A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by Our Royal Proclamation of the ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, dissolving the late Parliament, We did require Writs to be issued by Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, and Our Governor of Northern Ireland respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons who are to serve in the new Parliament to be duly returned to, and give their attendance in, Our said Parliament on the eighteenth day of November instant, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament

be prorogued from the said eighteenth day of November instant, to which it now stands summoned, to Tuesday, the second day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons are discharged from their meeting and attendance on the said eighteenth day of November instant.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this tenth day of *November*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and in the fifteenth year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 28th day of October, 1924 (C.W. 11834/23), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable

in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

" And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 19th day of May, 1898, and the 4th day of July, 1908, provision is made for the grant to Officers of Your Majesty's Navy, subject to certain conditions and during certain limited periods, of sick leave on full pay:

" And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 19th day of July, 1918, to approve, *inter alia*, of Officers of the Royal Navy being eligible at our discretion for full pay sick leave for a period not exceeding twelve months when the disability or sickness is certified to be beyond the Officer's own control, provided that there be a reasonable probability of return to duty, and to provide that this Regulation should have effect at our discretion until a date not exceeding twelve months after the cessation of the Hostilities then in progress:

" And whereas Your Majesty was further graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, bearing date the 7th day of February, 1921, to approve of Officers of Your Majesty's Royal Marines being treated on the same lines as Officers of Your Majesty's Navy for purposes of full pay sick leave:

" And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to make certain alterations in the Regulations governing the grant of full pay sick leave to Officers of Your Majesty's Navy and Royal Marines:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the Regulations contained in the accompanying schedule, with effect from the dates stated therein.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

" FULL PAY SICK LEAVE.

" 1. The following Regulations to apply to all Officers of the Royal Navy, including Warrant Officers, Officers promoted from Warrant rank, and Officers on the Supplementary List, and to Officers of the Royal Marines.

" 2. Any Officer who, while borne on the books of one of Your Majesty's Ships or Royal Marine Divisions for full pay, becomes unfit for service at home or abroad to be eligible to be awarded full pay sick leave as follows, provided there is a reasonable probability of his ultimate return to duty:—

(i) In ordinary cases—a maximum of 12 months reckoned from the date checked sick, whether at home or abroad.

(ii) In special cases, e.g., disability due to service in an unhealthy climate, or to Active War Service, or to bodily injuries sustained on duty in respect of which a Hurt Certificate has been issued, at Admiralty discretion—a maximum of 18 months, reckoned from the date checked sick, whether at home or abroad.

" 3. Officers found permanently unfit for general service to be placed forthwith on the Retired List, provided that, in the following special cases, a grant or an extension of full pay sick leave from the date of the Medical report certifying that a reasonable probability of ultimate fitness for duty no longer exists may be made at Admiralty discretion, each case being considered on its merits; the period to be limited to a maximum of three months, and by the date on which the Officer would normally have ceased to be entitled to full pay by reason of having:—

(i) reached the limit of full pay sick leave admissible under the ordinary Regulations:

(ii) completed the full period of his Active Service engagement (for an Officer entered for Short Service):

(iii) reached the age limit for compulsory retirement (for a permanent Officer).

Grants or extensions of full pay sick leave under the conditions prescribed in this clause to be limited to:—

(a) Officers whose illness is certified to be attributable to the Service:

(b) Officers suffering from tuberculosis or insanity where the disease, although not "attributable" is certified as being "aggravated" by the Service.

" 4. Disability due to causes within an Officer's own control to be treated, subject to Admiralty discretion, as ordinary sickness for the purpose of clause 2 (i) of these Regulations.

" 5. Article 1352, King's Regulations and Admiralty instructions, providing for the issue of full pay or its equivalent to Officers wounded during such time as they shall be lying under cure, or up to a limit of eighteen calendar months, to be cancelled; such cases to be dealt with under the Regulations contained in this Schedule.

" 6. Article 1353, King's Regulations and Admiralty instructions, providing for the extension of the full pay or its equivalent of Officers injured on duty or suffering from insanity resulting from an act of duty or from extraordinary exposure or exertion on duty, to be cancelled; such cases to be dealt with under the Regulations contained in this Schedule.

" 7. Subject to the exceptions specified in clause 8, the Regulations and provisions contained in this schedule to take effect as follows:—

(i) Extension of the ordinary period of full pay sick leave up to 12 months: from 1st September, 1922.

(ii) All other provisions: from 19th July, 1923.

" 8. The application of the foregoing Regulations to Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank and Warrant Officers to take effect from the date of this Order, and the cancellation of the former Regulation to be without prejudice to any Officer entitled to the receipt of benefits thereunder on the date he fell sick who may have continued on the sick list after the introduction of the new Regulations.

" 9. Officers who contract disabilities whilst on Unemployed Pay, whether at the Full Pay, Intermediate or Half Pay rate, to be ineligible for full pay sick leave."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

“And whereas we consider it undesirable that Retaining Fees should be issued to such Officers during the continuance of their disabilities:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:—

“1. Officers of the Special Reserve of Engineer Officers, Royal Navy, who may be awarded pensions by the Ministry of Pensions in respect of disability due to or aggravated by service during the great war, to be excused training, and payment of Retaining Fee to be suspended, for such time as they continue to draw disability pensions.

“2. Such Officers to be retained in the Special Reserve of Engineer Officers, Royal

Navy, at the discretion of the Admiralty, for a period not exceeding three years from the date of commencement of payment of the disability pension, at the end of which time any Officers still drawing disability pensions to be removed from the Reserve.

“Your Majesty's Minister of Pensions has signified his concurrence in the above proposals.”

“And whereas under these Regulations Officers of the Special Reserve, Royal Marines, are entitled, subject to the fulfilment of certain conditions, to Retaining Fees in respect of each completed year of service:

“And whereas we consider it neither necessary nor advisable to remove Officers from the Special Reserve, Royal Marines, who may be granted temporary pensions by the Ministry of Pensions in respect of disability due to or aggravated by service during the great war, but who may nevertheless not be permanently unfit for further service:

“And whereas we consider it undesirable that Retaining Fees should be issued to such Officers during the continuance of their disabilities:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:—

“1. Officers of the Special Reserve, Royal Marines, who may be awarded pensions by the Ministry of Pensions in respect

of disability due to or aggravated by service during the great war, to be excused training, and payment of Retaining Fee to be suspended, for such time as they continue to draw disability pensions.

" 2. Such Officers to be retained in the Special Reserve, Royal Marines, at the discretion of the Admiralty, for a period not exceeding three years from the date of commencement of payment of the disability pension, at the end of which time any Officers still drawing disability pensions to be removed from the Reserve, provided that Officers who have drawn such pensions for a period of three years or more and are still in the Reserve at the date of this Order in Council shall be removed as from that date.

" Your Majesty's Minister of Pensions has signified his concurrence in the above proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

" Whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 27th day of May, 1915, a Scheme of pensions, grants and allowances in the nature thereof was framed in pursuance of Section 1 of the Injuries in War (Compensation) Act, 1914, for the benefit of persons, not being Officers or Seamen of the Royal Navy, or Officers or Soldiers of any of Your Majesty's Land or Marine Forces, in respect of injury or disablement whilst employed afloat by, or under, the Admiralty or Army Council, in connection with warlike operations in which Your Majesty was then engaged, and in the case of their death for the benefit of their widows and other dependants :

" And whereas by Orders of Your Majesty in Council bearing dates the 8th day of June, 1916, the 11th day of March, 1920, the 3rd day of December, 1920, and the 31st day of October, 1921, the said Scheme was modified in certain respects :

" And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable further to vary the said Scheme :

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by your Order in Council, to direct that the Regulations appearing in the Schedule attached hereto shall be deemed to be incorporated in the above cited Orders in Council dated the 27th day of May, 1915, the 8th day of June,

1916, the 11th day of March, 1920, the 3rd day of December, 1920, and the 31st day of October, 1921, and that any provision of the said Orders which is inconsistent with the Regulations attached hereto shall be void and of no effect, without prejudice however to the validity of any award thereunder made prior to the date of this Order.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

" 1. INJURY AND DISABLEMENT PENSIONS.

" As from the 1st October, 1923, it shall be lawful, in cases where partial incapacity subsists, for the Admiralty or Army Council to award allowances in respect of children who were existing at the time of the injury or disablement at rates equivalent to the following percentages of the allowances laid down in the Orders in Council dated the 3rd day of December, 1920, and the 31st day of October, 1921, for children in cases where total incapacity subsists :—

Material impairment of earning capacity—
75 per cent.
Impairment of earning capacity—50 per cent.
Slight impairment of earning capacity—
25 per cent.

" 2. PENSIONS TO WIDOWS, CHILDREN AND OTHER DEPENDANTS.

" As from the 1st October, 1923, the pension or allowance which may be granted to the widow, child or other dependant of a deceased person shall bear such ratio to the full award which might otherwise have been made as the percentage representing the degree to which the death of the person resulted from an injury sustained on duty or from sickness specifically attributable to the nature and conditions of the employment, bears to one hundred.

" Provided that it shall not be lawful for the Admiralty or Army Council to award a pension or allowance in any such case to a widow, child or other dependant unless the death of the person resulted to the extent of not less than fifty per cent. from such injury or sickness.

" 3. GENERAL.

" In order to meet the needs in exceptional cases which are not covered by the normal regulations it shall be lawful for the Admiralty or Army Council at their discretion and subject to the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury, to make grants at rates and under circumstances other than those laid down in the Order in Council dated the 27th day of May, 1915, as modified by the Orders in Council dated the 8th day of June, 1916, the 11th day of March, 1920, the 3rd day of December, 1920, the 31st day of October, 1921, and this Order."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas it is provided by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas His late Majesty's Order in Council dated the 26th day of September, 1901, sanctioned the grant of pensions to widows and allowances to children of Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men of the Royal Navy and Marines and of the Reserve Forces whose deaths are attributable to warlike operations:

“And whereas His late Majesty's Orders in Council dated the 9th day of October, 1903, and the 20th day of March, 1905, sanctioned provision being made to supplement from Naval Funds the pensions, allowances and gratuities awarded from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to widows, children and other dependent relatives of Seamen and Marines whose deaths are attributable to the Service other than during warlike operations:

“And whereas the powers and duties of the Admiralty with regard to such pensions and grants which were transferred to the Ministry of Pensions under Section 2, Sub-section (1) (a) of the Ministry of Pensions Act, 1916, have, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1, Sub-sections (1) and (4) of the War Pensions Act, 1920, been re-transferred to the Admiralty as from the 1st day of October, 1921, that is as from the thirtieth day after the date of the termination of the Great War which date was, by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the 10th day of August, 1921, declared to be the 31st day of August, 1921:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the scales and conditions of awards of pensions and gratuities to the widows and of allowances to the children and certain other dependent relatives of Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men of the Royal Navy and Marines and of the Reserve Forces whose deaths occur and are directly attributable to the conditions of service subsequent to the 30th day of September, 1921, should be as set out in the annexed Schedule and that the cost of such pensions, gratuities and allowances should be defrayed entirely out of Naval Funds:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to empower us at our discretion to make awards on the scales and under the conditions contained in the said Schedule, and to order that any awards already

made on the scales and under the conditions contained in the said Schedule shall have the same validity as if they were awards made under Your Order.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“ SCHEDULE.

“REGULATIONS FOR THE AWARD OF PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES TO WIDOWS AND ALLOWANCES TO CHILDREN AND CERTAIN OTHER DEPENDENT RELATIVES OF PETTY OFFICERS, NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE ROYAL NAVY AND MARINES AND OF THE RESERVE FORCES.

“1. Pensions may be granted to the Widows and allowances to the Children and certain other dependent relatives of deceased Petty Officers Non-commissioned Officers and men of the Royal Navy and Marines and of the Reserve Forces at the rates and subject to the conditions set out in the following paragraphs. A deceased Petty Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer or man is hereinafter referred to as a Seaman or Marine.

“2. These Regulations will take effect as from 1st October, 1921, but will not apply in any case where it is proved that the death of the Seaman or Marine is attributable to service during the period of the Great War in which event his family will be eligible for consideration under Ministry of Pensions Regulations instead of under these Regulations. For this purpose ‘the period of the Great War’ is to be read as meaning the period beginning on 4th August, 1914, and ending on 30th September, 1921.

“3. The grant of a pension or allowance under these Regulations will only be allowable provided that the Seaman or Marine was killed or drowned in the service of the Crown or died as the result of wound, injury or disease, directly attributable to the conditions of service and that the death occurred within seven years after he was wounded or injured, or after he was first removed from duty on account of the disease.

“4. A pension, gratuity, or allowance under these Regulations cannot be claimed as a right. It will not be granted when the applicant is shown to be unworthy of a grant from public funds, nor will it be granted unless the service of the deceased Seaman or Marine has been such as, in the opinion of the Admiralty, to justify the award.

“5. If the applicant is granted any other pension or allowance from the public, on account of the services of the Seaman or Marine in any other public capacity, the grant permissible under these Regulations shall be reduced by the amount of such pension or allowance.

“6. Subject to any exception which the Admiralty may approve in a particular case, a grant under these Regulations will not be made to a widow who was separated from her husband at the time of his death. Should such exception be approved, the grant made will be at such rate within the scales laid down in these Regulations and subject to such conditions as the Admiralty may determine.

“7. If a Seaman's or Marine's death or the wound, injury or disease which resulted in his death was due wholly or in part to his own

negligence or misconduct or to any cause within his control, any grant which might otherwise have been made under these Regulations to his widow or other relative may be withheld or reduced in amount at the discretion of the Admiralty.

" 8. If a Seaman or Marine is killed or dies in such circumstances that any grant is payable in respect of him under these Regulations, and his widow, child, or dependent relative receives compensation from or on behalf of a third party for the act, omission, or circumstances which caused the death, any such compensation may be taken into consideration in assessing any grant which might be made under these Regulations; and if the compensation is received after assessment, it may be taken into consideration and the assessment may be amended or cancelled accordingly.

" 9. Any pension or allowance granted under these Regulations will be discontinued should the recipient subsequently prove to be unworthy of it or should the conditions which justified the grant no longer be fulfilled. Any assignment, sale or contract relating to a pension, allowance or gratuity is void.

" 10. A grant under these Regulations will not be made if the claim thereto fails to be established before the death of the person to whom it might have been made and such failure is due to neglect or omission on the part of such person or, in the case of a person not of adult age, on the part of his or her guardian or other representative.

" 11. If a person who is in receipt of a pension or allowance under these Regulations is granted parish relief, or is admitted to an institution which is supported wholly or in part at the expense of the rates or public funds, the pension or allowance may be applied in whole or in part towards satisfying the claims of the parish authorities in respect of parish relief and so much of the pension or allowance as would otherwise be payable in respect of the period of maintenance in the institution may be withheld or reduced in amount at the discretion of the Admiralty or administered in such manner as the Admiralty may determine.

" 12. The date of commencement of any pension or allowance granted under these Regulations will be as the Admiralty may determine in each case. In fixing the date account will be taken of any delay on the part of the widow or other relative in applying for such pension or allowance.

" Subject to the foregoing, the date of commencement will be, as a rule, the date following the date of the Seaman's or Marine's death or, if later, the date following that to which any marriage allowance to his family, has been paid.

" *Widows.*

" 13. The scale of pensions to widows of Seamen and Marines will be as follows:—

" 14. The following additions to the rates of pension laid down in paragraph 13 may be made in respect of rating or rank held by the deceased Seaman or Marine:—

" 15. A pension will not be granted if the Seaman or Marine married after he received the wound or injury or after he was removed from duty on account of the disease from which he died.

" 16. If a widow who has been granted a pension under these Regulations re-marries, her pension will cease on the date of her re-marriage, but she may then be granted a gratuity equal to one year's pension. This grant will be subject to such conditions as to payment as the Admiralty may determine and will be in full discharge of all claims.

" *Children.*

" 17. Compassionate Allowances may be granted to the legitimate children under the age of 16 of a deceased Seaman or Marine whose widow is awarded a pension under these Regulations or would, if she had been living at the time of the Seaman's or Marine's death, have been eligible for such pension.

" 18. If the mother is living, compassionate allowances under paragraph 17 will be at the rate of 5s. a week for each child. The corresponding rate for motherless children will be 10s. a week.

" 19. These allowances will not, as a rule, be paid to or in respect of children over the age of 16. At the discretion of the Admiralty, however, they may be granted or continued after that age in the case of a child who is an apprentice receiving not more than nominal wages or who is being educated at a secondary school, technical school or university.

" 20. They may also be granted or continued between the ages of 16 and 21 in the case of a child incapable through mental or bodily infirmity of earning a living, provided the infirmity existed before the child attained the age of 16.

" 21. If pension to a widow be withheld or discontinued on grounds of unworthiness, her children, if otherwise eligible for compassionate allowance and if removed from her control, may at the discretion of the Admiralty be granted such allowance at the rate appropriate to motherless children.

" 22. Children's Allowances will not be issuable for any period during which the children are maintained in the Royal Navy, the Army or the Royal Air Force.

" *Parents.*

" 23. The parent or parents of a Seaman or Marine who died in circumstances which would have rendered his widow, had he been married, eligible for a pension under these Regulations, may be granted an allowance at such rate not exceeding 7s. 6d. a week if there is one parent and not exceeding 10s. a week if there are two, as the Admiralty may decide, provided:—

" (i) that the Seaman or Marine did not leave a widow or legitimate child.

" (ii) that the parent or parents were largely dependent on the Seaman or Marine at the time of his death;

" (iii) that their pecuniary and other circumstances are such as, in the opinion of the Admiralty, would justify the grant.

" 24. On the parent, or one of the parents, attaining the age of 60, or if one of them is seriously incapacitated by ill-health the allowance may be increased to such rate, not exceeding 10s. a week if there is one parent, and not exceeding 12s. 6d. a week if there are two, as the Admiralty may decide.

" 25. An allowance granted to the parent or parents of a Seaman or Marine will not be transferable except that if made to two parents it may be continued to the survivor at the rate appropriate to his or her age and state of health.

" 26. A parent's allowance will cease on the re-marriage of the grantee.

" *Brothers and Sisters.*

" 27. The brothers and sisters of a Seaman or Marine who died in circumstances which would have rendered his widow, had he been married, eligible for a pension under these Regulations may, collectively, be granted an allowance at such rate not exceeding 10s. a week and not exceeding 5s. a week for any one brother or sister as the Admiralty may decide, provided:—

" (1) that the Seaman or Marine did not leave a widow, legitimate child, or parent;

" (2) that the brothers and sisters were largely dependent on the deceased Seaman or Marine at the time of his death; and

" (3) that their pecuniary and other circumstances are such as, in the opinion of the Admiralty, would justify the grant.

" 28. Allowances granted to the brothers and sisters of Seamen or Marines will be subject to the same age limits and rules as to continuance and cessation as those laid down in this Schedule for the compassionate allowances of children, except that the special grant or extension provided for in paragraph 19 will not be admissible."

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.

" And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice of Lydden when the unions which are hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Lydden and such house will accordingly become the Parsonage House of the United Benefice of Lydden :

" And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of River with Guston, Temple Ewell and Lydden now belongs to one and the same Patron :

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say :

" 1. That a portion of the said Benefice of Temple Ewell that is to say the western portion (containing no Church) of the said Benefice and Parish of Temple Ewell (all which portion is more particularly set out and delineated upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink) shall be severed from the remaining portion of the same Benefice and Parish and for the purpose of the union of such severed portion with the Benefice and Parish of Lydden as hereinafter recommended and for the purpose of the union of the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Temple Ewell with the Benefice of River with Guston as also hereinafter recommended such severed portion of the Benefice and Parish of Temple Ewell shall be deemed to be a separate Benefice and Parish.

That the severed portion of the said Benefice of Temple Ewell and the said Benefice of Lydden shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided under the style of ' The Benefice of Lydden ' (herein referred to as the United Benefice of Lydden) and the present Parish Church of Lydden shall be the Parish Church of such United Benefice and Parish but that no portion of the endowments of the said Benefice of Temple Ewell shall be annexed to the said United Benefice of Lydden.

That with the consents of the said Frederick Ernest Albert Williams and Tudor Phillips Moreton (testified by their signing this Scheme) both of the unions hereinbefore recommended shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and the said Frederick Ernest Albert Williams if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of River with Guston shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Temple Ewell and River with Guston and the said Tudor Phillips Moreton if he is then

Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lydden shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Lydden.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of Canterbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid :

And whereas no person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme has proceeded with an appeal to His Majesty in Council against the said Scheme or any part thereof within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas one of the Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in the Municipal Borough of Dover :

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months :

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, and the said Parish of Egglecliffe, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, and of the said Parish of Egglecliffe, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a Separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed Separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas by a certain Indenture bearing date on or about the 16th day of October, 1924, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the ‘ New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856 ’ or some or one of them, between the Reverend Arthur Trehane Dingle, Rector of the Rectory of the said Parish of Egglecliffe, of the first part, Sir Hugh Bell, of Rounton Grange, Northallerton, in the County of York, Baronet, the Patron of the said Rectory of Egglecliffe, of the second part, the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of Egglecliffe, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part, (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said Arthur Trehane Dingle did, with the consents of the said Hugh Bell, as such Patron as aforesaid, and the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham, as such Bishop as aforesaid, assign unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners,

the sum of £1,250 £4 per centum Funding Stock (1960-1990) (part of a sum of £7,335 14s. 0d. of the same Stock) standing in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as part of the endowments of the said Rectory of the Parish of Egglecliffe, to have and to hold for or towards the endowment of the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted, so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act, and to his successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the Vicar or Incumbent of such new Parish and his successors for the time being:

“ And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the original limits of the Parish of Stockton upon Tees, in the said County of Durham and in the said Diocese of Durham, have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or of some or one of them, and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £120 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed Separate District when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned, and to his successors, Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District or New Parish, such grant to be in lieu of the two yearly sums of £60 each at present payable out of the Common Fund hereinbefore mentioned towards the stipend of an Assistant Curate to be employed within the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, and to serve the Conventional District of all Saints, Preston upon Tees:

“ And whereas by an Instrument dated the 18th day of October, 1923, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in consideration of a benefaction of a capital sum of £1,000 paid to us for the spiritual benefit of the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, did in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111, section 5, grant to the Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, one yearly sum or stipend of £45, such yearly sum or stipend to be paid only upon the production of a certificate that an Assistant Curate has been employed within the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, at a salary of not less than £120 per annum, and such yearly sum or stipend to continue payable so long only as may appear to us to be expedient:

“ And whereas it has been made to appear to us to be expedient that such yearly sum or stipend of £45 payable by us as aforesaid should cease to be so payable and that in lieu thereof we should grant a yearly sum of £45 to the Minister of the said proposed District when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors, Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District or New Parish:

“ And whereas the said benefaction of £1,000 now held by us is available for the further endowment of the said proposed Separate District and we have agreed to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on

the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year to the Minister of the said proposed District, when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors, Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District or New Parish, the sum of £45 per annum so long as the said capital sum of £1,000 shall remain in our hands:

“ And whereas the said grants of the said yearly sums of £120 and £45 respectively will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument or Instruments to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £1,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed District:

“ And whereas the said sum of £1,250 £4 per centum Funding Stock (1960-1990) has been so assigned as aforesaid and the last mentioned capital sum of £1,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas the said Arthur Trehane Dingle and the principal contributors of the said capital sum of £1,000 towards the cost of erecting the said permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Durham as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, and of the said Parish of Egglecliffe, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of All Saints, Preston upon Tees.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance

in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of the said Diocese of Durham, and his successors, for ever.
