WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 1st day of May, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

'We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of | from their said mortgages:

the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice ') of Bredgar, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bredgar is vested for an estate in fee simple in Sir Henry Edward Dering, Baronet, of Surrenden-Dering, Pluckley, Ashford, in the said County of Kent, subject, however, together with other hereditaments, to a certain family charge and also to certain Mortgages which are vested in the Equity and Law Life Assurance Society, being a duly incorporated Society whose registered office is at Number 18, Lincoln's Inn Fields, London, but otherwise free from incumbrances:

"And whereas the said Henry Edward Dering is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presenta-tion to the said Benefice of Bredgar, now vested as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury

for the time being:

And whereas the said Equity and Law Life Assurance Society are prepared to consent to such transfer for the purpose of enabling the Advowson of the said Benefice of Bredgar to be transferred as aforesaid, freed and released "And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, now Archbishop of Canterbury, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocesc which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Bredgar which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage cr Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Bredgar:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry Edward Dering (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Equity and Law Life Assurance Society (in testimony of which consent they have affixed their Common Seal to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archienisconal Seal) we the said his Archiepiscopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bredgar shall be transferred to the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and by his successors in the same Archbishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 15th day of May, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Great Crosby, and partly out of the Parish of Sefton, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Great Crosby, and the said Parish of Sefton are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Great Crosby, and of the said Parish of Sefton which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

" And whereas for the purpose of providing an endowment for the said proposed District there has been contributed a sum £4991 8s. 4d. £3½ per centum Conversion Stock and the same has been transferred into our name to be held in trust by us towards the endowment of the said proposed District and so soon as the said District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due in respect of the said sum of Stock to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the said hereinbefore mentioned Act:

"And whereas the said annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of Stock and to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent for the time being will amount to the sum of £174 14s. Od.:

"And whereas there has been contributed and transferred into our name a sum of £2,000 £5 per centum War Stock (1929-1947) to be held by us towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church for the said proposed separate District: "And whereas a sum of £4,060 £3½ per centum Conversion Stock (being a portion of the said sum of £4,991 Ss. 4d. of the same Stock) and also the said sum of £2,000 £5 per centum War Stock (1929-1947) have been so contributed and transferred to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said intended District and of the nomination of the Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said sum of £4,060 £3½ per centum Conversion Stock and of the said sum of £2,000 £5 per centum War Stock (1929-1947) have nominated the Reverend Edward Hartley, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Great Crosby, Charles James Wharton Littler, of "Winona," Warren Road, Blundellsands, in the said County of Lancaster, Cotton Merchant, John Parkinson Smith, of "Beachside," Dowhills Road, Blundellsands, Merchant, Peter Todd, of "Dunree," Ashbourne Avenue, Blundellsands, Mechanical Engineer, and Cyril Williams, of Number 8. Cambridge Avenue, Great Crosby, Share Broker, as the persons to whom and to whose heirs and assigns they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish (as the case may be) shall be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Great Crosby, and of the said Parish of Sefton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Michael, Blundellsands.'

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of such New Parish and of the nomination of an Incumbent thereto, shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Edward Hartley, Charles James Wharton Littler, John Parkinson Smith, Peter Todd, and Cyril Williams, their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Michael, Blundellsands, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Great Crosby, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the north by the Parish of Sefton, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west, upon the south-west and upon part of the south-east by the New Parish of Saint Nicholas, Blundellsands, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Nicholas, Blundellsands, from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Great Crosby, at the junction of Blundellsands Road East, College Road and Victoria Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Victoria Road for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cambridge Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Cambridge Road for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Ince Avenue, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Ince Avenue for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Manor Road, and extending thence first north-eastward, then northward and then again north-eastward along the middle of the proposed continuation of Ince Avenue for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Little Crosby Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Little Crosby Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries Little Crosby Road across Boundary Brook upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Great Crosby, from the said Parish of Sefton.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Sefton, which is bounded upon the south-west by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Great Crosby, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east, upon the east, upon the north-east and upon the northwest by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Great Crosby, from the said Parish of Sefton at the centre of the culvert which carries Little Crosby Road across Boundary Brook, and extending thence first north-eastward, then northward and then north-westward along the middle of Little Crosby Road for a distance of 63 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dibb Lane, and extending thence first westward and then scuth-westward along the middle of Dibb Lane for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries such lane across the above-mentioned stream, upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Sefton from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Great Crosby."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be con-

stituted shall be taken and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55. duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 10th day of April, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

We. the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the Sth and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Stephen, Soundwell, situate within the Parish of Downend, in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Bristol:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Downend, of the Parish of Mangotsfield and of the District Parish of the Trinity, Kingswood, both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such

Parishes and District Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Downend, of the said Parish of Mangotsfield, and of the said District Parish of the Trinity, Kingswood, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Stephen. Soundwell, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol, as such Bishop and also as the Patron (in right

of his See) of the Vicarage of the said District Parish of the Trinity, Kingswood, and with the consents of John Henry Buxton, of Easneye, Ware, in the County of Hertford, Esquire, the Reverend Charles James Procter, of Number 10, Scroope Terrace, Cambridge, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Right Reverend Bishop John Taylor Smith, Chaplain General to Your Majesty's Forces, the Reverend Herbert Dudley Lampen, of the Vicarage, Walthamstow, in the County of Essex, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Henry Thomas Alexander Dashwood, of Number 1, The Sanctuary, in the City of Westminster, Esquire (commonly known as the Peache Trustees), as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Downend as well as of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Mangotsfield (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Downend, of the said Parish of Mangotsfield and of the said District Parish of the Trinity, Kingswood, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Stephen, Soundwell, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Soundwell.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Soundwell, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Downend, of the Parish of Mangotsfield, and of the District Parish of the Trinity, Kingswood, all in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Bristol, which, taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the Bristol and Birmingham Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway at Staple Hill Station where the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint John, Fishponds, the New Parish of Fishponds, both in the said County and Diocese, and the said Parish of Downend all meet, and extending thence first eastward and then south eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Downend from the said Parish of Mangotsfield) for a distance of 1 mile and 23 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Mangotsfield and Bath line of the said London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of 71 chains or thereabouts to the point where such line of railway crosses the boundary which divides the said Parish of Mangotsfield from the Parish of Siston, in the said County and Diocese, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following for the most part the middle of Warmley Brook) for a distance of 63 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Anchor Road across Warmley Brook where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the New Parish of Warmley, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Mangotsfield, and extending thence south westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Anchor Road) for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said District Parish of the Trinity, Kingswood, from the said Parish of Mangotsfield, and extending thence first northward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in one part the middle of Pound Lane, in another part the middle of Fry's Road, and in another part the middle of Holly Lane) for a distance of 433 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Holly Lane with New Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of New Road for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 149 on the Ord-Survey Map of Kingswood \mathbf{of} nance the Civil published Parish in 1916 the year upon the scale 25 inches to a mile and also upon the Map or Plan which is annexed to this Representation from the close numbered 148 upon the same maps, and extending thence first westward to the said fence and then first westward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 149 and the closes numbered 150, 153 and 154 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 148 and the closes numbered 155 and 157 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 15 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 154 from the said close numbered 157 meets the fence on the eastern side of Spring Hill Lane, and extending thence first westward to and then southward along the middle of Spring Hill Lane for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 163 upon the said maps from the close numbered 162 upon the same maps, and extending thence first westward to and then first westward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 163 and the closes numbered 199, 164, 165 and 171 upon the said said close numberedfrom the and the closes numbered 166 and 167 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 171 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence meets the fence on the south eastern side of Crown Lane, and extending thence first north westward to, and then south westward along, the middle of Crown Lane for a distance of 31 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Johnson's Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Johnson's Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the point where Johnson's Road diverges westward, and continuing thence north westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 3 yards or thereabouts to a point on the northern side of Johnson's Road upon the boundary which divides the said District Parish of the Trinity,

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

St. James's Palace, S.W. 1, 6th June, 1924.

The KING has directed that the appointment of Douglas McLaren, formerly temporary Captain, South African General List, to be a Member of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, dated the 3rd June 1918, shall be cancelled and annulled, and his name erased from the Register, in consequence of his having been convicted by a Civil Court.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th June, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for:—
 - (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and
 - (b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1983.
- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be

£35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

- 3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th June, 1924, to Saturday, the 21st June, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
