# TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday. the 3rd December, 1926, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 6th December, 1926, to Saturday, the 11th December, 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker. Discount House or Broker.
- The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the

- amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not. later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4). of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

1. The Pitch (Emergency: Prohibition of Export) Order, 1926, (S.R. & O. 1926, No. 1187); is hereby revoked.

2. This Order may be cited as the Pitch (Emergency: Prohibition of Export) Order, 1926, Revocation Order, 1926.

THE COAL (EMERGENCY) SUPPLEMENTARY (No. 6) DIRECTIONS, 1926, DATED NOVEMBER 24TH, 1926, GIVEN BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS (No. 8), 1926.

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Emergency Regulations (No. 8), 1926, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby direct as follows:—

(1) Save as is hereinafter expressly provided, the following Directions are hereby revoked:—

The Coal (Emergency) Directions, 1926 (hereinafter called "the Principal Directions"),

The Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 2) Directions, 1926,

The Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 4) Directions, 1926,

The Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 5) Directions, 1926:

Provided that there shall be saved and excepted from this revocation the following Parts and Articles of the Principal Directions, that is to say-

The whole of Parts V and VII, Articles 21 and 22 of Part VI, and Articles 37, 38, 43 and 44 of Part IX, together with the definition of

" coal" in Article 42.

(2) The interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of these Directions as it applies to an Act of Parliament, and as if these Directions were an Act of Parliament.

(3) These Directions may be cited as the Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 6) Directions, 1926, and shall come into force on the 25th day of November, 1926, so far as they relate to Parts III and VIII of the Principal Directions, and in respect of the remaining revocations on the 28th day of November, 1926.

# NEWTOWN AND LLANLLWCHAIARN.

Whereas the Urban District Council of Newtown and Llanllwchaiarn (hereinafter called the Council) have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Newtown Water Act, 1898, so as:—

(3) To provide (a) that the minimum quarterly charge for a supply of water by measure to any dwelling-house partly used by the occupier for any trade or manufacturing purpose or to any of the premises mentioned in paragraph (1) above shall be one-fourth of the annual amount which would be payable according to the scale for the time being in force for a domestic supply to a dwelling-house of the same gross estimated rental; and (b) that the minimum quarterly charge for a supply of water to any premises by measure for any other purposes shall be one pound;

(4) To empower the Council to charge additional sums not exceeding thirty shillings per annum in respect of the use of water for washing horses, carriages or motor cars or for other purposes in premises where horses, carriages or motor cars are kept for private use, and where more motor cars than one are ordinarily kept a further sum not exceeding ten shillings per annum for

each motor car beyond the first;

(5) To enable the Council to make an allowance by way of discount on the amount due in respect of rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes to every person who pays the same within such time as the Council prescribe;

(6) To confer power to open ground on persons liable to maintain pipes or

apparatus;

DISEASES OF ANIMALS (DUNBARTONSHIRE) ORDER OF 1926.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Power to make Regulations for Notification of Illness of Cattle.

- 1. The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make regulations:—
  - (1) For prescribing and regulating the notice to be given to or by any person or

- authority in the case of illness of any head of cattle, and for supplementing or varying for those purposes any of the provisions of section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894; and
- (2) For regulating the burial of the carcase of any head of cattle to which any notice of illness relates.

#### Limitation of Regulations.

- 2.—(1) Nothing in any regulations made under this Order shall require notice to be given:—
  - (i) In the case of illness produced by, or consequent on, accident or calving; or
  - (ii) Where the illness is certified by a Veterinary Surgeon as not being cattle-plague, pleuro-pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, anthrax, or tuberculosis.
- (2) Nothing in any regulations made under this Order shall affect the provisions of any Order of the Minister of Agriculture and

Fisheries relating to cattle-plague, pleuropneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, anthrax, or tuberculosis.

# Confirmation of Regulations.

3.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) Unless the Minister otherwise directs, the following provisions shall apply:—

(i) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District two weeks at

least before the making of the application.

(ii) For two weeks at least before an application a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

### Offences.

4. Any person failing to give the notice prescribed by any Regulation made under this Order, or moving or disposing or permitting the removal or disposal of, a carcase, in contravention of any such Regulation, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

5. The Diseases of Animals (Dumbartonshire) Order of 1926 is hereby revoked.

ByE-Laws and Regulations.

Made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Darlington as the promoters and owners of the Darlington Corporation Transport Undertaking, under the powers conferred upon them by the Darlington Corporation (Transport &c.) Act, 1925.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws and Regulations the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Darlington; the words "Transport Undertaking" mean the Trolley Vehicle Undertaking and Omnibus Undertaking belonging to the Corporation authorised by The Darlington Corporation (Transport &c.) Act, 1925; the word "Carriage" means any trolley vehicle or motor omnibus run by the Corporation in connection with the Transport Undertaking for the conveyance of passengers or goods; and the word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a carriage.

2. No person shall enter, mount, or leave or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage

in motion.

3. A person desiring to board a carriage for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intend-

ing to do so.

4. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is authorised to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount upon, or remain in or upon any such carriage after being warned by the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation not to do so.

- 5. Passengers waiting to enter any carriage at any stopping place or terminus upon any trolley vehicle or omnibus route shall wait in such lines or queues and in such parts of the road or footway as they may be directed by notice or by a duly authorised Officer of the Corporation, and shall enter the carriages in which they respectively desire to travel in the order in which they stand in such line or queue.
- 6. No person except a passenger or intending passenger, or a duly authorised Officer of the Corporation shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on, by, or to, any part of any carriage or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the carriage with the consent of the Conductor.
- 7. No person other than the driver or any other duly authorised person shall enter or travel in the driver's compartment of any carriage.
- 8. If at any time a carriage becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, at the request of the Conductor, leave the same, and if any such passenger has paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid, but on production of his ticket shall be entitled to travel by the next available carriage the remainder of the distance in respect of which he has paid his fare. No person shall, except with the permission of the Conductor, mount upon or enter a disabled or damaged carriage.
- 9. Each passenger shall pay to the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation the fare legally payable in respect of the distance he is carried either on demand or before leaving the carriage (whichever first happens). Upon payment of the fare the passenger shall if tickets are issued receive and accept a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid. Such ticket shall only be available (except as provided in the preceding Bye-law and Regulation) by the carriage on which it is issued and for the passenger to whom it is given or in respect of whom it is issued. Any person leaving a carriage shall be deemed to have completed his journey.
- 10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the Conductor or any duly authorised Officer of the Corporation, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket in such a condition that the number can be read and any other material portion thereof identified or pay the fare legally payable in respect of the distance travelled over by him.
- 11. No person who is not an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Corporation or who is not otherwise entitled by the regulations made by the Corporation from time to time to travel at the rates prescribed for artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers, shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such persons.
- 12. No person shall smoke or shall carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in any compartment of a carriage wherein is exhibited in a conspicuous place a notice that smoking is prohibited.

13. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of any carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who is affected with any contagious or infectious disorder, or who in the opinion of the Conductor might, for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or re-main on or in any carriage, and may be pre-vented from so doing, and if found on or in any carriage, shall, on request of the Conductor, immediately leave the same; Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a carriage under the provisions of this Byelaw on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

14. All personal luggage shall be carried by hand and must not be placed so as to occupy any part of a seat or so as to block any gangway or exit or occupy any standing room within any carriage and further must not be of a form or description to annoy or inconvenience other

passengers.

15. No person shall place upon any carriage or travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or any article, instrument or implement, or any utensil or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil or damage any carriage or the clothing of any passenger.

16. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any carriage except by permission of the Conductor, nor in any case in which the presence of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Bye-law and Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

17. No person shall spit or swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively or sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit or waste paper or other refuse in or upon or from any carriage, waiting-room, premises or buildings used in connection with the Transport Undertaking, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage or premises as aforesaid or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

18. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, or linings or any part of any carriage, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or upon any carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, to pay the amount of any damage done.

19. No person other than an Officer or servant of the Corporation shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights,

switches, ventilators, trolley cord or any part of a carriage or its equipment, or signal a carriage to start.

20. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or connection with any carriage of the

Corporation.

21. Every conductor, driver, and other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation shall enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent any breach thereof, to the best of his ability.

22. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any carriage, any breach of these Byelaws and Regulations, shall in addition to being liable to the penalty hereinafter provided, be liable to be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to claim its return.

23. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations, shall be liable to a penalty not

exceeding forty shillings.

24. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.
