TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 27th February, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd March, 1925, to Saturday, the 7th March, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date

on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 30th September, 1924, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd March, 1925, to Saturday, the 7th March, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of the Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Twelve Hackney Carriages, at Rosslyn Hill, N.W., and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

On West side of Hampstead Green, commencing at the footpath leading from Hampstead General Hospital Drive, extending Northward, by kerb, as far as necessary for twelve carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the Carriageway.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (FOREIGN MEAT) REGULATIONS, 1908.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (FOREIGN MEAT) AMENDING REGULATIONS, 1909.

The Minister of Health, in pursuance of the above Regulations, hereby gives notice that, for the purposes of those Regulations the Official Certificates of the Uruguayan Republic, of which details are set forth in the representations or designs in the Schedule appended to and forming part of this Notice, are declared to be admissible, from the date of the publication of this Notice, in the manner, to the extent, and subject to the rules and conditions prescribed in this Notice, as evidence that the pig from which has been derived the meat in relation to which such Certificates are used, has been certified by a competent authority in the place of origin to be free from disease at the time of slaughter, and that the meat has been certified by the like authority to have been dressed or prepared, and packed, with the needful observance of all requirements for the prevention of danger arising to public health from the meat as an article of food.

And further, with respect to the manner, to the extent, and to the rules and conditions in, to, and subject to which every Official Certificate is admissible as evidence for any such purpose as is hereinbefore described, the Minister of Health hereby prescribes as follows, that is to say:—

(i) An Official Certificate used in relation to foreign meat, or in relation to a box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat, shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the meat is derived from a pig.

(ii) An Official Certificate in the form of

a label shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the label is securely affixed or attached to any foreign meat, or to any box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat; and where the label so fixed or attached has not in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate.

(iii) In this Notice, any word or expression to which a special meaning is assigned by the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Amending Regulations, 1909, has the same meaning as in those Regulations.

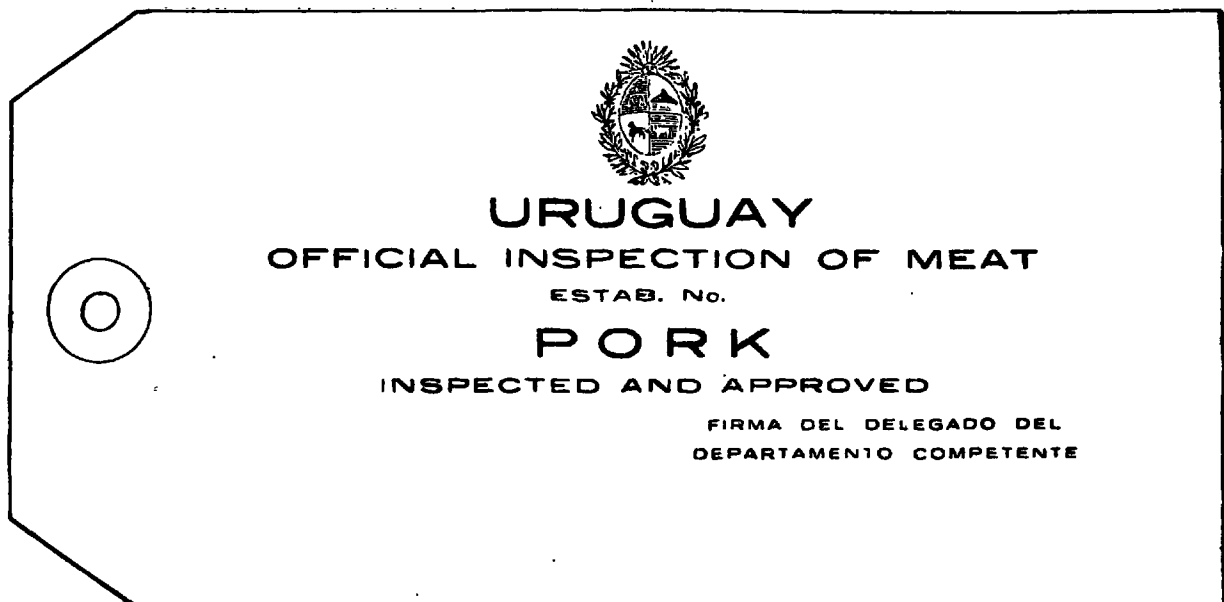

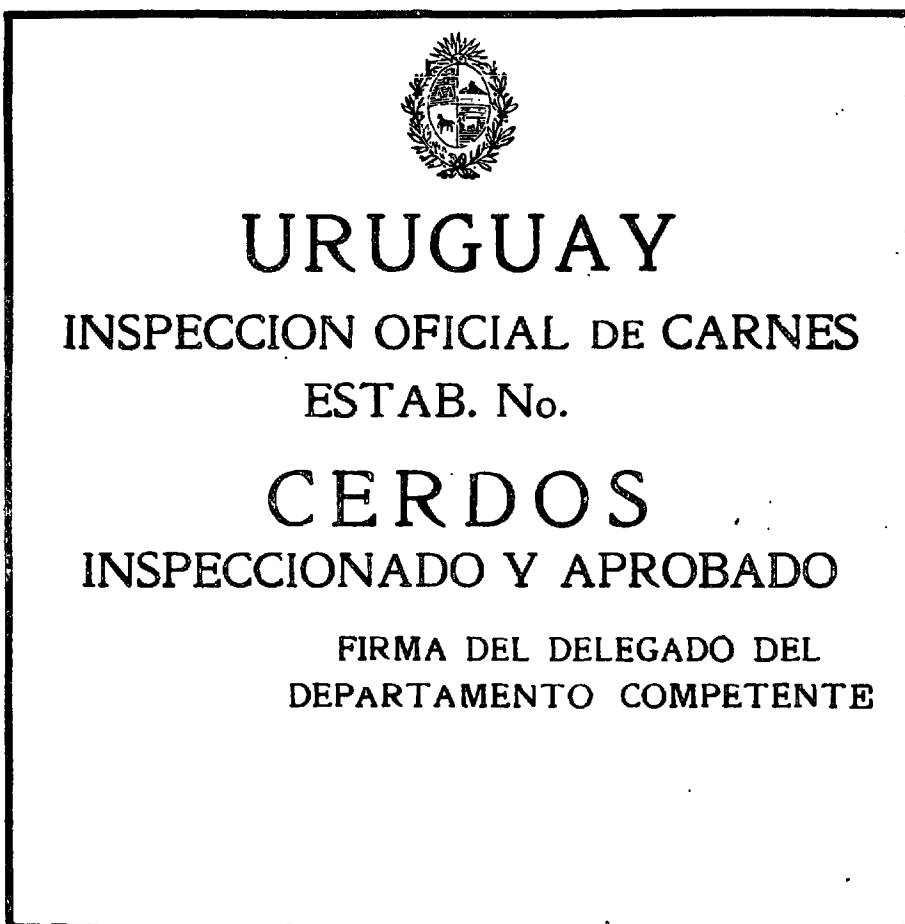

In the blank spaces on the labels will be inserted the number of the slaughterhouse, and the signature of the Veterinary Inspector by whom the meat was examined, or a facsimile of such signature impressed by means of a rubber stamp.

PROVISIONAL RULES AND ORDERS. LONDON TRAFFIC. RESTRICTED STREETS.

London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925, dated the eighteenth day of February, 1925, made by the Minister of Transport under the London Traffic Act, 1924 (14 and 15 Geo. 5, c. 34).

Whereas by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925, the Minister of Transport declared certain streets within the London

Traffic Area to be, and the same are, hereinafter referred to as "restricted streets."

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport hereby certifies, under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56 and 57 Vic., c. 66), that on account of urgency these Regulations should come into immediate operation, and under and in pursuance of the powers given to him under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and without any prejudice to any further exercise of the said powers, hereby makes the following regulations, to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925."

2. It shall not be lawful for any person to use, or allow to be used, for the purpose of plying for hire in any restricted street, or part thereof, any omnibuses in addition to such omnibuses as might, under and in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him under that Section with the licensing authority, and in force on the 1st January, 1925, be used by him for the purpose of maintaining a regular service or services along that street, or part thereof, as the case may be, shown in such Schedule or Schedules.

RESTRICTED STREETS.

London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925, dated the seventeenth day of February, 1925, made by the Minister of Transport under the London Traffic Act, 1924 (14 and 15 Geo. 5, c. 34).

The Minister of Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925."

2. The streets specified in the Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be restricted streets within the meaning of Sub-section (1) of Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, that is to say, streets in which the plying for hire by omnibuses ought to be prohibited or restricted, either generally or during particular hours.

3. Subject to any variations or amendments which may be made by any further Order, this Order shall remain in force until revoked by the Minister of Transport.

COUNTY OF MONMOUTHSHIRE.

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said road.

(iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said road.

ORDER DEFINING THE BENEFITS OR ADVANTAGES WHICH MAY BE RECKONED AS PAYMENT OF WAGES IN LIEU OF PAYMENT IN CASH.
