routes, 13 omnibuses per hour in each direction in excess of the number which he may use in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulation 2 on approved route No. 9A and 6 omnibuses per hour in each direction in excess of the number which he may use in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulation 2 on approved route No. 55; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give direction to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. (Dated 31st August, 1926.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARA-TION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 96).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

## Declaration of Further Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 74) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule hereto were included as Area No. 12 in the First Schedule to that Order.

## Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 96), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.
