BY THE KING. A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, did, on the 13th day of October, 1897, issue Her Royal Proclamation establishing a Branch of Our Royal Mint at Perth in Western Australia:

And whereas by the Melbourne Mint Proclamation, 1900, and the Sydney Mint Proclamation, 1900, similar provision was made for establishing Branch Mints at Melbourne in Victoria and at Sydney in New South Wales:

And whereas by the Australian Branch Mints Proclamation, 1916, the Deputy Masters of the Branch Mints established under the above-recited Proclamations were authorised, during the continuance of the then war and of a period of one year thereafter, to make payment for gold bullion brought to the Branch Mints in manner provided by regulations made under proviso (d) of sub-section (i) of Article 5 of each of the said Proclamations:

And whereas by the Australian Branch Mints (Amendment) Proclamation, 1922, the said authority was continued until the 31st day of August, 1924:

And whereas it is expedient that the said authority should be further continued until the 31st day of August, 1925:

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the Coinage Acts, 1870 and 1891,

and all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby direct and ordain as follows:—

1. The Australian Branch Mints Proclamation, 1916, as amended by the Australian Branch Mints (Amendment) Proclamation, 1922, shall have effect as though the words "during the period ending on the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five" were substituted for the words "during the period ending on the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four."

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Australian Branch Mints (Amendment) Proclamation, 1924.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-fifth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and in the Fifteenth year of Our Reign.

And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 8th day of November, 1918, to approve, inter alia, that the Medical Director General should have the rank and style of Surgeon Vice Admiral or Surgeon Rear Admiral according to whether he holds the relative rank of Vice Admiral or Rear Admiral under the Regu-

lations then in force:

And whereas we consider that the Medical Director General should be retired on vacating the appointment and should be allowed to retain on retirement any higher rank accorded to him in respect of the appointment and also

receive retired pay appropriate to that rank:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to provide that any Naval Medical Officer who may now or hereafter hold the post of Medical Director General

shall:

(1) be compulsory retired on ceasing to

hold the appointment;

(2) retain on retirement any higher rank which he may have been granted while hold-

ing the appointment;

3) receive on retirement retired pay on the scale applicable to the rank held by him on the termination of his tenure of the The rule as regards retired appointment. pay to have retrospective effect as from the 1st April, 1919, from which date the revised scales of pay for Officers of the Royal Navy were introduced.

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to sanction, inter alia, certain Regulations designed to bring the emoluments of Officers of the Royal Marines into conformity with those of Officers of the Royal Navy:

"And whereas these Regulations provide that Officers of the Royal Marines shall be granted pay and retired pay at the rates applicable to Naval Officers on the basis of the relative rank held by the former when afloat, with certain modifications, but make no corresponding provision for certain allowances payable to these Officers, the rates of which vary according to rank:

"And whereas we consider that, in accordance with the principle of assimilating the emoluments of Officers of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, such allowances payable to Officers of the Royal Marines should also be determinable in general by their relative rank when afloat, and not necessarily by their actual relative rank, and that the authority for the issue of allowances on this basis should be explicitly defined:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction such allowances of Officers, Royal Marines, being regulated according to their relative rank affoat, with the following exceptions, viz.:—

(a) Lieutenants, Royal Marines ex Warrant Officer of under five years' seniority (other than Officers commissioned under Clause (1) of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of February, 1913), to be on the same scale as for Lieutenants, Royal Navy;

(b) Paymasters and Barrackmasters, Royal Marines, on promotion to the substantive rank of Lieutenant Colonel after 12 years' service as Major, under Schedule V, Section I, Clause I (IV) of Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, to remain on the scale for Majors.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of White Ladies Aston with the neighbouring Benefice (being a Rectory) of Churchill Saint Michael and with part of the neighbouring Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Spetchley with Warndon, and for effecting the union

of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Tibberton with Bredicot with the residue of the said neighbouring Benefice of Spetchley with Warndon, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Worcester and in the Diocese of Worcester:

Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Ernest, Bishop of Worcester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefices of White Ladies Aston and Churchill Saint Michael and a portion of the said United Benefice of Spetchley with Warndon and further to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot with the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Spetchley with Warndon, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Worcester, and therein recommended the severance from the said United Benefice of Spetchley with Warndon of the Benefice of Spetchley and the union of the said Benefice of Spetchley so severed with the neighbouring Benefices of White Ladies Aston and Churchill Saint Michael and therein further recommended the union of the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Spetchley with Warndon with the neighbouring Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot, and the terms for effecting the said two unions and the said Bishop of Worcester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

said Report:

"And whereas to facilitate the carrying into effect of the provisions hereinafter recommended and proposed for the said two unions of Benefices it is expedient that pending the taking effect of the said two unions the said Benefices of Churchill Saint Michael and Spetchley with Warndon which are now held in plurality by the Reverend William John Jenkins should be legally united:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of White Ladies Aston, Churchill Saint Michael, Spetchley with Warndon and Tibberton with Bredicot are now full, the Reverend Arthur Peveril Turnbull being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of White Ladies Aston, the said William John Jenkins being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Churchill Saint Michael and Spetchley with Warndon as aforesaid, and the Reverend Lindsey Constantine Cooper being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Spetchley with Warndon has no Parsonage House and therefore only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot and Warndon when the said two unions which are hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot and such house will accordingly become the Parsonage House of the United Benefice:

The following Address was presented to The KING on Saturday, the 19th instant, on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit to Liverpool:—

CITY OF LIVERPOOL.

To Their Most Excellent Majesties King George V and Queen Mary.

We, Your Majesties' loyal subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Liverpool, in Council assembled, beg leave to approach Your Majesties with an expression of the dutiful homage of ourselves and the loyal community we represent, and our gratification at the high privilege of welcoming Your Majesties on this the memorable occasion of your Visit to Liverpool.

We remember with pride the several occasions on which the City was honoured by Visits of His Beloved Majesty, King Edward VII, and particularly do we recall the occasion of His Visit to lay the Foundation Stone of the

Cathedral on the 19th July, 1904.

It is a matter of profound gratification and pleasure to our Citizens that Your Majesties expressed the kindly thought of commemorating the Twentieth Anniversary of that day by honouring our City with your Presence on the occasion of the Dedication of the Cathedral, a noble Edifice which, we earnestly hope, will serve to promote the highest interests of humanity, and, while forming a most valuable addition to the architectural features of our City, be worthy of our Country's great and historic Cathedrals.

We pray that The Almighty may be pleased to bestow every blessing upon Your Majesties, and that you may be long spared to guide the destinies of this great Empire, to advance the welfare and happiness of whose peoples your untiring efforts are always directed.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you very sincerely for your loyal and dutiful Address and for the cordial and enthusiastic welcome which the Queen and I have received from the Corporation and Citizens of Liverpool. We recall with pleasure our past visits to your City.

Since then great changes have been effected. By far the most important of these is the building of the noble Cathedral to be consecrated to-day. It is a fine tribute to the piety, the generosity and the local patriotism of the City and Diocese that, on the 20th anniversary of the day when my dear Father laid the foundation stone of the Cathedral this great and splendid achievement of modern architecture is ready for consecration and use. hope which you have expressed that the Cathedral Church of Christ in Liverpool may be worthy of the historic Cathedrals of England will assuredly be realised. Liverpool has risen to the full height of its rare opportunity and has placed itself on a level with those great merchant towns of the Middle Ages which found the highest expression of their religious aspirations and of their civic pride in the building and adorning of their Cathedral Church.

Neither in its site nor in its architecture need Liverpool Cathedral fear comparison with the masterpieces of past generations. The position chosen dominates the port and cannot fail to strike the imagination of approaching sailors and travellers with the belief that this great modern trading community—no less than its mediæval forerunners—desires to "abide under the shadow of the Almighty."

The Cathedral, moreover, is worthy of its high spiritual purpose. The whole design brings out the grandeur of the architect's conception and the skill with which he has solved the problem of adapting the building to the noble objects it has to serve. The necessity of ensuring that a very large congregation should be able to see and hear a preacher, introduced into his task a complication which did not trouble the builders of the Middle Ages. Liverpool Cathedral marks a most important stage in the evolution of modern British architecture, since it is the first instance on so magnificent a scale in which the slavish copying of old models has been eschewed and the Gothic tradition has been freely used and transformed by the modern spirit to minister to the religious needs of the present day.

This Cathedral recalls the great buildings of a past age: it is planned on a colossal scale and can be completed only by efforts continued throughout a long series of years. This is the true spirit of the mediæval builders, who felt that they could safely trust the execution of their cherished schemes to the faithful labours of succeeding generations, because what they designed to symbolise the undying life of the Church, might well be too vast to be accomplished by one generation of men. It is a splendid testimony to the vitality of the Church in Liverpool that they have embarked fearlessly on so noble an enterprise, confident that, although they could not see to the end, the work would not be allowed to languish, but would in due time be carried to completion-"They dreamed not of a perishable home who thus could build." Their confidence was grounded also on a knowledge of the spirit of their fellow-Citizens. It has long been a characteristic of Liverpool that her people have never allowed success in commerce to blind their eyes to those values which are not to be measured in material balances, and that they have given liberally of their wealth to religion, social service, literature, art and science.

The development and work of Liverpool University and the splendid results obtained in the study of tropical diseases, are two examples among many to indicate how far Liverpool has been from confining herself to a narrow pursuit of gain: and what results have been achieved by the union of practical

business capacity with intellectual research.
I understand that, when the project of building a Cathedral in Liverpool was first launched, some fear was felt lest it should divert the money and energy so essential for the more ordinary needs of the Church. Actual facts have proved these misgivings to be without foundation: and the magnitude of the conception has quickened the whole life of the Church and stimulated the activities of the Diocese in all directions. I am convinced that the Cathedral, as a centre and expression of the religious aspirations of Liverpool, will be felt as an inspiration and a force for good in every sphere of social and industrial life, and in the entire channel of municipal enterprise.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 130).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:-

Extension of Infected Area.

1. WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers vested in them under subsections (1) and (10) of Section 19 of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and the City of London Sewers Act, 1897, the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London, acting through the Common Council, have made the Order set forth in the Schedule to this Order:

Now therefore, the Minister of Health, in the exercise of his powers in that behalf,

hereby confirms the said Order.

This Order may be cited as "The City of London (Offensive Trade) Confirmation Order, 1924," and shall come into operation on the 28th day of July, 1924.

CORPORATION OF LONDON.

Public Hralth (London) Act, 1891.

Slaughterer of Poultry.

Whereas by Section 19, subsection 1, of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, it is enacted as follows:—

If any person-

(a) Establishes anew the following businesses or any of them that is to say, the business of blood boiler, bone boiler, manure manufacturer, soap boiler, tallow melter or knacker; or

(b) Establishes anew without the sanction of the County Council the following businesses or any of them, that is to say, the business of fellmonger, tripe boiler,

slaughterer of cattle or horses, or any other business which the County Council may declare by Order confirmed by the Local Government Board and published in the London Gazette to be an offensive business,

he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds in respect of the establishment thereof and any person carrying on the same when established shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds for every day during which

he so carries on the same;

And whereas it has been represented to the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London (being the Sanitary Authority for the City of London as Successors in Law to the late Commissioners of Sewers and substituted for the County Council in the application of the section to the City of London) that the business of a slaughterer of poultry is an offensive business and ought to be so declared, and the said Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London after due enquiry and consideration have determined to make an Order accordingly:

Now the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London in pursuance of the provisions of the above-mentioned Statute do by this Order declare that for the purposes of the said Statute the business of a slaughterer of poultry is an offensive business.
