GREETING!

Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to consider the general powers and duties of police in England and Wales in the investigation of crimes and offences, including the functions of the Director of Public Prosecutions and the police respectively; to inquire into the practice followed in interrogating or taking statements from persons interviewed in the course of the investigation of crime; and to report whether, in their opinion, such powers and duties are properly exercised and discharged, with due regard to the rights and liberties of the subject, interests of justice and the observances of the Judges' Rules, both in the letter and the spirit; and to make any recommendations necessary in respect of such powers and duties and their proper exercise and discharge:

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any four or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; to call for information in writing; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorise and empower you, or any of you, to visit and inspect personally such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes afore-

said:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any four or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any four or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it

expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any four or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

ROYAL COMMISSION ON POLICE POWERS AND PROCEDURE.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 7th September, 1928, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 10th September, 1928, to Saturday, the 15th September, 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker

- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Hackney Carriages at the following place, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.:—

17th August, 1928:---

APPOINTMENT.

AT CAXTON STREET, WESTMINSTER.

Six Hackney Carriages:

On the South side of roadway, commencing at the East pillar of Christchurch Passage, and extending Eastward along the kerb, by Churchyard, as far as necessary for six carriages.

NOTE:—A space of fifteen feet to be left clear between the second and third carriages by the gateway leading to the private entrance to Christchurch.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

To feed the existing rank at the South-west corner of Caxton Street.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS, 1920-1927.

Decision of the High Court on a Reference BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR PURSUANT TO Section 10 (1) (Proviso II) of the Unem-PLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920.

Contributions not Payable.

On the 30th July, 1928, Mr. Justice Roche gave judgment in the High Court on a question referred by the Minister for decision, whether the employment of a labourer by a City Corporation on the alternate week system under a scheme for employing Board of Guardians test men on public utility work, was such employment as to make him an employed person within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920-1927.

The Judge held that employment in the circumstances described was not employment " in full-time work" within the meaning of the proviso to the amendment of Section 47 (1) (b) of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, contained in the Fourth Schedule to the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1927, and that the employment was accordingly excepted under the amendment aforesaid.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE BRITISH MUSEUM.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 22, and shall as a rule not exceed the age of 26 on the 1st April of the year in which the competition is held, but in special circumstances candidates above 26 may be admitted with the approval of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners. Candidates who have served or are serving in His Majesty's Forces may deduct from their actual age any time so served between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st December, 1919.

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that

exception may be made—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible, provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject; and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

 Until further order preference will be given to candidates who have served in His

Majesty's Forces in the War.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for

appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The Trustees of the British Museum will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure

all desirable publicity.

6. Application shall be made in the first instance to the Director of the British Museum, who, after examining the candidates' credentials and a personal interview, will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for any of the existing or prospective vacancies to the Principal Trustees for approval of their candidature. Candidates thus approved shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in their opinion fits them for the post. Candidates thus recommended and approved shall be submitted to a qualifying examination in English

and General Knowledge.

8. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service their health Commissioners as to Female candidates must be uncharacter. married or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

Until further order, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from active employment by a physical impairment due to the War and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of ordinary administrative duties.

- 9. Candidates who have been admitted to and have passed the Qualifying Examination will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department, who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.
- 10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces or otherwise.

11. Every candidate before entry to the Qualifying Examination shall pay the regulation fee of £6.

Regulations applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4. The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twentyeight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

and to authorise the Council within the added limits to exercise all or any of the rights powers and privileges which they now may exercise within their existing limits of supply and to make applicable to the added limits all or any of the provisions of the Acts and Orders relating to the Council and their gas undertaking and of the intended Order.

2. To empower the Council to make differential charges in respect of the supply of gas in the added limits and the portion of the existing limits of supply which is situate beyond the boundaries of the Urban District

3. To provide for the repeal of any enactments or other provisions requiring the Council to supply gas of any particular illuminating or calorific power and the substitution therefor of power to charge for thermal units supplied in the form of gas and the modification of the statutory or other provisions affecting the charges which may be made by the Council by substituting for the maximum price per 1,000 cubic feet now authorised a maximum price per therm i.e. 100,000 British Thermal Units. The maximum price now authorised
