PART I.

Contraction of Selston (Notts) Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 47) shall be read and have effect as if the Area numbered 1 described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area numbered 1 described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Further Contraction of Cornwall Infected Area.

2.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 47) shall be read and have effect as if the Area numbered 2 described in the Second Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area numbered 2 described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Further Contraction of Cheshire and Yorks. (West Riding) Infected Areas.

3.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 47) shall be read and have effect as if the Areas numbered 3 and 7 described in the Third Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Areas numbered 3 and 7 described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

PART II.

Release of Areas from Restrictions.

MORECAMBE CORPORATION.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Morecambe and the Urban District Council of Heysham (hereinafter called "the Corporation," "the Borough" and "the District Council" respectively) for an Act of which the principal subject matters are as follows:—

To alter the boundary of the borough so as to include therein the urban district of Heysham (hereinafter referred to as "the Urban District").

To change the name of the Borough.

To alter and extend the boundary of the Parish of Morecambe in the Lancaster Union so as to include in the said Parish the parish of Heysham and to provide for financial and other adjustments between the Parish of Morecambe and the Lancaster Union.

To extend to the Urban District the powers, rights, privileges, liabilities and obligations of the Corporation and to make applicable thereto all or some of the enactments now in force within the existing borough in lieu of all or some of those now in force within the urban district.

To abolish the Heysham Urban District Council.

To provide that the Corporation shall be the Burial Board for the extended Borough.

To enact all necessary, convenient or consequential provisions with regard to such alterations and extensions including provisions as to municipal, county and poor law elections; the number of councillors and aldermen of the borough and guardians of the parish of Morecambe as extended; the alteration and increase of wards in the borough and the parish of Morecambe as extended; the allocation, election and retirement of councillors and aldermen and guardians; the extension of jurisdiction of officers of the Corporation and of justices and other officers; the representation of county electoral divisions; the extension and amendment of local Acts and Orders &c.; alteration or repeal of Sections 35 and 36 of the Lancaster Corporation Act 1918 with regard to the supply of water in bulk for the extended borough; rates and charges for water to be the same over the whole borough as extended; the transfer of officers and abolition of offices and compensation for loss; the transfer of schools and the extension or alteration of education schemes in force in the Borough or in the urban district and the alteration of the constitution of any Education Committees acting in and for the urban district; the adjustment of property; financial relations between bodies affected; to provide for the confirmation in office of the representatives of the Borough and Urban District on the Assessment Committee for the Lancaster Assessment area and any consequential provisions with regard to assessment and county valuation Committees; provisions as to mortgage and to other debts of the district council and the Corporation, the liquidation of debts, provisions as to differential rating in the urban district and other matters.

To empower the Corporation to make and maintain the works hereinafter described all of which will be situate in the Urban District, together with all necessary sea walls, promenades, street improvements, pleasure grounds, gardens, walks and works connected therewith:—

Work No. 1.—An improvement of the existing sea wall promenade and street works known as Marine Road together with a protective wall commencing at a point on the existing promenade in line with the South side of Bold Street and terminating at a point on the said existing promenade in line with the North side of Sefton Road.

Work No. 2.—A sea wall, promenade, protective wall, street and road works, gardens and pleasure grounds commencing at the termination of Work No. 1 and terminating at a point in the existing sea wall in line with the South side of Snowden Avenue.

Work No. 5.—A sea wall, promenade retaining and protective walls gardens and pleasure grounds commencing at the termination of Work No. 4 and terminating at the Northern end of the existing sea wall opposite Whinnysty Lane.

Powers of deviation and subsidiary works.

To empower the Corporation for the purposes of the proposed works to enter upon, take and use or to purchase or acquire by compulsion or agreement lands, houses, or buildings or easements in the Urban District and to provide that no compensation shall be payable in respect of any land or foreshore taken for the purposes of Works Nos. 1, 2 and 3 and that in assessing the amount of compensation to be paid by the Corporation in respect of lands or foreshore required for the purposes of the remainder of the works no sums shall be payable in respect of any work constructed for the purpose of sea defence and to enact other modifications of the Lands Clauses Acts.

The breaking up and interference with highways, bridges, streets, roads, passages, railways, gas and water mains sewers, drains, pipes, wires, and other works and to remove obstructions and make junctions and communications with and within and alter existing streets and to lay out as carriageways and footways as the Corporation think fit in the Urban district.

To provide for extinction without compensation of private rights of way and to enable the Corporation and their officers agents and workmen to enter premises for survey and other purposes.

The enactment of special provisions for determining compensation payable in respect of lands acquired by the Corporation in the Urban District including provisions as to betterment, buildings recently erected and interests recently created and that no compensation shall be payable in respect of any enhancement of value of any land the Corporation are authorised to acquire under the powers of the Bill by reason of any works carried out by the Corporation, power to lay out and develop such lands, agreements with landowners for re-instatement or exchange, the enactment of further provisions for the acquisition by the Corporation of land by agreement for the benefit of the borough and the exercise of their powers and duties and for the development of lands.

To provide for imposing improvement rates and charges upon certain lands in the Urban District and upon the owners lessees and occupiers and other persons interested in such lands together with all necessary provisions for specifying ascertaining fixing periods for payment recovery applications apportionment, and redemption of such rates or charges such lands will include—

(a) The lands property and houses of which the seaward or western boundary is the foreshore of the Irish Sea the northern boundary Bold Street the eastern boundary an imaginary line drawn from the north-eastern corner of the Battery Hotel along the western boundary of Heysham Road to the centre of a street called Grosvenor Road thence along the centre of Grosvenor Road to a point in line with the north-eastern corner of the Grosvenor Hotel building thence along the south-eastern side of the said hotel building to and along the western side of the back street immediately west of Clayton Road or Rydal Grove to and along the northern boundary of Rydal Road to the foreshore of the Irish Sea.

(b) The lands property and houses of which the seaward or Western boundary is the foreshore of the Irish Sea and the North-eastern boundary is an imaginary line drawn from a point in the existing sea wall in line with the boundary fence 60 yards or thereabouts South West of the Southern side of Oakley Road to and along the Southern boundary of the residence known as Cliffe Hollow thence along the centre of the accommodation road to Seawell Avenue and thence in a straight line across Seawell Avenue thence in a Southerly direction for 50 yards or thereabouts thence in a South-westerly direction for a distance of 35 yards or thereabouts and thence again in a southerly direction to and along the Eastern boundary of the property known as Mallerahay to the Northern side of Wrights Avenue or Ferncliffe Drive thence in a South-westerly direction across Wrights Avenue or Ferncliffe Drive to a point in line with the North eastern corner of the house known as 12 Royds Avenue thence in a Southerly direction across Royds Avenue to the Northern boundary of Whinnysty Lane and along the said Northern boundary of Whinnysty Lane to the foreshore of the Irish Sea.

To empower the Corporation to acquire from the London Midland and Scottish Railway

Company by agreement the pier harbour jetty foreshore land sidings and works or part thereof belonging to that Company situate in the borough and known as Morecambe Harbour and to make all necessary provisions as to the termination of some of the powers rights duties and obligations of the Company and vesting in the Corporation of such powers as may be necessary and as to abandoning and appropriating the site or such part as may be acquired for such purposes as the Corporation think fit and the Ministry of Health may sanction.

To make provision for the regulation of the promenade proposed to be authorised by the Bill the seashore and the approaches to the seashore and to prohibit the removal of sand shingle &c. from the seashore without the licence of the Corporation.

To provide as to the application of the provisions of the Acts and Orders of the Corporation to omnibuses as part of their tramway undertaking notwithstanding the discontinuance of the working and removal of the tramways.

The borrowing of money by the Corporation for the purposes of the Bill and other financial matters.

The incorporation repeal or amendment of Acts (both local and general) and Orders.
