The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 9th November, 1928, he made an Order under Section 5 of the above Act extending the requirement as to notification to the Factory Inspector of certain classes of dangerous occurrences whether causing personal injury or not. The Order, which may be cited as The Dangerous Occurrences Notification Order, 1928, will come into force on the 1st January, 1929, from which date the Order dated 22nd December, 1906, under the said Section will be superseded.
