Westminster, 8th July, 1926.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:—*

- Criminal Appeal (Scotland) Act, 1926.
- Execution of Diligence (Scotland) Act, 1926.
- Coal Mines Act, 1926.
- Glasgow Education Authority (Juvenile Delinquency) Order Confirmation Act, 1926.
- Ministry of Health Provisional Order Confirmation (Ilfracombe) Act, 1926.
- Abertillery and District Water Board Act, 1926.
- Connah's Quay Urban District Council Water Act, 1926.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the

16th July, 1926, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 19th July, 1926, to Saturday, the 24th July, 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR SIXTEEN HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metro-

polis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Sixteen Hackney Carriages at Chelsea Bridge Road, S.W., and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

On South-west side of roadway, commencing at a point twelve yards from the North-east corner of Royal Hospital Grounds and extending South-eastward by kerb. Three carriages to stand North-west of Urinal and thirteen South-east of same.

Front of vehicles toward the North-west.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.

METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT. STREET COLLECTIONS.

REGULATIONS, DATED JULY 2, 1926, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE POLICE, FACTORIES, & C. (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT, 1916 (6 & 7 GEO. 5, C. 31), WITH REGARD TO STREET COLLECTIONS OF MONEY OR THE SALE OF ARTICLES FOR OTHER THAN TRADE PURPOSES.

By virtue of the powers conferred upon me by Section 5 of the Police, Factories, & C. (Miscellaneous Provision) Act, 1916, I, being the Police Authority for the Metropolitan Police District, hereby revoke as from the 1st October, 1926, the Regulations dated 15th September, 1923 (S.R. & O. 1923, No. 1133), with respect to the places where and the conditions under which persons may be permitted in any street or public place within the Metropolitan Police District to collect money or sell articles for the benefit of charitable or other purposes, and make the following Regulations in place thereof which shall come into force on the 1st October, 1926.

(1) No collection of money (other than a collection taken at an open-air meeting) or sale of any article shall be made in any street or public place within the Metropolitan Police District unless the society, committee, or other body of persons responsible for such collection or sale shall have obtained from the Commissioner of Police a permit for such collection or sale. All applications for permits shall be referred to an Advisory Committee appointed by the Commissioner and approved by the Secretary of State.

(2) Application for a permit shall be made in writing in the form contained in the Schedule hereto not later than the first day of the month preceding that month in which it is proposed to hold the collection or sale, and every application shall be made in the name of a committee or other body consisting of not less than three persons, who shall be jointly responsible for the collection or sale.

Provided that in the Commissioner's discretion the period of notice may be reduced in any particular case or class of cases if he is satisfied that there are special reasons for this course.

(3) No collection or sale shall be made except upon the day and between the hours and in the districts, streets or places mentioned in the permit, and no permit of a continuous character shall be granted.

(4) No person may assist or take part in any collection or sale without the written authority of the committee or body of persons to whom a permit has been granted. Every person so authorised shall produce such written authority forthwith for inspection by any Police Officer on demand.

(5) No collection or sale shall be made in any part of the carriage-way of any street; nor shall any collection or sale be made on the footway or in any public place to the obstruction or annoyance of any person in such street or public place.

(6) All persons acting as collectors or vendors shall occupy a stationary position at some place on the footway. Not more than two persons shall act as collectors or vendors at the same place, and no person shall collect money or sell articles within 30 yards of the place where any other person or persons are collecting or selling.

(7) No person under the age of 18 years shall act or be permitted to act as a collector or vendor.

(8) No collector or vendor shall use a table for the purpose of any collection or sale so as to cause or be likely to cause obstruction. No table used shall exceed 30 inches in length and 20 inches in width.

(9) No collector or vendor shall use a box or other receptacle at the end of a pole intended to reach upper windows or the roofs of conveyances.

(10) No collector or vendor shall be accompanied by any animal.

(11) No collector or vendor shall importune any person to the annoyance of such person.

(12) Every collector or vendor shall carry and present to all contributors or purchasers for the reception of money contributions a box or other receptacle numbered and securely closed and sealed in such a way as to prevent the same being opened or the money extracted without such seal being broken, and into this box or other receptacle all money received shall be immediately placed. All such boxes or receptacles shall be numbered consecutively. Every collector or vendor shall deliver his boxes or other receptacles with the seals unbroken to one of the persons responsible for the proper application of the money received.

(13) A collector or vendor shall not carry any collecting box, receptacle or tray which does not bear displayed prominently thereon the name of the fund for which the collection or sale is being made with the date of the collection nor any box or other receptacle which is not duly numbered.

(14) No payment by way of reward shall be made or given to any collector or vendor. No payment or reward shall be made or given either directly or indirectly to any other person connected with the promotion or conduct of a collection or sale for or in respect of services in connection therewith except such payments

as may be shown in the application made in the form in the Schedule hereto before the permit for the collection or sale is granted.

(15) Within one month after the date of any collection or sale the society, committee or other body of persons responsible therefor shall forward to the Commissioner for the information of the Advisory Committee a statement in the form contained in the Schedule hereto with vouchers certified by two officials of the society and audited by its auditor or other responsible person not connected with the fund, showing in detail the amount received and the expenses incurred in connection with such collection or sale, and shall if required by the Commissioner satisfy him as to the due and proper application of the proceeds of the collection or sale. The society, committee or other body shall also, within the same period, and after audit, publish in such newspaper or newspapers as the Commissioner may direct a short statement showing the name of the society, etc., responsible for the collection or sale, the name of the charity or fund which is to benefit, the date of the collection or sale and the amount collected, the amount of the expenses and the amount distributed to the charity or fund.

Any person who acts in contravention to any of the foregoing Regulations will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding forty shillings, or in the case of a second or subsequent offence not exceeding five pounds.

The foregoing Regulations do not apply to the selling of articles in any street or public place when the articles are sold in the ordinary course of trade and for the purpose of earning a livelihood and no representation is made by or on behalf of the seller that any part of the proceeds of sale will be devoted to any charitable purpose.

I hereby confirm the foregoing Regulations and direct that the same shall be published forthwith in the London Gazette.

DRIFT NETS MENDING TRADE BOARD
(GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF
WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF
FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922, and 1st April, 1926, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts for that branch of work in the Rope, Twine and Net Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as amended by the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net and Drift Nets) Order, 1925, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 28th July, 1925, with respect to the Drift Nets Mending Trade **HEREBY GIVE NOTICE** as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they **PROPOSE TO FIX** General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Female Workers and a General Minimum Piece-Rate for Female Home-Workers, as set out in the Schedule below.

NOTE.—The Proposals set out in this Notice take the place, as respects Female Workers who are in their first year of employment and as respects Female Home-Workers, of the Proposals set out in the Trade Board's Notice E. (1), dated 2nd February, 1926, which are withdrawn.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS:—

	Per week of 44 hours.
(1) Workers in their 1st 6 months of employment in the Trade ...	s. d. 4 0
(2) Workers in their 2nd 6 months of employment in the Trade ...	6 0

The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rates are on the basis of a week of 44 hours and are subject to a proportionate reduction according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 44.

PART II.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATE FOR FEMALE HOME-WORKERS (AS DEFINED IN PART IV. OF THIS SCHEDULE):—

5s. 6d. PER NET.

The above proposed General Minimum Piece-Rate is on the basis that the necessary materials are provided by or at the expense of the employer and that the collection and delivery of the nets are performed by or at the expense of the employer.

PART III.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK.

Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Notice E. (2) issued by the Trade Board and dated 24th June, 1926, shall apply to the classes of Workers specified in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours which the Trade Board have declared to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade as set out in Part II of the Schedule to the said Notice E. (2).

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice:—

A HOME-WORKER is a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The proposed respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Workers in Great Britain of the classes specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in that branch of work in the Rope, Twine and Net Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Drift Nets Mending Trade, Great Britain) (Constitution and Proceedings) Regulations, 1925, as set out in Part IV of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice E. (2), dated 24th June, 1926.

PART VI.

(1) The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

(2) THE ABOVE PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES ARE WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO WORKERS WHO ARE EARNING HIGHER RATES.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 9th day of July, 1926. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Drift Nets Mending Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE "COST OF LIVING" INDEX FIGURE FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922 and 1st April, 1926, respectively, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, in Great Britain for the Brush and Broom Trade as specified in the Trade Board's (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE:—

(1) That they Propose to Vary certain of the General Minimum Piece Rates (and the Overtime Rates based thereon) for male workers employed on Hairs set out in their Notice M. (41), dated 29th April, 1925;

(2) That they Propose to Vary certain of the General Minimum Piece Rates (and the Overtime Rates based thereon) for

female Drawing Hands set out in the said Notice M. (41);

(3) That they Propose to Fix an additional General Minimum Piece Rate for male workers employed on Shaving Brush-Making.

1. The Pig Market at Montague Street in the city of Birmingham, is hereby authorised

by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries to be used for the purposes of this Order, provided that whilst being so used no animals shall be kept in or moved into the market other than swine moved with a licence under this Order.

Movement of Swine to Market.

2. Swine intended for immediate slaughter may, notwithstanding the provisions of any Order made by the Minister restricting the movement of animals into an Infected Area, be moved to the market to which this Order applies with a licence granted by the Local Authority of the city of Birmingham, provided that no such licence shall be granted unless the owner of the swine shall sign and give to the Local Authority an undertaking in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order.

Removal of Swine from Market.

3. Swine moved to the market to which this Order applies with a licence granted under this Order shall not be moved therefrom except with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Birmingham or to any place other than a slaughterhouse or bacon factory approved by the Inspector and situate in the area to which the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 86) or any Order amending that Order for the time being applies, provided that no such licence shall be granted unless the owner of the swine shall sign and give to the Local Authority an undertaking in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order, and also provided that no such licence shall be deemed to authorise the movement of any animals out of the said Area.

Detention and Slaughter.

4. Swine moved to a slaughterhouse or bacon factory with a licence under this Order, shall be there detained until they are slaughtered, and shall be slaughtered within 36 hours after their arrival.

Undertakings to be Transmitted to Ministry.

5. The undertakings when received by the Local Authority shall be forthwith transmitted to the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Conditions of Movement.

6. Swine moved under this Order shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all animals which are not being moved or have not been moved with a licence under this Order.

Licences.

7. Movement licences granted under this Order shall, unless a shorter period is therein specified by the Inspector granting the same, be available for six days including the day of the date thereof and no longer.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (MONTAGUE STREET (BIRMINGHAM) PIG MARKET) ORDER OF 1926, and shall be read with the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 86) and any Order amending that Order.

1. An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority of the district with a view to prevent the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease may by notice require the removal to a convenient and isolated place approved by him of any animal now at the Royal Agricultural Society's Show at Reading, which has been brought from any area which is after the movement of the animals declared to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restriction)

Order of 1925, and of any other animal at the Show which, in the opinion of the Minister or of the Local Authority, has been exposed to the risk of infection of Foot-and-Mouth Disease. This notice shall require any such animal to be detained and isolated at the said place of isolation until the notice is withdrawn by a further notice of an Inspector of the Ministry.

2. A notice under this Article shall be served upon the owner of the animal, and a copy shall be sent to the Ministry and to the Secretary of the Show.

3. The removal, detention and isolation of any animal under a notice served under this Order shall be carried out at the expense of the owner of the animal.

4. If any animal is not removed, detained or isolated as required by notice served under this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall be guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

SHEEP DIPPING (BLACK MOUNTAIN
DISTRICT) ORDER OF 1926.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Part I of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.

1. Part I (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," is hereby applied to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Movement Area for the purposes of that Order.

Application of Part II of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, Subject to Certain Modifications.

2. Part II (*Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area*) of the principal Order is hereby applied, subject to the modification hereinafter appearing, to the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, which shall comprise a Double Dipping Area for the purposes of that Order.

Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

3.—(1) The dates between which all sheep on lands in the Double Dipping Area described in the Second Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the Principal Order are hereby fixed to be the tenth day of August and the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

(2) Each dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District wherein the sheep are, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice.

(3) Each dipping shall, where practicable, take place on lands to which this Article applies, but where such dipping is not practicable, the Notice may require the dipping to be carried out on other premises specified in the Notice, and may impose any conditions as to movement, detention, isolation and dipping of the sheep which the Inspector may consider desirable and specify in the Notice.

(4) If the owner or person in charge of sheep to which a Notice served under paragraph (2) of this Article relates fails to comply with any condition specified in such Notice he shall, according to his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4.—(1) The provisions of Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall apply also to any lands in the neighbourhood to which they may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such Notice and shall cease to apply to any such lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) A copy of every Notice served under this Article by an Inspector of the Local Authority shall forthwith be sent to the Ministry by the Inspector signing the same.

Power to Prohibit Exposure of Undipped Sheep on Lands in Double Dipping Area.

5.—(1) The Local Authority may, by Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority, and served on any person entitled to turn out sheep on any lands in the Double Dipping Area described in the Second Schedule hereto, prohibit such turning out during

the then current year after the expiration of the double dipping period, unless the sheep have, since the tenth day of July in the current year, been dipped twice by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Minister for sheep scab or purporting to be so approved with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the two dippings, and have since the second dipping been kept separate from sheep which have not been so dipped.

(2) If any person served with a Notice under this Article turns out, or causes or permits to be turned out, sheep in contravention of the Notice, he shall, in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP DIPPING (BLACK MOUNTAIN DISTRICT) ORDER OF 1926.

THE IMPORTATION OF CARCASSES (PROHIBITION) ORDER, 1926.

BY virtue of the power and authority in me
 in that behalf vested by the Cattle
 Diseases Prevention Acts, I, the said
 Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice
 and consent of two members of the Council, do
 hereby order as follows:—

(1) On and after the date hereof, it shall be
 unlawful to land in the Isle of Man a carcass

brought from any country on the Continent of Europe other than Great Britain or Ireland, except in pursuance of a licence issued by the Government Secretary or the Chief Clerk, Government Office, authorising such landing.

(2) This Order shall not apply to:—

(a) Fully cured bacon and ham, lard or rendered fat, cooked or preserved meats or meat essences;

(b) Hides and skins which have been dried, dry-salted or wet-salted; but hides or skins which have been wet-salted shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Government of the country in which the port of shipment is situated to the effect that he is satisfied that the hides or skins have been wet-salted for a period of fourteen days. Such certificate shall be delivered by the master of the vessel or his representative to the Police Officer in charge of the Police Station at the port of landing.

(3) In this Order "carcase" means the carcase of any cattle, sheep, pigs or goats, and

includes part of a carcase, and the meat, hides, skins, hair, bones, bone meal, hoofs, hoof meal, horns, horn meal, offal, blood, dried blood or blood meal, or any other part of a carcase separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof.

(4) If any carcase or part of a carcase is landed in this Island in contravention of this Order the owner thereof and the importer and the occupier of the place of landing and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed shall each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults be deemed guilty of an offence against the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts.
