WHEREAS in pursuance of the third section of "The Bishopric of Blackburn Measure, 1923," the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, by an Instrument under their Common Seal dated the 29th day of July, 1926, have certified to His Majesty that the annual value of the Endowment Fund of the Bishopric of Blackburn (when calculated in the manner directed by the said Bishopric of Blackburn Measure, 1923), is not less than Three thousand five hundred pounds (including the annual value of the fitting Episcopal Residence for the said Bishopric which has been provided to their satisfaction):

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above mentioned Measure, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and declare as follows:—

- (1) The Bishopric of Blackburn is hereby founded.
- (2) The Diocese of the said Bishopric shall consist (subject to the provisions contained in the ninth section of the said Measure as to the re-arrangement of boundaries) of the present Archdeaconries of Lancaster and Blackburn (except the Rural Deanery of Rossendale), now in the Diocese of Manchester.
- (3) The Parish Church of Blackburn, in the County of Lancaster, subject to the

rights of the Patron and the Incumbent of that Church, shall be the Cathedral Church of the said Bishopric.

- (4) The Bishop of Blackburn is constituted a Body Corporate and is hereby invested with all such rights, privileges, and jurisdictions as are possessed by any other Bishop in England, and is subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of York.
- (5) This Order shall come into operation on the date of the publication of the same in the London Gazette.

- (2) The Diocese of the said Bishopric shall consist (subject to the provisions contained in the eleventh section of the said Measure as to the re-arrangement of boundaries) of the present Archdeaconries of Leicester and Loughborough, now in the Diocese of Peterborough, and the Parishes of Stanford on Avon; Little Bowden, Saint Nicholas, with Saint Mary in Arden; and Little Bowden, Saint Hugh, now in the Archdeaconry of Northampton, in the said Diocese of Peterborough.

(3) The Collegiate Church of Saint Martin, Leicester, subject to the rights of the Patron and the Incumbent of that Church, shall be the Cathedral Church of the said Bishopric.

- (4) The Bishop of Leicester is constituted a Body Corporate and is hereby invested with all such rights, privileges and jurisdictions as are possessed by any other Bishop in England, and is subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Canterbury.
- (5) This Order shall come into operation on the date of the publication of the same in the London Gazette.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by Section 670 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that when any Lighthouse, Buoy, or Beacon has either before or after passing of that Act been erected or placed on or near the coast of any British Possession by or with the consent of the Legislature of that Possession, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such Dues (in that Act referred to as Colonial Light Dues) to be paid in respect of that Lighthouse, Buoy, or Beacon by the Owner or Master of every Ship which passes the same and derives benefit therefrom as His Majesty may deem reasonable, and may by like Order increase, diminish or repeal such Dues, and those Dues shall from the time mentioned in be leviable throughout Order Majesty's Dominions, and further that Colonial Light Dues shall not be levied in any British Possession unless the Legislature of that Possession has, by address to the Crown or by Act or Ordinance duly passed, signified its opinion that the Dues ought to be levied:

. And whereas the Great Basses Lighthouse, the Little Basses Lighthouse, and the Minicoy Lighthouse are Lighthouses which have been duly erected under and pursuant to the said Section:

And whereas by Orders in Council, dated respectively the 22nd day of May, 1883, the 9th day of May, 1892, the 29th day of June,

1896. the 10th day of August, 1903, the 21st day of October, 1912, the 6th day of February, 1917 and the 14th day of July, 1922, the Dues leviable in respect of the said Lighthouses for the Classes of Ships therein respectively

mentioned were duly fixed:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 6th day of February, 1925, His Majesty directed that, as from the 1st day of April, 1925, or from the time of the receipt of notice of that Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorised to collect Light Dues, the Dues thenceforth to be levied should be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-sixteenths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse one-sixteenth of one penny per ton, of the burden of every ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said Lights respectively:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said Dues should be altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers so vested in Him by the above recited provisions, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth by this Order in Council order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Colonial Light Dues (Great and Little Basses

and Minicoy) Order, 1926."

2. As from the 1st day of April, 1927, or from the time of the receipt of this Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorised to collect Light Dues, the Dues thenceforth to be levied shall be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-thirty seconds of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse, one-thirty second of one penny per ton of the burden of every Ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said Lights respectively.

HEREAS His Majesty, by virtue of the authority conferred on Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, and having regard to the provisions of the revised Berne Copyright Convention of 1908, was pleased to make an Order in Council, dated the 24th day of June, 1912 (hereinafter called the Principal Order), extending the protection of the said Act to certain classes of works to which protection is guaranteed by the said Convention:

And whereas Roumania has acceded to the said Convention subject to the reservation mentioned in the Schedule to this Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The Principal Order shall extend to Roumania as if that country were amongst the Foreign Countries of the Copyright Union therein named, subject to the following modifications:-
 - (a) The provisions of Article 2 Proviso (iii) (b) of the Principal Order shall apply as if Roumania were included amongst the foreign countries named in those provisions.
 - (b) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is Roumania the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the commencement of the Principal. Order.
 - (c) In the application to such works of Sections 1 (2) (\bar{d}) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the passing of the Act, in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever those expressions occur.
 - (d) In the application to such works of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in Sub-

- section 1 (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in Sub-section 1 (b).
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Berne Copyright Convention (Roumania) Order, 1926.
- 3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1927, which day is in this Order referred to as the Commencement of this Order.

PUBLIC WORKS LOANS ACT, 1875.

FURTHER REGULATIONS AS TO ADVANCES BY THE PUBLIC WORKS LOAN COMMISSIONERS.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the following further regulations are proposed to be made by the Public Works Loan Commissioners with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury under Section 41 of the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, and that copies of the draft regulations may be obtained at the Office of the Public Works Loan Board, Old Jewry, E.C. 2.

DRAFT REGULATIONS.

(1) That in place of the 1st of the regulations made on the 16th September, 1912, under the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, the following regulations shall be in force, viz :-When the Loan Commissioners shall have determined upon any amount of money to be advanced by way of loan pursuant to Section 9. of the Public Works Loans Act, 1875, the said Commissioners, or any one or more of them, shall forthwith certify such amount to the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt for the time being, and at the foot of every such certificate the Secretary shall state the name or names of the person or persons by whom such certificate is to be presented to the said Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, and upon every such certificate being lodged at the office of the last-mentioned Commissioners for such number of days as may from time to time be agreed upon between the same Commissioners and the Loan Commissioners, the Comptroller General, or other proper officer of the said Commissioners, shall sign an order appended to such certificate for the payment of the sum mentioned therein to the person or persons named at the foot of the certificate, or to one of such persons, which order shall be addressed to the cashiers of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England; and the signatures of such person or persons, jointly or severally, shall be a sufficient discharge to the said Com-

missioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, and to the said Governor and Company respectively, provided the total amount directed to be paid by such certificate of certi--ficates respectively shall not at any time exceed the amount for the time being standing to the credit of the account referred to in Section 16 of the Act.

(2) The above regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1927, and as ifrom such date the said 1st regulation shall

be rescinded.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS (DUMBARTON-SHIRE) ORDER OF 1926.

1. The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations:—

(1) For prescribing and regulating the notice to be given to or by any person or authority in the case of illness of any head of cattle where the animal has died from the illness, or been slaughtered on account thereof, and for supplementing or varying for those purposes any of the provisions of Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894: and

1894; and
(2) For regulating the removal or disposal of the carcase of any head of cattle to which

any such notice relates.

· Limitation of Regulations.

2 (1) Nothing in any Regulations made under this Order shall require notice to be given in the case of death produced by, or consequent

on, accident or calving.

(2) Nothing in any Regulations made under this Order shall affect the provisions of any Order of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries relating to cattle-plague, pleuropneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, anthrax, or tuberculosis.

Confirmation of Regulations.

3. (1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) Unless the Minister otherwise directs,

the following provisions shall apply:—

(i) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii) For two weeks at least before an application a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Offences.

4. Any person failing to give the notice prescribed by any Regulation made under this Order, or moving or disposing, or permitting the removal or disposal of larguages, in contravention of any such Regulation, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

5. This Order may be cited as the DISEASES OF ANIMALS (DUMBARTONSHIRE) ORDER OF 1926.
