The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 28th day of June, 1927, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923":—

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, JUNE 28, 1927.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide by the Statutes of the University of Oxford that there shall be an Aldrichian Praelector in Chemistry,

and that the Praelectorship shall be held by one of the University Demonstrators appointed by the Board of the Faculty of the Physical Sciences: NOW the said University in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

1. In *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. II. E. § 3. (Statuta, ed. 1926, p. 82)*, the words from "in apparatus chemicum" to "visum fuerit" shall be struck out and the following words shall be substituted: "in demonstratoris stipendium."

2. In *Statt. Tit. V. Sect. VII. (p. 140)*, at the end of cl. 1 the following words shall be added:—"One of the University Demonstrators appointed by the Board of the Faculty of the Physical Sciences shall hold the title of Aldrichian Praelector in Chemistry and shall receive, in addition to any stipend assigned to him by the General Board, the emoluments of the Praelectorship as specified in *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. II. E. § 3* provided that his total stipend as Demonstrator and Praelector shall not exceed £750 a year."

The Home Secretary gives notice, that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and male young persons of 16 years of age and over in the Grinding Department at the works of The British Barytes, Limited, Silkstone Common, near Barnsley, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable washing facilities, cloak-room and messroom accommodation shall be provided; that a woman or male young person shall not be allowed to lift, carry or move anything so heavy as to be likely to cause injury to such woman or male young person; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE
BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO FIX GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES AND TO VARY THE OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS IN THE MUNICIPAL BOROUGH OF MACCLESFIELD IN THE COUNTY OF CHESHIRE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909 by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st April, 1927, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for those branches of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which are covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 6th August, 1924, with respect to the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade in England and Wales HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Piece-Rates and to Vary the Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers in the Municipal Borough of Macclesfield in the County of Cheshire by providing:—

(1) that in the Municipal Borough of Macclesfield the General Minimum Piece-Rates for the classes of Male Workers specified in Part V of the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (W.L.) 2, dated 9th July, 1927, shall be the General Minimum Piece-Rates applicable under Part V of the Notice R.B. (W.L.) 2, in Area A (2);

(2) that the Overtime Rates in respect of the workers coming within the terms of Paragraph (1) of this Notice shall be calculated as provided in Paragraph 34 of the Notice R.B. (W.L.) 2.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal which may be lodged with them within two months from the 12th day of July, 1927. Such

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE AREA COMPRISING THE MUNICIPAL BOROUGH OF GODALMING AND GUILDFORD IN THE COUNTY OF SURREY.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st April, 1927, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for those Branches of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which are covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 6th August, 1924, with respect to the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade in England and Wales, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, as set out in the Notices R.B. (22) and R.B. (23) issued by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), and dated 28th February, 1923, in their application to workers employed in the area comprising the Municipal Boroughs of Godalming and Guildford in the County of Surrey, and to fix General Minimum Piece-Rates for certain classes of Male Workers in such area, as follows, that is to say, by providing that the Minimum Rates applicable to workers employed in the area comprising the Municipal Boroughs of Godalming and Guildford of the several classes specified in the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (S.E.) 2, dated 9th July, 1927, shall be the Minimum Rates specified in such Notice R.B. (S.E.) 2, and applicable in Area B.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposal which may be lodged with them within two months from the 12th July, 1927. VARIATION OF MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND FIXING OF GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE RATES.

The Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales) have issued Notices dated 9th July, 1927, setting out General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers as varied by the Trade Board, together with the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates which remain unaffected by the variation, as respects all Areas within the jurisdiction of the Trade Board except Wales, Lancashire (Eastern part), and Westmorland, together with General Minimum Piece-Rates for certain classes of Male Workers fixed by the Trade Board as respects all Areas within the jurisdiction of the Trade Board except Wales, Lancashire (Eastern part), Westmorland and Yorkshire, the variation in Minimum Rates and the General Minimum Piece-Rates fixed having been confirmed by Order of the Minister of Labour, to take effect as from 18th July, 1927.

4. If an animal is moved or otherwise dealt with in contravention of this Order or of the conditions of a licence granted thereunder, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 :—

So much of the parishes of Bowland Forest Higher Division, Bowland Forest Lower Division, Easington, Slaidburn, Newton, Bentham, Clapham-cum-Newby, Austwick, Lawkland, Giggleswick, Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Gisburn Forest, Tosside, Bolton-by-Bowland, Sawley, Grindleton, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Eaves and Great Mitton as lies within the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Bolton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via
