**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of August, 1924 (N.P. (1) 414/1924), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas following the practice in the Army, it has been customary to charge the sum of 2s. 6d. a day against the full pay of Officers of Your Majesty's Royal Marines when maintained in Hospitals at the expense of the Crown:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, bearing date the 11th day of October, 1912, to direct that such charge should not be made for the first 42 days following the admission of a Royal Marine Officer to hospital:

“And whereas Your Majesty was further graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council, dated the 22nd day of January, 1920, and the 7th day of February, 1921, to direct that in regard to their emoluments during active service and on retirement, and in regard to the rules governing full pay sick leave, Officers of Your Majesty's Royal Marine Force should be treated in the same manner as Officers in Your Majesty's Navy:

“And whereas Officers of Your Majesty's Navy who may be admitted to hospital at the expense of the Crown are not subject to any charge for treatment or maintenance therein while they remain on full pay:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to direct that no charge shall be made against an Officer of Your Majesty's Royal Marines who may be maintained in hospital at the expense of the Crown so long as he remains on full pay, and that this rule shall have effect from the 7th day of February, 1921.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**WHEREAS** by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act), it is (among other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities, on account of the services of light-houses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of these establishments, and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (among other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the 12th day of March, 1923, in pursuance of the above recited powers the establishment which might be maintained by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioners) being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the amount of the salaries to be paid to the officers of the said establishment were duly fixed:

And whereas it is expedient that the establishment of the Commissioners should be varied in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such variation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Lighthouse Board (Variation of Establishment) Order, 1924.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the said Order in Council dated the 12th day of March, 1923, Mr. Ernest Graham, at present the holder of the post of Superintendent mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Order, may be paid as from the 1st day of February, 1924, an annual allowance of £100 over and above the scale of salary specified for that post in the said Schedule, such annual allowance to count as salary for the purpose of calculating the superannuation allowance or compensation to which he may be entitled on discharge or retirement. This annual allowance is authorised in view of the undesirability of revising the Superintendent's scale of salary at the present time, and in view of the important nature of the duties now performed by Mr. Graham.

3. As from the 1st day of February, 1924, the salary of Mr. John Vass, at present the holder of the post of Assistant Superintendent also mentioned in the said Schedule, shall be

£345 per annum rising thereafter by annual increments of £15 to the maximum of £450 per annum specified for that post in the said Schedule.

4. The salaries payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of June, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Saint Cuthbert, Blyth, in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle:

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Cuthbert, Blyth, is vested for an estate in fee simple in the Right Honourable Rosamond Cornelia Gwladys, Viscountess Ridley, and the Honourable Jasper Nicholas Ridley, of Number 440, Strand, London, W.C., as Trustees upon trust for that son of the late Right Honourable Matthew White, second Viscount Ridley, who at the death of the said Matthew White, second Viscount Ridley, should be his only or eldest son, if and when such son should attain the age of 25 years:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Matthew White, third Viscount Ridley, the only son of the said late Matthew White, second Viscount Ridley, attained the age of 21 years on the 16th day of December, 1923:

"And whereas the said Rosamond Cornelia Gwladys, Viscountess Ridley, and Jasper Nicholas Ridley are accordingly the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Rosamond Cornelia Gwladys, Viscountess Ridley, and Jasper

Nicholas Ridley, with the consent of the said Matthew White, third Viscount Ridley, are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Cuthbert, Blyth, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Newcastle for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Herbert Louis, now Bishop of Newcastle, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Herbert Louis, Bishop of Newcastle, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Cuthbert, Blyth, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Blyth:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Rosamond Cornelia Gwladys, Viscountess Ridley, and Jasper Nicholas Ridley, being the persons whose consents as Patrons are required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Matthew White, third Viscount Ridley (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Herbert Louis, Bishop of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Cuthbert, Blyth, shall be transferred to the said Herbert Louis, Bishop of Newcastle, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Herbert Louis, Bishop of Newcastle, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased

hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94; and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 10th day of July, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Buttershaw, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford:

"Whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the 2nd day of August, 1842, and being under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas, then Bishop of Ripon, a Particular District was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Paul, Buttershaw, situate in the Parish of Bradford, in the said County of York and at that time in the Diocese of Ripon, but now in the said Diocese of Bradford, and such Particular District was known as 'The Particular District of Saint Paul, Buttershaw':

"And whereas the said Particular District of Saint Paul, Buttershaw, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish, of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Buttershaw, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bradford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in

the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Buttershaw, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of Bradford which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Buttershaw.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Paul, Buttershaw, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford, being:—

"All that isolated portion of the Parish of Bradford, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north partly by the New Parish of Great Horton and partly by the New Parish of Saint Oswald, Chapel Green, Bradford, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Matthew, Bank Foot, upon the south-east by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Buttershaw, upon the south and upon the greater part of the west by the New Parish of Shelf, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Shelf from the said isolated portion of the Parish of Bradford at the point where Beacon Lane is joined by Gracy Lane, and extending thence northward and in a straight line in continuation of the middle of Gracy Lane for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said isolated portion of the Parish of Bradford from the said New Parish of Great Horton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bradford.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 31st day of July, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the Archdeaconry of York or the West Riding and the Archdeaconry of Cleveland, both in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of York or the West Riding, and Cleveland, are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Archiepiscopal Seal to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, the Parishes of Birkin and Haddlesey shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Pontefract, in the said Archdeaconry of York or the West Riding, to the Rural Deanery of Selby, in the same Archdeaconry; and secondly, a new Rural Deanery shall be formed within the said Archdeaconry of Cleveland and such new Rural Deanery shall be called 'The Rural Deanery of Gisborough' and shall comprise and consist of the Parishes or Cures of Boosbeck with Moorsholm; Brotton; Easington; Christ Church, East Coatham; Gisborough; Kirkleatham; Liverton; Lofthouse (otherwise Loftus); Marske in Cleveland (otherwise Marske by the Sea); Saint Peter, Redcar; Emmanuel, Saltburn by the Sea; Skelton in Cleveland; Upleatham; and Wilton, all at present in the Rural Deanery of Middlesbrough, in the said Archdeaconry of Cleveland; and each of the Parishes or Cures hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery to which it is



hereby transferred, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of York or the West Riding, and to the Archdeacon of Cleveland, and they have expressed their approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 31st day of July, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Easington, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Easington is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion

that the particular part of the said Parish of Easington which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by a certain Indenture bearing date on or about the 31st day of July, 1924, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856,' or some or one of them, between the Reverend George Algernon West, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Easington, of the first part, the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham, as Patron in right of his See, and also as the Ordinary of the said Rectory of the Parish of Easington, of the second part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the third part (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said George Algernon West did, with the consent of the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham, as such Bishop and also as such Patron as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors and when such District shall have become a New Parish then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish and to his successors for the time being, two perpetual clear yearly rent charges or net annual sums of £150 and £250 respectively to be payable quarterly on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in every year, free from and clear of all charges for First Fruits and Tenths and of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any) and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all that the said Rectory of the Parish of Easington and the Tithes or Tithe Commutation Rent Charges, Glebe Lands and hereditaments, and all other the endowments and emoluments for the time being to the said Rectory belonging, the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £150 to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the date of the licence of the first Minister of the said proposed District and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the said licence to the said quarterly day of payment, and the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £250 to be made on such of the said quarterly days of payment as shall happen next after the date of the said licence or after the date of the avoidance of the said Rectory of the Parish of Easington by the said George Algernon West whichever date shall be the later and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the last-mentioned date to the said quarterly day of payment:

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the original limits of the said Parish of Easington have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the

purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or of some or one of them, and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £150 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors, such grant to cease upon the date of the avoidance of the said Rectory of Easington by the said George Algernon West, and to be in lieu of the yearly sum of £120 at present payable out of the Common Fund hereinbefore mentioned towards the stipend of an Assistant Curate to be employed within the Easington Colliery District, in the said Parish of Easington:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £150 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the said two yearly rent charges of £150 and £250 respectively have been granted by the said George Algernon West as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said George Algernon West has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Durham as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"We, William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey the Parishes whereof contain respectively a population of One Hundred and sixty eight persons or thereabouts and One Hundred persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the respective Parish Churches for about One Hundred and about Ninety persons.

"The net annual value of the United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey is Two Hundred and sixty eight pounds or thereabouts.

"The Patrons of the United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey are Colonel Humphrey Dene and The Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain in right of the Crown and the Reverend Gilbert Vernon Yonge is the Incumbent thereof. The Patron of the Benefice of Alverdiscott is The Right Reverend The Lord Bishop of Exeter and the Reverend Arthur Hogarth Oak-Rhind is the Incumbent thereof.

#### "SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the said United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey and annex to the said Parish of Alverdiscott all that part of the United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey comprising the localities known as West Woodland, Woodland Cross, East Woodland and South Woodland the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance plan hereto annexed and edged with Pink.

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Alverdiscott shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from Horwood with Newton Tracey.

"That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Alverdiscott but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Churches of Horwood and Newton Tracey.

# THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

## COUNTY OF DEVON.

Notice is hereby given, that on the second day of August, 1924, the Minister of Transport made an Order, under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of certain highways in the County of Devon.

During the period of five years from the date on which this Order comes into force, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Third Schedule hereto any mechanically-propelled vehicle which has an unladen weight exceeding three tons or which has seats for more than twenty persons exclusive of the driver;

Nothing in the Order shall prevent the driving on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Schedules hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said roads") of—

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads; or

(iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said roads of any sewer, or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity;

Nothing in the Order shall prevent the driving on the highway in the Rural District of Totnes specified in the Third Schedule hereto of any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from Tuckenhay Paper Mills;

Nothing in the Order shall prevent the driving on the highway in the Rural District of Newton Abbot specified in the Third Schedule hereto of any vehicle which is being used by or on behalf of the Urban District Council of Newton Abbot in connection with their quarry situate near to that highway.

#### LOUTH CANAL ABANDONMENT.

IN THE MATTER of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888,  
and

IN THE MATTER of a Warrant of the Minister of Transport dated the 16th June, 1924, authorising the abandonment of the Louth Canal.

#### ORDER.

Whereas by Section 45 sub-section (1) of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, it is enacted that where on the application of any local authority it appears to the Board of Trade that any canal or part of a canal has for at least three years previously to the making of the application been disused for navigation or by reason of the default of the proprietors thereof has become unfit for navigation the Board of Trade may by warrant signed by their Secretary authorise the abandonment by the existing proprietors of such derelict canal; and after the granting of the warrant and the due publication as required by the Board of Trade of a notice of the granting thereof, the Board of Trade may make an order releasing the proprietors of the derelict canal from all liability to maintain the same canal, and from all statutory and other obligations in respect

thereof, or of or consequent on the abandonment thereof:

And whereas by Section 2 sub-section (1) of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, the powers of the Board of Trade in relation to canal undertakings were transferred to the Minister of Transport:

And whereas by public Acts of Parliament 3 Geo. III cap 39 and 9 Geo. IV cap 30 the Louth Navigation Commissioners were empowered to make and maintain a navigable canal from Louth in the County of Lincoln to Tetney in the said County, hereinafter referred to as "the Canal":

And whereas by a warrant dated the 16th June, 1924, and signed by an Assistant Secretary to the Ministry of Transport the Minister of Transport under the powers conferred on him by the said section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, authorised the abandonment of the Canal by the Louth Navigation Commissioners as proprietors thereof:

And whereas notice of the granting of the said warrant has been duly published as required by the Minister of Transport:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, the Minister of Transport does hereby order that the Louth Navigation Commissioners shall from the date hereof be released from all liability to maintain the Canal and from all obligations arising under the said Acts of 3 Geo. III cap 39 and 9 Geo. IV cap 30 or otherwise in respect thereof or of or consequent on the abandonment thereof.
