GRANGE ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made by the Urban District Council of Grange (herein referred to as "the Council") whose office is at the Council Office, Grange-over-Sands to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1922 for the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Council to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes within the urban district of Grange in the County Palatine of Lancaster (herein referred to as "the area of supply").

2. To authorise the Council to exercise within the area of supply all the powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity.

3. To prescribe and limit the price to be charged for the supply of electricity.

4. The streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified by the Order are as follows:—

Main Street. From the Police Station to the Grange Hotel.

Esplanade.

Kents Bank Road. From Fernleigh Road to Berners Close.

Hampsfell Road. From the Crown Hotel to Andyfield.

Every local or other public authority, company or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the application may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Gwydyr House, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, and posted on or before the 30th day of December, 1924, and a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the undersigned Parliamentary Agents.
