The following Address was presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the New Canadian Building in Trafalgar Square on the 29th ultimo:—

HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR CANADA.
May it please Your Majesty:—

The very keen interest Your Majesties have ever evinced in the welfare and progress of Overseas Dominions is no where realised more

than in Canada, and the gracious act of opening this building to-day, will be deeply appreciated from one end of the Dominion to the other. We retain lively recollections of the visit of Your Majesties, of the all too brief sojourns in Canada of the Princess Louise and the Duke of Connaught, while the present-day visits of The Prince of Wales to his ranch in the West are looked forward to with pleasure. It has for years past been felt that the various Canadian official activities in the Empire's capital city ought to be assembled at a central point, and when the Canadian Government found that this site—the former home of the Union Club—was available, they seized the opportunity of using it as a dignified, conspicuous and convenient location for carrying on their work here and also for making known the advantages and opportunities our country offers to our fellow subjects. It will, in addition, serve as an easily accessible centre for the many Canadians who visit this country in ever increasing numbers on business or pleasure. The re-construction has been carried out by a talented architect, Mr. Warwick, aided by efficient contractors whose staff have laboured diligently.

As representing my Government and the people of Canada, I ask Your Majesty to declare this building open, with the full assurance that within these walls we shall be able to carry on a useful work that will redound to the credit of our country and in some part assist in maintaining a community of interest in the great Commonwealth of Nations, of which Your Majesty is the head, and which are contributing so much to the happiness and prosperity of mankind.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

In your loyal Address, for which I heartily thank you, you have referred to the visit of the Queen and myself to Canada, which has ever remained a delightful memory to us both, while I preserve happy recollections of other occasions when I had the good fortune to visit your country. You have spoken also of the association of the Duke of Connaught and other Members of my House with the Dominion. The Queen and I remember with pride and gratification the warm welcome extended to our eldest son in his visits to different parts of the Empire, and we realise that nowhere was that welcome more friendly than in Canada, whose people took him to their hearts from the moment that he set foot upon Canadian soil.

The Queen and I are very glad to take part in to-day's ceremony and to see the new home of Canada in London.

Canada is a great country: alike in the literal sense of vast extent from "sea to sea" and great in achievement and in promise: and it is right and necessary that its official representatives here should be housed in a manner worthy of the Dominion and adequate to the discharge of their ever-growing and important duties. I sincerely congratulate you upon the wise instinct which led to the choice of a site so well adapted to your needs and also upon the admirable reconstruction that has been effected.

I now have the pleasure of declaring the Canadian Building open. It is my earnest hope that it will in every way fulfil its purpose and that success may attend all who work within these walls.

PROVISIONAL RULES AND ORDERS, 1925.

LONDON TRAFFIC.

RESTRICTED STREETS.

London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Provisional Regulations, 1925, dated the fourth day of July, 1925, made by the Minister of Transport under the London Traffic Act, 1924 (14 & 15 Geo. 5. c. 34).

Whereas by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Order, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925, No.), the Minister of Transport declared certain streets within the London Traffic Area to be and the same are hereinafter referred to as "restricted streets."

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport hereby certifies, under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56 and 57 Vic. c. 66), that on account of urgency these Regulations should come into immediate operation, and under and in pursuance of the powers given to him under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and without any prejudice to any further exercise of the said powers, hereby makes the following regulations, to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Provisional Regulations, 1925."

2. Subject as in these Regulations provided, it shall not be lawful for any person to use or allow to be used at any time upon a weekday in any restricted street or part thereof for the purpose of plying for hire along that street or part thereof any greater number of omnibuses than might, under and in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him under that Section with the licensing authority and in force on the fourth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, have been used by him at that time on that weekday in that street or part thereof for the purpose of maintaining along that street or part thereof the regular service or services which were shown in such Schedule or Schedules.

3. The restrictions and limitations imposed by the foregoing Regulation shall be subject to the following modifications and exceptions:—

(a) The provisions of Regulation 2 hereof shall not apply on Good Friday, the day following Good Friday, Bank Holidays and days appointed by Proclamation to be Bank Holidays;

(b) On Saturdays, from and after 12 o'clock noon, the number of omnibuses which it shall be lawful under Regulation 2 hereof for any person to use for the purpose of plying for hire along any restricted street or part of a restricted street shall be increased by 10 per cent.;

4. The Minister of Transport may, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, by notice published in the London Gazette, dispense with or

relax on any occasion the restrictions imposed by these Regulations, either generally or in the case of particular streets or parts thereof.

3. Subject to any variations or amendments which may be made by any further Order this Order shall remain in force until revoked by the Minister of Transport.

THE LONDON TRAFFIC (RESTRICTED STREETS)
(No. 2) PROVISIONAL REGULATIONS, 1925.

Whereas by notice dated the 17th day of June, 1925, published in the London Gazette dated the 19th day of June, 1925, and by further notice dated the 26th day of June, 1925, published in the London Gazette dated the 30th day of June, 1925, the Minister of Transport, by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Provisional Regulations, 1925, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by Regulation 2 of the said Regulations upon the occasion of the All England Lawn Tennis Championships to be held at Wimbledon Park on each week-day from Monday the 22nd day of June to Saturday the 4th day of July, 1925, both days inclusive.

And whereas the Minister proposes further to relax the said restrictions and limitations in respect of Monday the 6th day of July, 1925, and any additional days on which the

All England Lawn Tennis Grounds are open to the public until the conclusion of the Championships.
