- "Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:
- "And whereas by Your Order in Council of the 30th May, 1924, an allowance of 6d. a day is payable to certain Petty Officers employed as instructors in the anti-gas schools attached to the three Home Ports:
- "And whereas we consider that the allowance of 6d. a day should be payable, with effect from the 17th March, 1924, to men of the Petty Officer grade or its equivalent in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, qualified and employed as instructors in the anti-gas schools, provided they do not hold a non-substantive rating higher than Seaman Gunner or Seaman Torpedoman:

- "Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:
- "And whereas by Article 1193 of the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's

Naval Service which have been established by Order in Council from time to time provision is made for a limited number of annuities of amount not exceeding twenty pounds a year in each case to be granted either before or after discharge as rewards for distinguished or meritorious service to Warrant Officers Class II and Sergeants of Your Majesty's Marine Force who have completed twenty-one years' service or who have been granted a life pension on account of wounds or hurts received in action or otherwise in the execution of duty, and for such annuities to be retained by any recipients who may subsequently attain the rank of Warrant Officer Class I and held in addition to the pension:

"And whereas by the same Article it is further provided that unless they have already been awarded a Meritorious Service Medal under the provisions of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of January, 1919, the recipients of such annuities shall be entitled to wear a silver medal bearing on the one side the Royal Effigy and on the other the words 'For Meritorious Service' and that the said annuity and medal shall not be liable to be forfeited except by sentence of a court-martial or by conviction of felony by the civil power:

"And whereas by Section X of Schedule V of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, it was provided that no more Warrant Officers Class II in Your Majesty's Marine Force were thereafter to be appointed and that the rank is to be abolished when the last of such Officers shall cease to exist:

"And whereas by paragraph 19 of the Regulations which were established by Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of November, 1881, it is provided that a Quartermaster in Your Majesty's Marine Force who on being commissioned as such is in receipt of an annuity for distinguished or meritorious service is to surrender the same and to receive annually, in lieu thereof, pay equivalent to such annuity:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable in the interest of Your Majesty's Service that any recipients of annuities awarded under the provisions of the aforesaid Article 1193 who may in future be advanced to Commissioned or Warrant rank should thereupon relinquish the said annuities without any allowance in lieu thereof, but should nevertheless continue to be eligible to wear the silver medal awarded to them in respect thereof:

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the lights or signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by His Majesty's vessels and other vessels navigating the waters of the port, and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain Regulations and Rules were made by Orders in Council dated the 16th day of June, 1915, and the 4th day of September, 1918, with

reference to the two Dockyard Ports of Chatham and Sheerness:

And whereas it appears expedient to amend such Rules as hereinafter provided:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.
- 2. Clause 13 of the Second Schedule of the said Order in Council dated the 16th day of June, 1915, is hereby repealed.
- 3. The following Rule shall have effect in relation to the two Dockyard Ports of Chatham and Sheerness and shall be read and construed as though inserted in the Second Schedule of the said Order in Council dated the 16th day of June, 1915, in the position indicated by the number prefixed thereto.
- 13. Should a vessel sink or become a wreck in any part of the Dockyard Port so that an obstruction in a navigable fairway is caused, which in the opinion of the King's Harbour Master it is necessary to mark, such vessel or wreck will be indicated by the following marks:—
 - (a) If within a line drawn 305 degrees from Garrison Point, Sheerness, to Dolly Bank.

Either (i) by a vessel moored so as to lie on the channel side of the wreck or obstruction, from which vessel will be exhibited:

By day:—A green flag and two green balls one from each end of a cross yard with a horizontal distance between the balls of not less than six feet and not more than twelve feet.

By night:—Two green lights, one from each end of a cross yard with a horizontal distance between the lights of not less than six feet and not more than twelve feet.

The above signals may, if necessary, be shown from the wreck itself of from a fixed obstruction.

Fog Signal:—The vessel marking the wreck or obstruction will at intervals of not more than one minute ring a bell rapidly for about five seconds.

- Or (ii) by a green cylindrical lighted or unlighted wreck buoy (exhibiting a green occulting light, if lighted) which may be placed near to or over a wreck, but will not indicate which side a vessel may pass.
- (b) If to seaward of a line drawn 305 degrees from Garrison Point, Sheerness, to Dolly Bank.

By the Uniform System of Marking Wrecks in the Open Sea adopted for the Coasts of England, Wales, Scotland, Ireland and the Isle of Man.

- "45.—(1) The exhibition of an invention at an industrial or international exhibition, certified as such by the Board of Trade, or the publication of any description of the invention during the period of the holding of the exhibition, or the use of the invention for the purpose of the exhibition in the place where the exhibition is held, or the use of the invention during the period of the holding of the exhibition by any person elsewhere, without the privity or consent of the inventor, or the reading of a paper by an inventor before a learned society or the publication of the paper in the society's transactions, shall not prejudice the right of the inventor to apply for and obtain a patent in respect of the invention or the validity of any patent granted on the application, provided that:—
 - (a) the exhibitor, before exhibiting the invention, or the person reading such paper or permitting such publication, gives the Comptroller the prescribed notice of his intention to do so; and

(b) the application for a patent is made before or within six months from the date of the opening of the exhibition, or the reading or publication of such paper.

(2) His Majesty may by Order in Council apply this section to any exhibition mentioned in the Order in like manner as if it were an industrial or international exhibition certified as such by the Board of Trade, and any such Order may provide that the exhibitor shall be relieved from the condition of giving notice to the Comptroller of his intention to exhibit, and shall be so relieved either absolutely or upon such terms and conditions as may be stated in the Order ":

And whereas by Section 59 of the said Acts, it is provided as follows:—

- "59.—(1) The exhibition at an industrial or international exhibition certified as such by the Board of Trade, or the exhibition elsewhere during the period of the holding of the exhibition, without the privity or consent of the proprietor, of a design, or of any article to which a design is applied, or the publication, during the holding of any such exhibition, of a description of a design, shall not prevent the design from being registered, or invalidate the registration thereof; Provided that:—
 - (a) The exhibitor, before exhibiting the design or article, or publishing a description of the design, gives the Comptroller the prescribed notice of his intention to do so; and
 - (b) The application for registration is made before or within six months from the date of the opening of the exhibition.
- (2) His Majesty may, by Order in Council, apply this section to any exhibition mentioned in the Order in like manner as if

it were an industrial or international exhibition certified as such by the Board of Trade, and any such Order may provide that the exhibitor shall be relieved from the condition of giving notice to the Comptroller of his intention to exhibit, and shall be so relieved either absolutely or upon such terms and conditions as may be stated in the Order."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the above recited Sections, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:— 1. The provisions of the foregoing Sections of the said Acts shall apply to the International Exhibition of Modern Decorative and Industrial Art to be held at Paris in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five; and the exhibitor of an invention or of a design or of any article to which a design is applied shall be relieved from the condition of giving notice to the Comptroller of his intention to exhibit such invention or design or article to which a design is applied.

of Hereford for the time being:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately

from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.
