In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922, and 1st April, 1926, respectively, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, in Great Britain for the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade as specified in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1924, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates set out in the Notice Q. (2) PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

As respects Male Workers for whom General Minimum Time Rates are proposed to be varied in Paragraph 1 above, Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed minimum rates specified in Paragraph 1 above in the manner set out in Part II of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice Q. (30), shall apply in substitution for the proposed minimum rates otherwise applicable as set out in Paragraph 1 above, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Paragraph 11 of the above-mentioned Notice Q. (30) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

(3) APPLICATION OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male workers of the classes specified in Paragraph (1) of this Notice in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1924, as set out in Paragraph 15 of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice Q. (30).

NOTE.—No variation is proposed by the Trade Board in the Piece-work Basis Time Rate at present applicable to the above-mentioned classes of workers.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATIONS OF TYPIST AND CLERK-TYPIST IN DEPARTMENTS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 28. If an examination begins in one of the first four months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of January in that year. If an examination begins in one of the second four months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of May in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last four months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of September in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as may from time to time be fixed.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) That they are unmarried or widows.
- (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of a person serving in a civil situation to which she was admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

1. English.
2. Arithmetic.
3. Typewriting.
4. One of the following:—French, German, Shorthand.

No candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in English and in Typewriting.

The Civil Service Commissioners may, at their discretion, restrict the examination in Typewriting to such a number of candidates at the head of the list resulting from the marks awarded for the work in the other subjects as they may think fit. The marks awarded for Typewriting to the candidates examined in that subject will be added to the marks awarded to those same candidates for their work in the three other subjects. The examination in Typewriting, as well as the examination in the other subjects, will be held at such times and places as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

6. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will consult, so far as possible, the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

7. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of ten shillings will be required from every candidate attending the Examination.

The Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in Belfast, Bristol, Edinburgh, London and Manchester, under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 21st September, 1926.

No person will be admitted to examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 22nd July, an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
