IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport after the expiration of at least forty days from this date in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 7 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act to make regulations amending the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925 (S.R. and O. 1925, No. 322), the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Regulations, 1925

(S.R. and O. 1925, No. 806), and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1927. (S.R. and O. 1927, No. 576), with respect to streets which by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925 (S.R. and O. 1925, No. 179), the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925 (S.R. and O. 1925, No. 549), and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1927 (S.R. and O. 1927, No. 351), have been declared by the Minister of Transport to be "Restricted Streets."

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Minister of Transport has under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Amendment (Route No. 14) Provisional Regulations, 1927, to come into operation forthwith as provisional regulations to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.
