SECTION IV.

(a) In determining the piece-rate applicable no difference shall be made for quality.

(b) In all calculations the SHOTS shall be counted BY THE INCH.

(c) Fractions shall be dealt with as follows:—

<i>Fractions of One Shot—</i>	<i>Fractions of One Inch—</i>
Under $\frac{1}{4}$ shall NOT count.	Under $\frac{1}{2}$ inch shall NOT count.
$\frac{1}{4}$ and under $\frac{3}{4}$ shall count as $\frac{1}{2}$.	$\frac{1}{2}$ inch and over shall count as 1 inch.
$\frac{3}{4}$ and over shall count as 1.	

(d) Allowances shall be made for narrow cloth in wide looms as follows:—

(i) For looms up to and including a total reed space of 80 inches no allowance shall be made for cloth the yarn width of which (including selvages) in the reed is within 10 inches or 10 per cent. of the total reed space, whichever is the greater. If the yarn as measured within the reed (including selvages) is narrower than this, one-sixth of the total difference in inches between the yarn width and the total reed space shall be added to the cloth width.

(ii) For looms of a total reed space exceeding 80 inches no allowance shall be made for cloth the yarn width of which (including selvages) in the reed is within 10 inches or 10 per cent. of the total reed space, whichever is the greater. If the yarn as measured within the reed (including selvages) is narrower than this, one-sixth of the difference in inches between the yarn width on the one hand and the total reed space less 10 inches or 10 per

cent. (whichever is the greater) on the other hand, shall be added to the cloth width.

SECTION V.

THE GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES SPECIFIED IN SECTIONS I, II AND III OF THIS PART ARE SUBJECT TO PAYMENT OF THE FOLLOWING EXTRAS:—

(a) Where the weaver strips the cloth off the cloth pin, two per cent. (2 per cent.).

(b) Where the weaver ties on, 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per 100 threads.

(c) Where the weaver does any filing an extra, shall be paid to be mutually arranged between master and worker, provided that such extra shall be at not less than the appropriate minimum time rate fixed by the Trade Board.

(d) For Centre Selvages:—

If unsplit in the loom—
5 per cent. for the first centre selvage; and

3 per cent. for each centre selvage thereafter.

If split in the loom by the weaver—
A further 2 per cent. for each centre selvage so split.

(e) For coloured Stripes in the Warp:—

Up to 10 per cent. of coloured single jute threads, no extra.

For each additional 2 per cent. of coloured single jute threads or part thereof, 1 per cent. extra.

(f) For Heavy Wefts, to be paid under the following scale on the calculated weight of weft to give the required weight of cloth:—

8 porter in 16 reed, $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. extra;

and thereafter for every $\frac{1}{2}$ porter in excess of 8 porter, an additional $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

SECTION VI.

Long lengths—In linoleum goods no extra will be paid for these.

SECTION VII.

Where the number of threads in the warp is increased above the normal build for which payment is made, the width of cloth to be paid for shall be that which the threads would give if not crowded.

PART VI.

SECTION I.

FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES SET OUT IN THIS NOTICE:—

(a) A single loom weaver is a weaver who actually tends only one loom, other than a weaver of the class defined in (b) (ii) below;

(b) A double loom weaver is a weaver who—

(i) is actually tending two looms, or

(ii) regularly tends two looms, but who, owing to a stoppage of one of the looms, tends only one loom for an aggregate period not exceeding $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours in any one week, or for a continuous period not exceeding $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours;

(c) The STANDARD Fabric is $10\frac{1}{2}$ oz. 40 in. 11 porter 13 shots per inch when chested finished: Hessian;

(d) The STANDARD Length is 100 yards (36 inch measure) of yarn laid;

(e) The STANDARD Width is 40 inch of finished cloth.

SECTION II.

The work to which the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in this Notice are applicable includes the making good of weaving faults by the weaver, in accordance with the hitherto accepted practice of the trade, and the other usual duties performed by the weaver, such as keeping the loom clean and removing the waste from it.

SECTION III.

The above General Minimum Piece-Rates apply to the weaving of all Hessian, floor-cloth and linoleum goods, other than those woven in looms the reed space of which is 32 inches or narrower.

PART VII.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE.

SECTION I.

FOR ALL FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK IN GREAT BRITAIN—

except (a) Spinners of the classes to whom the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Sections II, III and IV of Part II of this Schedule are applicable;

(b) Workers employed on Hessian Weaving (as defined in Section III of Part VI of this Schedule) in the areas of Aberdeen, Barrow-in-Furness, Dundee and Tayport (as defined in Part VIII of this Schedule);

and (c) Weavers employed on the weaving of sacking, bagging, or tarpaulin in the areas of Dundee and Aberdeen (as defined in Part VIII of this Schedule):

$7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

SECTION II.

In cases where a female worker, to whom the above Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applies, is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour to an ORDINARY WORKER, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART VIII.

DEFINITION OF AREAS.

For the purposes of this Notice, the Areas of Aberdeen, Barrow-in-Furness, Dundee and Tayport comprise respectively:—

(a) the MUNICIPAL BURGH OF ABERDEEN;

(b) the COUNTY BOROUGH OF BARROW-IN-FURNESS;

(c) the AREA OF DUNDEE, *viz.*, the Municipal Burgh of Dundee and the Parish of Liff and Benvie, the Parish of Mains and Strathmartine, the Parish of Dundee and that Part of the Parish of Monifieth which lies south and west of Dighty Water; and

(d) the AREA OF TAYPORT, *viz.*, the Burgh of Tayport and the Parish of Ferry-Port-on-Craig.

PART IX.

OVERTIME RATES.

NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS.

SECTION I.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE to be as follows:—

IN ANY WEEK	48
ON ANY DAY (OTHER THAN SATURDAY)	$8\frac{1}{2}$
ON SATURDAY	$4\frac{1}{2}$

Provided that all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

OVERTIME RATES.

SECTION II.

A.—MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of time worked by Male or Female workers EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the Trade shall be as follows:—

(a) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable as specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

(b) For Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable as specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(c) For all time worked in any week, in excess of 48 hours, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable as specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF, except where a higher amount is payable under Sub-Section (a) of this Part of this Section.

(d) The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds $8\frac{1}{2}$, or in the case of Saturday exceeds $4\frac{1}{2}$, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

B.—MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK TO WHICH THE GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES ARE NOT APPLICABLE.

A piece-worker employed on work to which the General Minimum Piece-Rates specified in this Schedule are not applicable shall, in respect of time worked in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade, as declared by the Trade Board and set out in Section I of this Part, receive, in addition to piece-rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case to an *ordinary* worker, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate (or where no Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate is applicable, the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate), an amount equal to one-half of, or the full amount of, the General Minimum Time-Rate which would have been applicable to the worker if the worker had been employed on time-work, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on time-work were Time-and-a-half or Double-Time.

C.—FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK TO WHICH THE GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES ARE APPLICABLE.

A female piece-worker employed on work to which the General Minimum Piece-Rates specified in this Schedule are applicable shall, in respect of time worked in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade, as declared by the Trade Board and set out in Section I of this Part, receive, in addition to the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rates, an amount equal to one-half of, or the full amount of, the General Minimum Time-Rate which would have been applicable to the worker if she had been employed on time-work, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on time-work were Time-and-a-half or Double-Time.

SPECIAL AREAS.

SECTION III.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule:—

(i) In the case of those classes of workers in the Municipal Burgh of Brechin, the Parish of Brechin, the Municipal Burgh of Forfar, the Parish of Forfar, the Burgh of Kirriemuir, the Parish of Kirriemuir, the Parishes of Blairgowrie and Rattray, the Burgh of Carnoustie or

the Parish of Logie Pert, who in accordance with the established practice of the establishment attend for nine hours per day on five days of the week and for three hours on Saturday, the appropriate Overtime Rate specified in Section II of this Part shall not be payable in respect of the first quarter of an hour in excess of $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, but shall be payable in respect of all time worked on any such day in excess of nine hours.

(ii) In the case of those classes of workers in the area specified in Sub-section (i) of this Section who, in accordance with the established practice of the establishment attend only on five days a week, the appropriate Overtime Rate specified in Section II of this Part shall not be payable in respect of the first three-quarters of an hour in excess of $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, but shall be payable on any such day in respect of all time worked in excess of $9\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

PART X.

The respective Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, that is to say:— The preparing, spinning or weaving (a) of jute or (b) of jute and any other fibre, except flax or hemp;

Including:—

- (1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage; and
- (2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work; but

Excluding:—

- (1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and
- (2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles, when such preparing or spinning is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and
- (3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also
- (4) The weaving of carpets, rugs or mats.

PART XI.

The above minimum rates of wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorized by any Act to be made

from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

NOTE.—The employment of women, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, and the Education Act, 1921.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the Jute Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Piece-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates for certain classes of Male Weavers in Great Britain, and TO VARY the Overtime Rates and General Minimum Time-Rates at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's Notice J. (35) dated 26th September, 1924, in their application to such workers, the proposed minimum rates being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES FOR MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON HESSIAN WEAVING (AS HEREINAFTER DEFINED).

SECTION I.

The proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates to apply to Male Workers employed on Hessian Weaving in any part of Great Britain shall be the General Minimum Piece-Rates at present fixed for female workers employed on Hessian Weaving as set out in Parts V and VI of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J. (35) dated 26th September, 1924.

SECTION II.

The proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates shall apply to the weaving of all Hessian, floor-cloth and linoleum goods, other than those woven in looms the reed space of which is 32 inches or narrower.

PART II.

PROPOSED GUARANTEED TIME-RATES AND PROPOSED VARIATION OF GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR THE CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS FOR WHOM GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES ARE PROPOSED IN PART I OF THIS SCHEDULE.

SECTION II.

The above proposed guaranteed time-rates and general minimum time-rates are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate adjustment according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION III.

A male worker employed on piece-work on work to which the General Minimum Piece-rates proposed in Part I of this Schedule are applicable must be paid at not less than the appropriate Guaranteed Time-rate in any case where his earnings on piece-work are less than such sum.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR THE CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS FOR WHOM GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES ARE PROPOSED IN PART I OF THIS SCHEDULE.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part IX of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J. (35) dated 26th September, 1924, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all time worked by male workers of the classes specified in this Notice in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Part IX of the Schedule to the said Notice J. (35) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART IV.

The respective Proposed Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain on Hessian Weaving (as defined in Part I of this Schedule) in the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, and set out in Part X of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J. (35) dated 26th September, 1924.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 30th September, 1924. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD REGULATIONS,
1924, DATED 27TH SEPTEMBER, 1924, MADE BY
THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND
FISHERIES UNDER THE AGRICULTURAL WAGES
(REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

1. The Agricultural Wages Board for England and Wales shall consist of twenty-one members, of whom five shall be appointed members, eight shall be members representing employers and eight shall be members representing workers in agriculture.

2. The members representing employers shall be nominated by the Council of the National Farmers' Union, and the members representing workers in agriculture shall be nominated by the Executive Committee of the National Union of Agricultural Workers and by the General Executive Committee of the Workers' Union respectively, in such proportions as those Committees may agree, or if those Committees fail to agree before the expiration of fourteen days from the date on which these Regulations are made, in such proportions as the Minister may determine. If the Council or either of the said Committees fails to nominate by such date as the Minister may direct its full number of members, he may fill the vacancy or vacancies so caused by nominating one or more persons whom he may consider to be fit and proper for that purpose, to act as members of the Board.

3. Any member who, in the opinion of the Minister, fails without reasonable cause to attend one half of the total number of meetings in a year of office shall, if so directed by the Minister, cease to be a member of the Board.

4. The Council, Executive Committee or Minister may, by notice to the Secretary of the Board and the member affected, terminate the membership of a person nominated or appointed by the Council, Executive Committee or Minister, as the case may be, if, in the opinion of the Council, Executive Committee or Minister there is good and sufficient cause for such termination.

5. The following provisions shall regulate the retirement of the first members of the Committee:—

(1) At the end of one year from the date of the establishment of the Board, one-third (or if one-third is not an integral number, the nearest integral number not exceeding one-third) of the appointed members (other than the Chairman) of the members representing employers and of the members representing workers, in each case to be chosen by lot, shall retire from the Board.

(2) At the end of two years from such date one-half (or if one-half is not an integral

number, the nearest integral number not exceeding one-half) of the remainder of the first appointed members (other than the Chairman) of the first members representing employers and of the first members representing workers, in each case to be chosen by lot, shall retire from the Board.

(3) For the purpose of this Regulation a person nominated or appointed to fill a casual vacancy among the first members shall be deemed to be a first member.

6.—(1) Subject to the provisions of the foregoing Regulations the term of office of a member (other than the Chairman) shall be three years, provided that:—

(a) any member may retire by notice in writing to the Secretary of the Board;

(b) a member nominated or appointed to fill a casual vacancy shall act only for the unexpired portion of the term of office of his predecessor; and

(c) a member whose term of office expires shall continue to act until a successor is nominated or appointed.

(2) The term of office of the Chairman shall be such as the Minister may determine.

7. Any person whose term of office expires shall be eligible to be re-appointed or re-nominated as a member of the Board.

8. In order to constitute a meeting of the Board there must be present at least one appointed member and the members present must be at least one-third of the whole number of the members constituting the Board.

9. The Board may, with the sanction of the Minister, appoint one or more sub-committees consisting of one or more members representing employers and workers in agriculture respectively in equal proportions and of one or more appointed members. The term of office of a member of a sub-committee shall be such period, not exceeding one year, as the Board may determine. The Secretary of the Board shall act as the Secretary of any sub-committee.

10. The Secretary of the Board shall convene meetings of the Board by notice in writing to each member at such times as the Chairman shall direct and also whenever the Secretary shall receive a requisition for convening a meeting signed by seven members of the Board. The place at which a meeting shall be held shall be determined by the Minister or with his sanction by the Chairman.

11. Every member of the Board or a committee of the Board shall have one vote. If at any meeting of the Board or a committee the number of members present representing employers and workers respectively is unequal, the Chairman or other person presiding shall require the side which is in the majority to arrange that one or more of their members shall refrain from voting, so as to preserve equality. The Chairman, or other person presiding, shall in the event of an equal division have a second or casting vote. In the absence of the Chairman at any meeting of the Board an appointed member selected by the members present at the meeting shall preside.

12.—(1) The Board, if so requested by a resolution of the representative members of an agricultural wages committee, shall perform

any duty or exercise any power of the Committee under Part II of the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924.

(2) Where any committees have failed to perform any duty imposed on them by Part II of the said Regulations within the time fixed by a notice given by the Minister to the committee under such Regulations, the Board, on being notified of such default by the Minister, shall perform the duty.

(3) Where the Board act under this Regulation instead of a committee the provisions of Part II of the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924, except as regards the time within which the Order may be required to be made, shall apply for such purpose as if herein incorporated with the substitution of the Board for the committee.

13. Notice of an order for the purpose of carrying out a decision of a committee as to the making, cancellation or variation of a rate of wages, or of an order by the Board fixing, cancelling or varying a rate of wages, shall be given in such manner as the Minister shall in each case direct.

14. Notice of any proposal to make, cancel or vary any rate of wages, and of the manner in which and the time within which objections to the proposal may be lodged, shall be given in such manner as the Minister shall in each case direct.

15. Expressions in these Regulations shall have the same meaning as in the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924.

16. The Board shall be known under the title of "The Agricultural Wages Board."

17. Any question upon the construction or interpretation of these Regulations shall in the event of dispute be referred to the Minister for decision.

18. These Regulations may be cited as the AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD REGULATIONS, 1924.

**BULB DISEASES (ISLES OF SCILLY)
ORDER OF 1924.**

(DATED 25TH SEPTEMBER, 1924.)

(D.I.P. 540.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, orders as follows:—

Importation of Daffodil and Narcissus Bulbs.

1.—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in Article one of the Bulb Diseases (Isles of Scilly) Order of 1923, it shall be lawful for Daffodil or Narcissus bulbs to be landed in the Isles of Scilly provided that each package or consignment has attached thereto or is accompanied by a licence issued by an Inspector of

the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries authorising the bulbs to be so landed.

(2) It shall be a condition of any such licence that the bulbs shall be consigned to the Director, Bulb Treating Station, St. Mary's, Isles of Scilly, and when received shall be there immersed for a period of three hours in water retained at a temperature of 110° F.

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, and may be cited as the BULB DISEASES (ISLES OF SCILLY) ORDER OF 1924.

The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.
