriation of the whole of the said sum of Three thousand pounds towards the provision of a permanent Church for the proposed District of Saint Bede, Nelson, which is to be taken out of the said New Parish of Little Marsden, such appropriation to be made when and so soon as the said District shall have been duly formed and constituted as a Peel District within 21 years after the death of the Testatrix:

"And whereas the said Walter Southern as the contributor of the said capital sum of £3,000 towards the cost of providing such permanent Church has nominated the Bishop

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Little Marsden, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the south-east by the New Parish of Saint James, Briercliffe, upon the north-east partly by the last named New Parish and partly by the New Parish of Great Marsden, upon the north-west by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip, Nelson, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip, Nelson, from the said New Parish of Little Marsden at the centre of the bridge which carries the Clifton, Accrington and Colne line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway across Railway Street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Railway Street for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chapel House Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Chapel House Road for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Beaufort Street, and extending thence south-eastward

The following Statute made by the University of Oxford on the 1st day of March, 1924, and sealed by the University of Oxford Commissioners on the 23rd day of May, 1924, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923":—

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONVOCATION ON
TUESDAY, DECEMBER 4, 1923.

Whereas it is expedient to repeal *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. II. H. § 7* and to make new provision with respect to the Chichele Professor of Military History, THE UNIVERSITY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:—

The existing *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. II. H. § 7* (p. 136, ed. 1923), shall be struck out and there shall be substituted for it the following subsection:—

"H. § 7. Chichele Professor of Military History.

1. The Chichele Professor of Military History shall lecture and give instruction in the History of War.

2. He shall be entitled to receive annually the sum of £1,200 from All Souls College.

3. Unless the University otherwise by Statute determine, the Professor shall hold his office for a period of five years from the date of his election, and no longer, but shall be re-eligible.

4. He shall be subject in respect of residence and duties to the general regulations laid down in *Statt. Tit. IV. Sectio I. § 3*, and also to the particular regulations applicable to the Professors enumerated in Schedule A annexed to the aforesaid subsection.

5. The Professor shall be elected by a Board of Electors consisting of:—

(1) The Vice-Chancellor, or, if an election is to be held when the Warden of All Souls is Vice-Chancellor, a person appointed by the Hebdomadal Council to act as an Elector on that occasion in the place of the Vice-Chancellor;

(2) The Chairman of the Committee of Imperial Defence or a person appointed by him on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an Elector on that occasion;

(3) A person elected by the Hebdomadal Council;

(4) (5) Two persons elected by the Warden and Fellows of All Souls College;

(6) A person elected by the Board of the Faculty of Literæ Humaniores;

(7) A person elected by the Board of the Faculty of Modern History.

6. *Statt. Tit. IV. Sectio I. § 2 (a)* shall in its application to the election of the Professor be subject to the following modifications:—

(a) Clause 5 (f) of § 2 (a) shall not apply to the election of the Professor, but the following provisions shall apply in lieu thereof:—

(i) The Electors shall not elect any person as Professor unless, in the opinion of more

than one-half of the Electors present and voting, he possesses exceptional qualifications for the Chair, and no election shall be deemed to have taken place unless more than one-half of the Electors present and voting shall have voted for the person elected.

(ii) If, at the first or any adjourned meeting, two or more persons who are qualified as aforesaid be under consideration by the Electors, but no one of such persons obtain such a majority as aforesaid, the Electors shall report the names of all such persons to the Chancellor of the University, who shall then appoint to the vacant office that one of such persons whom he may deem most fit.

(iii) If in the opinion of more than one-half of the Electors present and voting at the first or an adjourned meeting no person so qualified as aforesaid is available for election, they shall so report to the Hebdomadal Council.

(iv) On any occasion on which it receives such a report the Council shall thereupon suspend the appointment to the vacant office for one year. This provision is in addition to any other power of suspension vested in the Council under *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. I. § 2 (a)*.

(v) Proceedings for filling up the vacancy, in accordance with the provisions of *Statt. Tit. IV. Sectio I. § 2 (a)*, as modified by the provisions of this Statute, shall be taken afresh immediately after any period of one year as mentioned in (iv) has elapsed.

(b) The provisions of Clause 4 of *Statt. Tit. IV. Sectio I. § 2 (a)* shall apply to the emoluments of the vacant office accruing during any such period of suspension as in this Statute is mentioned, but with the substitution in the said Clause 4 of the Curators of the Bodleian Library for the Common University Fund."

SPECIAL TEMPORARY REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT BY COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF CANDIDATES FOR SITUATIONS IN THE GENERAL POST OFFICE AS MALE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT OF TRAFFIC (CLASS II) IN THE LONDON TELEPHONE SERVICE AND MALE ASSISTANT TRAFFIC SUPERINTENDENT IN THE PROVINCES.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 18 and must not have attained the age of 23 on the 1st January, 1924. In reckoning age candidates who have served in the Army, Navy or Air Force between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, may deduct from their actual age any period of service between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st December, 1919.

2. No person will be eligible for admission to the competition who is not a natural-born British subject and the son of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners and provided that

exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who served in H.M. Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

3. Candidates must have completed a course of study which in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners is suitable as training for the duties of the post of Assistant Superintendent of Traffic, &c.

4.
