“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th October, 1920, to sanction, *inter alia*, the establishment of the Ordnance Artificer Branch, and the institution of a non-substantive rating of Q.O. with an allowance of 2d. a day to be paid to Seamen and Marines qualified to perform auxiliary armament work:

“And whereas owing to the limited armament at St. Helena it is unnecessary to employ Ordnance Artificers—Armourers' duties being adequately performed by Royal Marines:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment,

as from the 11th day of March, 1927, of a continuous allowance of one shilling a day to Royal Marines employed as Armourers at St. Helena; non-substantive pay as Q.O. not to be payable while the appointment is held.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 69 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliament and Government of Northern Ireland and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any provision of the said Act; and in particular His Majesty is empowered amongst other things

by any such Order in Council to make such adaptation of any enactments as appear to Him necessary or proper with respect to the execution of reserved services:

And whereas the public services in connection with the Supreme Court of Northern Ireland are reserved services:

And whereas subsection (5) of section 28 of the Purchase of Land (Ireland) Act, 1891, as adapted by Orders made under the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, provides that if and when the Judicial Commissioner is temporarily unable to attend, or his office is vacant, the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland may nominate any Judge of the High Court of Northern Ireland to act temporarily in his place, and the Judge so nominated shall during such inability or vacancy have the same jurisdiction as if he were the Judicial Commissioner:

And whereas by the Land Purchase (Northern Ireland) Order, 1923, the powers of the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland under the said subsection were saved notwithstanding anything in that Order:

And whereas in consequence of the smallness of the number of Judges of the High Court of Northern Ireland as constituted by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, it is necessary, in order to prevent the dislocation of judicial business, that the power aforesaid should be exercisable, not only with respect to Judges of the High Court, but also the Judges of the Court of Appeal of Northern Ireland:

And whereas it is necessary, on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order, that this Order should come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Land Purchase (Northern Ireland) Order, 1927, and shall come into operation provisionally as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

2. Subsection (5) of section 28 of the Purchase of Land (Ireland) Act, 1891, shall have effect as if for the words "judge of the High Court" there were substituted the words "judge of the Supreme Court."

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the exercise of the powers of the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland if he is unable to attend or in the event of a vacancy in the office:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Supreme Court of Judicature (Northern Ireland) Order, 1927, and shall have effect subject to any subsequent Order in Council made under the Government of Ireland Act, 1920.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. Anything which by virtue of the said recited Order in Council is authorised or required to be done to or by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland may, if the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland is temporarily unable to attend, or his office is vacant, during such inability or vacancy be done to or by the Senior Lord Justice of Appeal in Northern Ireland for the time being.

Provided that nothing in this Order shall confer on such Senior Lord Justice the power of making any permanent appointment to any office.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913 (53 and 54 Vict., c. 37, and 3 and 4 Geo. V., c. 16), or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. The limits of this Order are the limits of the Orders set out in the Schedule hereto.

II. Except with the consent, signified in writing to the Court, of the officer commanding the force to which the person belongs, no Court established, within the limits of this Order, by Order in Council made in pursuance of the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts shall exercise criminal jurisdiction over a person subject to military law and being on active service in respect of any charge for which he is liable to be tried in accordance with military law.

III. For the purposes of this Order the expression "military law" includes the Army Act, the Naval Discipline Act, the Air Force Act and the Indian Army Act, 1911, and the expression "person subject to military law" includes all persons subject to any one of the said Acts.

IV. In this Order the expression "on active service" has the same meaning as in the Army Act, and if any question arises as to whether a person is on active service a certificate under the hand of the officer commanding the force to which such person belongs shall be conclusive for the purposes of this Order.

V. Nothing in this Order shall deprive any person of any defence which would have been open to him in any proceedings, civil or criminal, or of any immunity from the jurisdiction of the Court which he would have possessed, if this Order had not been made.

VI. This Order may be cited as "The Foreign Jurisdiction (Military Forces) Order in Council, 1927," and shall come into force on publication in the London Gazette.

And the Right Honourable Sir Austen Chamberlain, K.G., and the Right Honourable the Earl of Birkenhead, two of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS by Section 200 and the Fifth Schedule of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, power is given to His Majesty by Order in Council to make provision as to the use of anti-scorbutics other than lime or lemon juice of such quality and composed of such materials, and packed and kept in such manner and served out at such times and in such quantities as His Majesty may direct:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act, or of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to give the following directions, as regards the provision of Concentrated Orange Juice as an anti-scorbutic on board every ship navigating between the United Kingdom and any place out of the same, except in the case of

(a) Ships bound to European ports or ports in the Mediterranean Sea, and

(b) Such ships or classes of ships bound to ports on the eastern coast of America, north of the thirty-fifth degree of north latitude, and to any islands or places in the Atlantic Ocean north of the same limit as the Board of Trade may exempt:—

1. The concentrated orange juice shall contain not less than 70 per cent. of total soluble solids by weight. It shall be free from signs of alcoholic fermentation and contain no mould growths. It shall be so prepared and stored that there is no material loss of vitamin potency.

2. The concentrated orange juice shall be prepared from the fresh juice of sound oranges free from fermentation and moulds with the addition of the best cane sugar only, and shall not contain any added colouring matter, chemical preservatives, nor metallic impurities.

The quantity of cane sugar to be added shall not exceed 20 per cent. by weight of the finished product.

The preparation or concentration of the juice shall be carried out in vacuo, at a temperature not exceeding 50° centigrade.

3. The concentrated orange juice shall be supplied in glass bottles containing not more than one pint. The bottles shall be filled to the neck, properly closed and secured and shall bear an adhesive label with the date of manufacture and the volume of the contents stated in fluid ounces, and no concentrated orange juice shall be used as an anti-scorbutic for the crew or passengers of any ship after two years from such date of manufacture. The concentrated orange juice both before and after being placed on board the vessel shall be kept in cold storage.

4. Every brand of concentrated orange juice shall be submitted to the Board of Trade for their approval and no brand of concentrated orange juice shall be deemed fit and proper to be taken on board any ship for the use of the crew or passengers thereon unless it is shown by a certificate under the hand of an Inspector appointed by the Board of Trade to be proper for use on board ship.

5. The concentrated orange juice shall be served out to the crew so soon as they have been at sea for 10 days and during the remainder of the voyage except during such times as they are in harbour and are there supplied with fresh provisions.

6. The concentrated orange juice shall be served out daily at the rate of one-half fluid ounce each per day to each member of the crew and shall be mixed with six times its volume of water before being served out. The juice shall not be diluted before the day on which it is to be served and shall be served out in sufficient quantity to each mess or

watch at the dinner hour so that it may be obtained by the crew in time to drink during their meal.

7. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Anti-Scorbutics) Order in Council, 1927.

(2) The Diocese of the said Bishopric shall consist of the present Archdeaconry of Surrey, now in the Diocese of Winchester, and the ecclesiastical Parishes of Aldershot; Aldershot, Holy Trinity; Ash with Ash Vale; Cove; Crondall; Crookham; Ewshott; Farnborough; Farnborough, Saint Mark; Fleet; Hawley; Minley; Yateley; in the said Diocese of Winchester.

(3) The Parish Church of the Holy Trinity, Guildford, subject to the rights of the Patron and the Incumbent of that Church, shall be the Cathedral Church of the said Bishopric.

(4) The Bishop of Guildford is constituted a Body Corporate and is hereby invested with all such rights, privileges and jurisdictions as are possessed by any other Bishop in England, and is subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

(5) This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, 1927.

(3) The Parish Church of Saint Thomas, Portsmouth, subject to the rights of the Patrons and the Incumbent of that Church, shall be the Cathedral Church of the said Bishopric.

(4) The Bishop of Portsmouth is constituted a Body Corporate and is hereby invested with all such rights, privileges and jurisdictions as are possessed by any other Bishop in England, and is subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

(5) This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, 1927.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Monk Hopton and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Upton Cressett, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Salop and in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Martin Linton,

Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Monk Hopton and Upton Cressett duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Monk Hopton and Upton Cressett are now full, the Reverend Samuel Gracie Hayward being the present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas the said Samuel Gracie Hayward has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Monk Hopton:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Monk Hopton and the said Benefice of Upton Cressett shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Upton Cressett with Monk Hopton' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Samuel Gracie Hayward if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Monk Hopton and Upton Cressett shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Monk Hopton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Monk Hopton having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Upton Cressett having the right of presentation upon the second pre-

sentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Alphamstone and Lamarsh duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Chelmsford embodies certain modifications thereof:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Cyril, late Bishop of Peterborough, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Preston Deanery and Quinton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Peterborough and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Peterborough signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Preston Deanery and Quinton are at present vacant:

" And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Quinton:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Claude, now Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Preston Deanery and the said Benefice of Quinton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Quinton with Preston Deanery' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Quinton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Quinton having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Preston Deanery having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Peterborough has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

" And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate

District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

" And whereas by a certain Deed of Grant bearing date on or about the 7th day of April, 1927, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the ' New Parishes Acts 1843, 1844 and 1856 ' or some or one of them between the Reverend Joseph Percy Noel Potter, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of West Derby, of the first part, the Reverend Percy Stewart, of Poles-acre, Crawley, in the County of Sussex, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Patron of the said Rectory of the Parish of West Derby, of the second part, the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of the Parish of West Derby, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part, the said Joseph Percy Noel Potter did, with the consents of the said Percy Stewart, as such Patron as aforesaid, and of the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, as such Bishop as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors and, when such District shall have become a New Parish then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish and to his successors for the time being, two perpetual clear yearly rent charges or net annual sums of £150 and £200 respectively to be payable quarterly on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in every year, free from and clear of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any) and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all that the said Rectory of the Parish of West Derby and the Tithes or Tithe Commutation Rent Charges, Glebe Lands and hereditaments, and all other the endowments and emoluments for the time being to the said Rectory belonging, the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £150 to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the date of the licence of the first Minister of the said proposed District and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the said licence to the said quarterly day of payment, and the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £200 to be made on such of the said quarterly days of payment as shall happen next after the date of the said licence or after the date of the cessation of the pension payable out of the revenues of the said Rectory of the Parish of West Derby to the said Percy Stewart, the retired Rector of West Derby, whichever date shall be the later, and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the last mentioned date to the said quarterly day of payment:

" And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors, such grant to cease upon the date of the cessation of the above mentioned pension pay-

able out of the revenues of the said Rectory of the Parish of West Derby to the said Percy Stewart:

" And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

" And whereas the said two yearly rent charges of £150 and £200 respectively have been granted by the said Joseph Percy Noel Potter as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas the said Joseph Percy Noel Potter has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Liverpool as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of West Derby which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named ' The District of Saint Andrew, Clubmoor.'

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of the said Diocese of Liverpool, and his successors, for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Saint Andrew, Clubmoor, being:—

" All that part of the Parish of West Derby, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon the north by the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Walton on the Hill, upon the west partly by the Parish of Walton on the Hill, partly by the District of Saint Columba, Anfield, and partly by the New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, West Derby, all in the said County and Diocese, upon the south by the last named New Parish, upon the south east by the New Parish of Saint James, West Derby, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, West Derby, from the said Parish of West Derby at the centre of the bridge which carries Three But Lane across the line of the Cheshire Lines Railway, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 1 mile and 8 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said Parish of West Derby, the New Parish of Emmanuel, Fazakerley, in the said County and Diocese, and the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Walton on the Hill, all meet."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the said Parish of West Derby, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

MINISTRY OF HEALTH.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1925.

By an Order dated 11th April, 1927, the Minister of Health has consented (1) to the adoption of Section 21 (prevention of water flowing on footpath), Section 22 (preventing soil &c. from being washed into streets), Section 44 (offensive trades) and the Sections contained in Part V (watercourses &c.) of the above Act by the Town Council of Berwick-upon-Tweed and the Urban District Councils of Loftus and The Matlocks; (2) to the adoption of Sections 21 and 22 and the Sections contained in Part V of the Act by the Urban District Council of Egham; (3) to the adoption of Sections 21 and 22 of the Act by the Urban District Council of Thurlstone; and (4) to the adoption of the Sections contained in Part V of the Act by the Urban District Council of Sandown.

DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS, 1877 AND 1907.

SALE OF DISEASED PLANTS ORDER OF 1927.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the above Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit the sale or exposure for sale in England and Wales, for planting of any plants substantially attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the First Schedule to the Order, or any plant which bears evidence of having been substantially attacked by the insect mentioned in the Second Schedule.

The pests mentioned in the First Schedule include Fruit Tree Cankers, American Gooseberry Mildew, Silver Leaf, Black Currant Mite, Woolly Aphis, all Scale Insects, Brown Tail Moth, Rhododendron Bug and Powdery or Corky Scab of potatoes, and the Apple Capsid is mentioned in the Second Schedule.

The expression "plant" includes trees and shrubs, and seeds, tubers, bulbs, layers, cuttings or any other parts of a plant.

Every person who has had in his possession for sale or has sold, offered or exposed for sale, any plant of which the sale is prohibited must, if required, give information as to the person in whose possession such plant is or has been, and any auctioneer, salesman, nurseryman or other person on becoming acquainted that he has in his possession or under his charge any such plant, shall take steps to prevent its sale or movement. An Inspector of the Ministry may enter any premises on which plants are sold, offered or exposed or grown for sale and examine any plants on such premises. An Inspector may also, at any time, require any person to destroy or disinfect any plant of which the sale is prohibited or to take such other steps as may be considered necessary to prevent the spread of the disease.

A penalty of £10 may be imposed on any person who sells, offers or exposes for sale or causes to be sold, offered or exposed for sale, any plants of which the sale is prohibited, or fails to give information regarding such plants, or fails to take such steps to destroy or disinfect such plant as he may be required to take, or wilfully obstructs or impedes an Inspector in the exercise of his powers of entry or examination.

The American Gooseberry Mildew Order of 1919, and the Sale of Diseased Plants Order of 1922 are revoked.

NORTHUMBERLAND (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1927.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1) The Local Authorities of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep) for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours

between sunset and sunrise be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the Districts, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the NORTH-UMBERLAND (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1927.

(Power to Neyland Urban District Council to take a lease of Gas Works of Great Western Railway Company and utilise additional lands in the Urban District for Gas Works purposes; Price of gas; Further provisions as to supply of Gas; Borrowing of money; Incorporation, Repeal and Amendment of Acts and other matters).

1. To authorise the Council upon the lands hereinbefore described, or some part or parts thereof to maintain, alter, extend, renew or improve works for the manufacture, storage, conversion, utilisation and distribution of gas and of residual products arising from such manufacture, and to make and store gas, and to make, store, purchase, utilise and distribute all such residual products and materials as aforesaid, and upon such lands to construct and maintain houses, buildings and other works connected with their gas undertaking.

3. So far as may be necessary or desirable to sanction and confirm the leasing by the Council of the lands hereinbefore described, and to empower the Council to acquire additional lands for the purposes of their gas undertaking.

4. To confer further powers upon the Council with reference to the purchase and utilisation of residual products arising from the manufacture of gas.

5. To empower the Council to continue to charge for gas supplied by them to consumers by meter a price not exceeding eight shillings and threepence per thousand cubic feet.

6. To make further provision with regard to the supply of gas by the Council, and in particular to provide for the following matters:—The allowance of discount for prompt payment of gas charges; the relief of the Council from obligation to supply for any purpose other than lighting or domestic use where the capacity of the main is insufficient; provisions as to the mode of cutting off supplies by the Council and the expenses of re-connecting any discontinued supply; the giving of notice to discontinue a supply and the giving of notice before removing; further power to the Council to enter premises for the purpose of removing pipes and apparatus where supplies of gas are discontinued; power to lay pipes and apparatus for conducting oil or other materials; requiring the provision of valves in cases where high pressure air is used in connection with the consumption or use of gas; the charge for supply where the consumer has a separate supply; the construction and placing of pipes, etc.; the provision of

dwelling houses for employees, offices, show-rooms, etc.; the provision of anti-fluctuators in connection with gas engines; the date when erroneous registration shall be deemed to have arisen in a defective meter; licences for the use of patents; power to refuse to supply persons in debt for other premises; and the inclusion of several sums due from a person in one summons or warrant.

7. To authorise the Council to borrow money for the purchase of land and the construction of works and for other the purposes of the Order and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the District Fund and General District Rate of the district and the undertakings, estates, rates, rents, revenue and other property of the Council or of any such securities and to execute and grant and issue mortgages and other securities, to provide that moneys borrowed under the powers of the Order shall not be reckoned within the limit of borrowing prescribed by the Public Health Act, 1875.

8. To repeal, alter or amend or to re-enact or incorporate in the Order, with or without amendment, some or all of the provisions of the Neyland Gas Order, 1904, and any other Act or Order relating to the Council or the Company.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 27th day of May, 1927. Any such objection shall state:

- (a) The specific ground of objection, and
- (b) The omissions, additions or modifications asked for.
