## A PROCLAMATION

FOR DISSOLVING THE PRESENT PARLIAMENT, AND  
DECLARING THE CALLING OF ANOTHER.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliament which stands prorogued to Friday, the Thirty-first day of October next: We do, for that End, publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their Meeting and Attendance on the said Friday, the Thirty-first day of October next: And We being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet Our People, and to have their Advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects Our Royal Will and Pleasure to call a new Parliament: And do hereby further declare, that, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, We have given Order that Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain and Our Governor of Northern Ireland do respectively, upon Notice thereof, forthwith issue out Writs, in due Form and according to Law, for calling a new Parliament: And We do hereby

also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, require Writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by Our said Chancellor and Governor respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons who are to serve in the said Parliament to be duly returned to, and give their Attendance in, Our said Parliament on Tuesday, the Eighteenth day of November next, which Writs are to be returnable in due course of Law.

## A PROCLAMATION

IN ORDER TO THE ELECTING AND SUMMONING THE  
SIXTEEN PEERS OF SCOTLAND.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on Tuesday, the Eighteenth day of November next ensuing the date hereof: In order, there-

fore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood House, in Edinburgh, on Monday, the Third day of November next, at Twelve o'clock Noon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Clerk Register and the Principal Clerk of the Session appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to take the Votes of the said Peers, and immediately after such Election made and duly examined to certify the Names of the Sixteen Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial care to preserve the Peace thereof during the time of the said Election, and to prevent all manner of Riots, Tumults, Disorders, and Violence whatsoever: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Ten Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920.

(10 & 11 Geo. 5, c. 46).

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1898, that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, after the expiration of forty days from this date, to make Regulations under Sections 3 and 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5, c. 46), amending the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921 (S.R. & O., 1921, No. 864), and the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921 and 1923 (S.R. & O., 1921, No. 865 and S.R. & O., 1923, No. 312).

The effect of the new Regulations is to prohibit the diversion of consignments of raw opium and dangerous drugs passing through ports in Great Britain to destinations different from those to which the consignments were licensed from the country of export; and to modify in the case of prescriptions issued on National Health Insurance forms the requirements to be observed before a prescription for dangerous drugs is dispensed.

DRAFT OF A SPECIAL ORDER TO BE MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR UNDER THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, VARYING THE SPECIAL ORDER FOR THE ROPE, TWINE AND NET TRADE MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR, UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, DATED 11TH JULY, 1919.

Whereas the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as the Minister) by a Special Order called the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, dated the 11th day of July, 1919, applied the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Special Order.

And whereas it is provided by Sub-Section 1 of Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Special Order.

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable to vary the said Special Order by altering the description of the trade specified in the Appendix thereto.

Now, therefore, the Minister by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, and of any other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes a Special Order varying the said Special Order:—

1. The following new paragraph shall be inserted in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, after paragraph 4 and immediately preceding paragraph 5, that is to say:—

“ 4. (a) The mending, refitting and re-conditioning of drift, seine or similar nets including all processes (whether similar to the foregoing or not) incidental thereto.”

2. This Order may be cited as the TRADE BOARDS (ROPE, TWINE AND NET AND DRIFT NETS) ORDER, 1924

## SPECIAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR THE SITUATION OF WRITING ASSISTANT IN CERTAIN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

1. Candidates must be not less than 18 years of age on the first day of July, 1924. A candidate born on 1st July, 1906, would be admitted. A candidate who becomes eligible for the offer of an appointment on the result of this examination will be assigned for unpensionable service if she has attained the age of 50 at the date of the examination. No offer of appointment will be made to any candidate after she has reached the age of 60.

No exception on any grounds will be made to this rule.

2. In order to be eligible a candidate must either—

(a) Have been serving on the 31st May, 1924, in a British Government Department or in one of the War Department, Admiralty or Air Ministry Establishments and have rendered not less than six months' approved service in a temporary clerical post in any such Department or Establishment, or such Departments or Establishments, prior to that date, or

(b) have rendered not less than six months' approved service in a temporary clerical capacity in any such Department or Establishment, or such Departments or Establishments, between the 1st September, 1923, and the 31st May, 1924.

Established Civil Servants are not eligible to compete.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

(a) That they are unmarried or widows;

(b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father also a natural-born British subject.
