Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by Section 8 (2) of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to declare and it is hereby declared that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, shall henceforth apply to the drugs benzoyl - morphine, dihydro - oxycodeinone,

dihydrocodeinone and their respective salts and to any preparation, admixture and extract containing benzoyl-morphine, dihydro-oxycodeinone or dihydrocodeinone.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Stanley Road at its junction with Park Street, thence southward along the centre of Stanley Road to its intersection with Trinity Road, thence westward along the centre of Trinity Road to its intersection with Pembroke Road, thence southward along the centre of Pembroke Road and Queens Road to the junction of Queens Road with the Borough boundary, thence eastward and northward following the Borough boundary to its junction with the southern boundary of Derby Ward, westward, westward, northward, northward and westward following the southern boundary of Derby Ward herein-before described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Mersey Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Stanley Road over the centre of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal, thence westward along the centre of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal to a point under the centre of Coffee House Bridge, thence north-westward along the centre of Coffee House Bridge and Irlam Road to the junction of Irlam Road with Church Street, thence westward along the centre of Church Street to its western terminus and continuing westward following a straight line from the centre of and continuing the line of Church Street to the junction of the said straight line with the Borough boundary in the centre of the River Mersey, thence southward and eastward following the Borough boundary to its junction with the southern boundary of Stanley Ward, thence northward, eastward and northward following the western boundaries of Stanley Ward and Derby Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

" II. APPORTIONMENT OF COUNCILLORS.

"The existing Councillors shall continue to represent the Wards of the same name for which they were respectively elected, and shall retire from office on the dates on which they would have retired if this Scheme had not been made, and the three additional Councillors to be elected under this Scheme shall be elected for the Orrell Ward.

" III. INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

"(1)—(a) On the ordinary day of election of Councillors in 1928 there shall be held for the Orrell Ward an election of

"(i) one Councillor to fill the vacancy caused by the retirement of the Councillor due to go out of office in 1928;

" (ii) three additional Councillors.

"(b) Of the Councillors who shall be elected in 1928 for the Orrell Ward, there shall go out of office on the ordinary day of election of Councillors in the years hereunder specified:—

one in the year 1929; one in the year 1930; two in the year 1931.

"(c) Of the four Councillors elected in 1928 for the Orrell Ward, the Councillor elected by the smallest number of votes shall go out of office in the year 1929, and the Councillor elected by the next smallest number of votes shall go out of office in the year 1930.

"(3) If for any reason it is doubtful which of the Councillors elected in 1928 for the Orrell Ward ought to retire in the years specified in this Scheme, the question shall be determined at the first or second meeting of the Council after the election by lot under the direction of the Mayor or other person presiding at that Meeting

Meeting.

"(4) Any election held before the 15th October, 1928, to fill a casual vacancy amongst the existing Councillors of the Borough shall be held for the existing Ward for which the Councillor whose death or retirement caused

the vacancy was elected.

"5. If the Register of Electors is not so framed as to show the Local Government electors entitled to vote at any election of Councillors of the Borough to be held for any of the Wards as altered by this Scheme, it shall be the duty of the Registration Officer

for the Parliamentary Borough of Bootle to make such alteration or re-arrangements of the Register as may be necessary for the purpose of such election.

manner as they apply to India, and, in particular, such Order in Council may determine the Court by which the jurisdiction conferred by those provisions is to be exercised:

And whereas the Colony of Kenya is a part of His Majesty's dominions other than a self-governing dominion as aforesaid:

And whereas it is expedient to provide for applying the aforesaid provisions of the said Act to the Colony of Kenya:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in the exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act, 1926, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order in Council may be cited as the Kenya Divorce Jurisdiction Order in Council, 1928.
- 2. On and after the first day of October, 1928, the provisions of the first section of the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act, 1926, shall apply to the Colony of Kenya in like manner as they apply to India.
- 3. In the application of the said provisions to the said Colony—
 - (a) The Court which is to exercise the jurisdiction thereby conferred shall be the Supreme Court of Kenya, and references in the said first section to a High Court in India shall be read as references to such Supreme Court;
 - (b) references in the said first section to India shall be read as references to Kenya;
 and
 - (c) the reference to the Secretary of State in Council of India in the said section shall be read as referring to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of July, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 118, of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a new Archdeaconry within the Diocese of Guildford, for endowing such new Archdeaconry, and for re-arranging the Rural Deaneries within the same Diocese:

"Whereas the said Diocese of Guildford now comprises one Archdeaconry and no more, namely, the Archdeaconry of Surrey:

"And whereas the Right Reverend John Harold, Bishop of Guildford, has represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that a new Archdeaconry should be constituted within the said Diocese of Guildford and should comprise the Rural Deaneries which are hereinafter mentioned and which are at present within the said Archdeaconry of Surrey and within the said Diocese of Guildford, that such new Archdeaconry should be endowed in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed, and that certain new arrangements (being the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed) should be made with respect to the Rural Deaneries within the said Diocese of Diocese Deaneries within the said Guildford:

"And whereas it appears to us to be undesirable that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees should be received by the Archdeacon of the said proposed new Archdeaconry:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that by reason of the discontinuance of the collection of the said fees there will be no annual income available for the said proposed Archdeaconry from fees, dues and emoluments and that the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed will not be such as to raise the annual income of the said proposed Archdeaconry to an amount exceeding £300:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said John Harold, Bishop of Guildford (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme) humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order one new Archdeaconry shall be created within the said Diocese of Guildford; that such Archdeaconry shall be named 'The Archdeaconry of Dorking,' and that each of the said Arch-deaconries of Surrey and Dorking shall comprise and consist of those Rural Deaneries, the names of which are set down in order under its name and are numbered consecutively in the Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and that the name which in such Schedule is given to any Rural Deanery shall be the name thereof and that every Parish or Cure or Church the name of which is set down in numbered order under the name of any Rural Deanery in the first Column of the said

Schedule, shall belong to and be a part of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeaconry under the name of which it so appears as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean and Archdeacon thereof and shall not any longer belong to or be part of any other Rural Deanery or of any other Archdeaconry or be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Rural Deans and other the Clergy and the inhabitants generally of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Dorking shall be under and subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction, authority and control of the Archdeacon of such proposed Archdeaconry for the time being and that such Archdeacon shall have and exercise all the rights powers and duties of an Archdeacon within the limits of his Archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that we be authorised to pay by equal quarterly instalments on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July and the 1st day of October in every year out of the Common Fund created by the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act to the Archdeacon of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Dorking and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry the yearly sum of £300, the instalment so first becoming due being an apportioned part only of the said sum of £300 in respect of the period between the date of the collation of the first Archdeacon of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Dorking and the first quarterly day of payment next ensuing: provided always that every payment in respect of the said yearly sum of £500 shall be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

"And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees, or induction fees shall not be receivable by the Archdeacon of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Dorking and that all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £300 shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act or Measure.

Lord Bishop of Wakefield, and the Right Reverend Edward Arthur, Lord Bishop of Ripon, do, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby represent to

your Grace:

"That belonging to the parish of Allerton Bywater in the County of York and Diocese of Ripon and subject to the jurisdiction of the aforesaid Bishop of Ripon there is the District called Lock Lane which said District is coloured pink on the map or plan attached hereto and is distant from the church of the said parish of Allerton Bywater upwards of two miles and has a population of Two thousand two hundred and fourteen persons or thereabouts. And the said parish of Allerton Bywater contains a population exclusive of the said District of Lock Lane of Four thousand persons or thereabouts.

"That the said District of Lock Lane is contiguous to the Parish of Castleford in the said County of York and Diocese of Wakefield and within the distance of half a mile of the church of the parish of Castleford and which last mentioned parish has a population of Thirteen thousand nine hundred persons or

thereabouts.

"That the clear annual value of the said Vicarage of Allerton Bywater amounts to the sum of Four hundred and fifty pounds or thereabouts and that no part of the said endowment arises from Tithe rent charge or other profits accruing from the said District of Lock Lane.

of Lock Lane.

"That it appears to us the said Bishop of Wakefield and the Bishop of Ripon that the said District of Lock Lane may under the provisions of the before mentioned Act be advantageously separated from the said parish of Allerton Bywater and be annexed to the

said parish of Castleford.

"That the patron of the said parish of Allerton Bywater is the Reverend Emill Broughton Smith in right of his Vicarage of Kippax and the Patronage of the said Rectory of Castleford is vested in His Majesty in right

of His Duchy of Lancaster.

"That the Reverend James Bell, M.A., is the present Vicar of the Vicarage and parish church of Allerton Bywater and the Reverend John Edgar Eastwood, B.A., is the present Rector of the Rectory and parish church of Castleford and they are respectively consenting parties to this representation and the Scheme hereinafter mentioned.

"That pursuant to the direction of the aforesaid mentioned Act of Parliament we have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alteration proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe lands Tithes rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues rights and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties concerned."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"1. That the District of Lock Lane delineated on the plan attached hereto and coloured pink shall be severed from the parish of Allerton Bywater and be annexed to the parish of Castleford.

- "2. That the Cure of Souls and other clerical duties of the said district of Lock Lane belonging to the Incumbent of Allerton Bywater shall be transferred to the Incumbent of Castleford.
- "3. That there shall be no alteration in respect to Tithe rent charge and other ecclesiastical dues belonging to the said Vicarage of Allerton Bywater.
- "4. That the Patronage of the said Benefice of Allerton Bywater now vested in the Reverend Emill Broughton Smith in right of his Vicarage of Kippax shall not be altered.
- "5. That the Patronage of the benefice of Castleford now vested in His Majesty in right of His Duchy of Lancaster shall not be altered.
- "6. That the Inhabitants of the said District of Lock Lane shall subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868, be liable for the repairs of the parish church of Castleford in the same way as other Inhabitants of the parish of Castleford.
- "7. That the Inhabitants of the said District of Lock Lane shall be entitled to pews or seats in the church of Castleford in the same way as other Inhabitants of the said Parish of Castleford.
- "8. That the said District of Lock Lane shall on its being annexed to the said Parish of Castleford be transferred to the jurisdiction of the Lord Bishop of Wakefield and be considered to be in the Diocese of Wakefield.
- "9. And we do hereby submit the foregoing Representation and Scheme to your Grace and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with the same we request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents of the Patrons and Incumbents by your Report to His Majesty in Council pursuant to the Act of Parliament before referred to.

ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS, 1882 TO 1926.

For the purposes of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1926, and the Orders made and issued thereunder; and all Special Acts relating to the supply of electricity, the Electricity Commissioners approve of the system of supply described hereunder subject to the Regulations made by the Electricity Commissioners for securing the safety of the public and for ensuring a proper and sufficient supply of energy.

System of Supply.

A three phase alternating current supply at an extra high pressure of 6,600 volts (or 11,000 volts, or 22,000 volts, or 33,000 volts, or 49,500 volts, or 66,000 volts or 132,000 volts, as the case may be).

- (1) The supply will be given:-
- (a) for general supply at high pressure to transformers, converters or motors on the consumers' premises, or at medium or low pressure;
- (b) for traction purposes at medium pressure.
- (2) The extra high pressure and high pressure supply will be given by alternating current, and the medium pressure and low pressure supply will be given by alternating current or by direct current.
- (3) All alternating current will be at a frequency not varying from 50 complete cycles per second by more than 2½ per cent. plus or minus.

Mains.

(4) The mains will consist of insulated conductors laid together and enclosed in a lead sheath, or separate conductors insulated and enclosed in a lead sheath, and

either (a) braided, compounded and armoured, and laid direct in the ground, and covered with:—

- (i) wooden planks 2 inches thick, and (except for making up pieces and at bends) 10 feet long, and treated with preservative compound to prevent decay;
- (ii) reinforced concrete slabs, 3 feet long by 2 inches thick, and 6 inches wide, and suitably interlocked so as to prevent lateral displacement; or
- (iii) concrete, made in situ, 3 inches thick, of a minimum width of 9 inches, and overlapping the breadth of the mains by at least 2 inches on each side: or

by at least 2 inches on each side; or
(iv) hard burned tiles interlocked or
suitably arranged so as to prevent displacement;

or (b) drawn into pipes or ducts of approved design;

or (c) laid in troughs filled in with composition and covered with hard burned tiles or other approved protection held in position through contact with the filling in composition.

This approval shall apply in the case of extra high pressure systems adopted after the

date hereof in lieu of the prior approval of the Electricity Commissioners dated the 1st May, 1925, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th May, 1925.

Any joint electricity authority or authorised undertakers within the meaning of the abovementioned Acts adopting an extra high pressure system of supply in pursuance of this General Approval must notify the Electricity Commissioners in order that the Regulations as to Extra High Pressure for securing the safety of the public and for ensuring a proper and sufficient supply of electrical energy may be prescribed on such authority or undertakers where necessary.

Any extra high pressure system of supply other than that described above will require special approval by the Electricity Commis-
