COUNTY BOROUGH OF MERTHYR TYDFIL.

BYE-LAWS.

Made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil, acting by the Council under the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Merthyr Tydfil Corporation, 1920.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say, "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil; "Omnibus" means any motor omnibus owned and used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers; "Passengers" means every person being carried or conveyed upon or by an omnibus; "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of any omnibus; "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive an omnibus.

2. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all Omnibuses of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

3. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively, whilst in or upon any omnibus, or spit or commit any nuisance in, upon, from or against any omnibus, as aforesaid, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

No passenger or any other person shall while travelling in or upon any omnibus, as aforesaid, sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions or sell any article or play any game or gamble, or throw down and leave in or upon any omnibus, as aforesaid any waste paper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit or any other objectionable matter in or upon any omnibus, as aforesaid.

Objectionable Persons.

4. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, and no person who from any other cause is in the opinion of the Conductor unfit to be a passenger shall enter or mount upon any omnibus and any such person found in or upon any omnibus shall leave the omnibus on being requested by the Conductor to do so, and on his refusal he may be immediately removed from the omnibus by or under the direction of the Conductor.

"Infectious or contagious disease" means any of the following diseases: Small Pox, Cholera, Diphtheria, Membranous Croup, Erysipelas, the disease known as Scarletina or Scarlet Fever; and the fevers known by any of the following names: Typhus, Typhoid, Enteric, Relapsing Continued or Puerperal.

Dogs.

5. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any Omnibus except they be small and can be carried in the lap, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other

animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any omnibus in contravention of this Bye-law shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the omnibus immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Damage to Omnibus.

6. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on any omnibus, or break or scratch any window or otherwise wilfully damage any omnibus.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable to pay the amount of the damage so done.

Smoking.

7. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or upon any omnibus, except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for the purpose.

Payment of Fares.

8. Each passenger shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey whether the same shall or shall not be demanded.

Upon payment of the fare the Conductor shall give and the passenger shall receive and accept a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid. Such ticket shall only be available by the Omnibus on which it is issued—and by the passenger to whom it is given—or in respect of whom it is issued (except in the case of transfer or season tickets). No passenger after leaving any omnibus for any purpose whatsoever shall be entitled to resume the journey on any other Omnibus without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which such journey is resumed except as provided for under Bye-law No. 14.

A passenger travelling beyond the destination to which his ticket is available shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by him beyond the destination to which he has paid the fare.

Tickets.

9. Each passenger shall show his ticket, if any, when required to do so, to the Conductor, Inspector, or duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface the ticket, so as to render the number, or any material portion thereof illegible.

A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Council shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

Offensive Clothing.

10. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor or Inspector, of

an omnibus, soil, injure or damage the seats, linings, curtains, or cushions of the omnibus, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person, who in the opinion of the Conductor, or other duly authorised officer might for any reason be offensive to any other passenger, shall enter or remain in or upon any omnibus, and any such person may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any omnibus.

No such person shall enter in or upon any omnibus after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any omnibus he shall, on the request of the Conductor, leave such omnibus, upon the fare if previously paid being returned or tendered to him, and on his refusal to do so, he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised officer.

Provided that on omnibuses specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on an omnibus under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

11. No person other than the Driver or Conductor or other Servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duties shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the brakes, switches, lights or any part of the omnibus or its equipment, and, except in case of emergency or accident, no person other than the Conductor or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall ring or cause to be rung any of the signal bells upon any omnibus so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any omnibus, nor signal an omnibus to start.

Luggage.

12. No person shall bring on to any omnibus any luggage other than his own personal luggage not exceeding 28lbs. in weight.

The Conductor may decline to take, and may prevent any person from taking upon any omnibus any personal or other luggage which from its size or otherwise is, in the opinion of the Conductor, unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the omnibus.

Any personal luggage carried by passengers shall be placed in such part of the omnibus as the Conductor may direct.

Full Number of Passengers.

13. When any omnibus contains the full number of passengers no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such omnibus when required by the Conductor not to do so.

Disabled Omnibuses.

14. If at any time an omnibus becomes disabled or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed all passengers shall upon the request of the Conductor leave the omnibus, and if such passengers have paid their fare shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall be entitled to continue their journey by the next available omnibus on any section. No person shall

except with the permission of the Conductor or Inspector mount or enter a disabled or damaged omnibus.

Omnibuses proceeding to Garage.

15. No person shall travel upon an omnibus which is proceeding to a shed or garage and is not on its usual route, unless permitted to do so by the Conductor or Inspector, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare on such route.

Travelling on Steps, etc.

16.—(a) No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel standing on the steps or platform of any omnibus, or travel standing on the upper deck or sit on the railing guards or buffers of any omnibus, and any person so travelling standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor or other officer of the Corporation.

(b) No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any omnibus.

(c) No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any omnibus or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers except on the lower deck of the omnibus with the consent of the Conductor or other officer of the Corporation.

Firearms, etc.

17. No person shall place in or upon any omnibus or travel in or upon any omnibus with loaded firearms or any article, implement or instrument or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers, or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil or damage any omnibus or the clothing of any passenger.

Entering Omnibuses.

18. Every passenger shall enter and depart from an omnibus by the hindermost or Conductor's platform and not otherwise unless so directed by the Conductor providing that this Bye-law shall not apply to any omnibus which can with the approval of the Ministry of Transport, be worked by one man in charge only.

When an omnibus stops, no person shall board the omnibus until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

Entering or Leaving Omnibuses in Motion.

19. No person shall enter, mount or leave or attempt to enter, mount or leave any omnibus in motion.

Breaches of Bye-laws.

20. Any person who shall commit whilst in or on any omnibus any breach of these Bye-laws shall, if the offence is continued, be liable,

in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided to be removed immediately from the omnibus by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to its return.

Passengers to form a queue.

21. On occasions when six or more persons being intending passengers are awaiting at any stopping station or terminus to board an omnibus they shall form up in a line or queue and board the omnibus in the order in which they stand, and no person shall take or endeavour to take a place in such line or queue when formed out of proper order, or shall board or endeavour to board an omnibus out of the order in which he stood in such line or queue, or before any person who stood in front of him in such line or queue.

Obstruction.

22. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Inspector, Conductor, Driver, or other Official or Servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any omnibus or the omnibus service.

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws

23. Every Inspector, Conductor and Driver of an omnibus shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and prevent any breach thereof.

Penalty.

24. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding *Forty Shillings*.

Bye-laws to be kept in Omnibuses.

25. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each omnibus in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

Operation.

26. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the First day of April, 1925.

The foregoing Bye-laws were made at a Meeting of the Council held on the Twenty-seventh day of January, 1925.
