Meaning of Terms.

1.—(1) In this Order:—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Minister” and “The Ministry” mean the Minister and the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries respectively.

“The Area” means the Area declared in the Schedule to this Order. Any farm, holding, park or enclosure (excluding any detached part) partly within the Area and partly in a free area shall be deemed to be wholly within the Area.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or deer.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Restrictions on Movement and Markets of Animals applicable to the area.

Movement out of the Area.

2. No animal shall be moved out of the Area.

Markets and Sales in the Area.

3. No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held on any premises in the Area.

Movement of Animals through the Area by Railway without untrucking permitted.

4. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Area from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. This Order shall, except where otherwise expressly provided, be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

6.—(1) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from or to which the animal is moved shall each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If any other thing is done in contravention of this Order, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal, and the occupier of the premises in respect of which the same is done or omitted to be done shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

7. This Order may be cited as the LINCOLNSHIRE AND DISTRICT (RESTRICTION ON MOVEMENT AND MARKETS) ORDER OF 1926.

2. To extend and make applicable to the added area all or some of the provisions contained in the before mentioned Acts of 1911 and 1912 as relate to electricity subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained in the Order.

3. To exclude from incorporation some or all of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 or to incorporate the same with such modifications and exceptions as may be indicated in the Order.

4.
