The KING has approved of the following alterations in the Regulations for Civil Uniform:—

(1) The present First Class Uniform shall in future be designated "Privy Counsellor's Uniform," and shall be worn only by Members of His Majesty's Privy Council and by Members of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland.

(2) The introduction of a new First Class Uniform differentiated in the following manner from the Privy Counsellor's Uniform:—

(a) The embroidered edging throughout both Full Dress and Levée Coats to be wavy and to be worked with rough purls. An example of the above edging can be seen at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, S.W. 1.

(b) The width of the embroidery, exclusive of the edging, to be 4½ inches instead of 5 inches.

(c) The hat to have treble gold bullion loop and tassels without hangers.

All persons in possession of Civil Uniforms made in accordance with previous Regulations may continue to wear them as heretofore.

GENERAL WASTE MATERIALS RE-CLAMATION TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS, AND TO FIX A GUARANTEED TIME-RATE FOR A CERTAIN CLASS OF FEMALE LEARNER.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st April, 1927, the General Waste Materials Reclamation Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates (and the Overtime Rates based thereon) for Female Workers set out in Part I of their Notice D.B. (7) dated 30th January, 1923, and the General Minimum Time-Rates (and the Overtime Rates based thereon) for Male Workers set out in Part II of the aforementioned Notice D.B. (7), and in Part I of their Notice D.B. (9) dated 14th November, 1923, and to fix a Guaranteed Time-Rate for Female Learners in the Woollen Rag and Woollen and Worsted Waste Materials Section of the Trade.

Full particulars of the proposed Minimum Rates will be supplied on application being made to the Secretary of the Trade Board by or on behalf of persons engaged in the trade.

Under Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will CONSIDER ANY OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from the 23rd day of August, 1927. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, General Waste Materials Reclamation Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1. It is desirable that objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
