And whereas by Section 29, Sub-Section 5, of the said Act it was provided as follows:—

"This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1915:

"Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council from time to time, postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order":

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 20th day of December, 1927, until the 1st day of January, 1929:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the above-recited provision and all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of January, 1930.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and of the Act of the 47th and 48th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 65 (The New Parishes Acts and Church Building Acts Amendment Act, 1884), have prepared, and now humbly

lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting: (1) the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Denton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ingleton; (2) the dissolution of the District of Bolam; and (3) certain alterations of the boundaries of the Parishes of Denton, Ingleton, Heighington and Gainford, all which Benefices, District and Parishes are situate in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the rearrangement of the Benefices and Parishes of Denton, Ingleton, Heighington, Bolam and Gainford by way of unions of Benefices and otherwise as contemplated by the said Measure duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Durham and therein recommended (1) the union of the said Benefices of Denton and Ingleton; (2) the union of the said Benefices of Heighington and Bolam; and (3) certain alterations of the boundaries of the said Parishes of Denton, Ingleton, Bolam and Gainford and the terms for effecting such unions and alterations of boundaries and the said Bishop of Durham signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 20th day of August, 1867, and published in the London Gazette on the 23rd day of the same month a separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted under the New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856, on some or one of them, out of the said Parish of Gainford, and the said District was named 'The District of Bolam' and the boundaries thereof were defined in and by such Order and were delineated on a Map or Plan annexed to the same:

"And whereas the boundaries of the said District of Bolam and the extent of the area included within them are and remain the same as they were at the date of the constitution of the same District:

"And whereas no Church or Chapel has been provided for or allotted to the said District of Bolam:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would be expedient (particularly in order that full effect may be given to the recommendations contained in the hereinbefore mentioned Report) that the said District of Bolam should now be dissolved in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas by the said Act of the 47th and 48th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 65, it is enacted that any Scheme for the dissolution of a District shall provide for the return and re-vesting of any endowment which has been provided for such District to and in the body or person who provided the same, but the bodies or persons who provided the endowment of the said Benefice of Bolam namely the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the Town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eighth's Foundation, and we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, do not desire to resume such endowments and are

willing that such endowments shall be applied as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have prepared this Scheme as aforesaid which said Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the hereinbefore mentioned Report:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Denton, Ingleton, Heighington, Bolam and Gainford are now full, the Reverend William Apter being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Denton, the Reverend William Jarvis Hodgson McLean being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Heighington and Bolam, the Reverend George Suthrien being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ingleton, and the Reverend Reginald Alfred Bidwell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gainford:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed 'his Scheme), and with the consent of the said Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the Town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eighth's Foundation (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Collegiate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefices of Denton and the said Benefice of Ingleton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Denton and Ingleton' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That with the consent of the said George Suthrien (testified by his signing this Scheme), the union of the said two Benefices of Denton and Ingleton shall take effect immediately upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme if upon that day the said Benefice of Denton shall be vacant, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Denton shall be full, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Denton.

"3. That upon the union of the said Benefices of Denton and Ingleton taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ingleton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Denton and Ingleton.

"4. That after the union of the said Benefices of Denton and Ingleton has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Denton and Ingleton from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Denton shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Ingleton shall have the second and third turns.

"5. That as and from the day upon which the said William Jarvis Hodgson McLean shall cease to be Incumbent or Minister of the said District of Bolam the said District shall

be dissolved and that as and from the same day (a) a part of the area of such District namely that part of the said District which comprises the Civil Parish of Morton Timmouth (all which part is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink) shall be added for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Ingleton and (b) the remaining part of the area of such District namely the part of the said District which comprises the Civil Parish of Bolam (all which part is delineated and set forth upon the same Map or Plan and thereon coloured green) shall be added for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Heighington.

"6. That as and from the day of the date of the dissolution of the said District of Bolam the endowments and the Parsonage House belonging to such District shall with the consent as aforesaid of the said Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the Town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eighth's Foundation and without any assurance in the law other than the authority of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, become and be transferred and annexed to the said Benefice of Heighington as an addition to the endowments thereof.

"7. That with the consent of the said Reginald Alfred Bidwell (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union of the said Benefices of Denton and Ingleton taking effect as aforesaid (a) a portion of the said Parish of Gainford, namely so much of such Parish as is contiguous with the Civil Parish of Summerhouse shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Denton and (b) a further portion of the said Parish of Gainford namely so much of the said Parish of Gainford as lies to the north of the middle of the road leading from Ingleton Village to Summerhouse Village shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Ingleton.

"8. That with the consent of the said Reginald Alfred Bidwell (testified as aforesaid), upon the union of the said Benefices of Denton and Ingleton taking effect all the Tithe rentcharges, glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Gainford or which may hereafter belong to the same Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice of Denton and Ingleton with a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £25 such annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Denton and Ingleton or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharge the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Denton and Ingleton and his successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections

apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Gainford shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey, and annex to the said United Benefice of Denton and Ingleton any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Gainford which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Durham for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then such annual sum or yearly rent charge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and Act, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the 47th and 48th years of Her said late Majesty, been transmitted to the Patrons and the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gainford and to the Patrons and Incumbent of the said District of Bolam and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme or have offered no objections thereto:

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Durham has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure and Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 11th day of January, 1859, and published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of the same month, part of the District Parish of the Holy Trinity, Tunbridge Wells, in the said County of Kent and at that time in the Diocese of Canterbury but now in the said Diocese of Rochester, was assigned as a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint John, situate in the said District Parish of the Holy Trinity, Tunbridge Wells, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 7th day of April, 1864, and published in the London Gazette on the 12th day of the same month, part of the Parish of Speldhurst, in the said County of Kent and at that time in the said Diocese of Canterbury but now in the said Diocese of Rochester, was assigned as a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Paul, situate at Rusthall, in the said Parish of Speldhurst, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Rusthall':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Rusthall, have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part

of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, which is bounded upon the south west by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the north east and upon the north west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, crosses the fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Buckingham House, The Royal Chase, and extending thence first north eastward and then northward along the said fence for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence which divides the houses and premises situate on the north eastern side of The Royal Chase from the house and premises known as Great Culverden House, and extending thence first north westward and then northward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point distant 80 yards measured in a straight line from the north eastern side of The Royal Chase, and extending thence north westward in a line parallel to and at a distance of 80 yards from the north eastern side of The Royal Chase for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the north western boundary of the site for the Church intended to be erected on the north eastern side of The Royal Chase, and extending thence south westward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 80 yards or thereabouts to the point where it meets the north eastern side of The Royal Chase, and extending thence first south westward to and then north westward along the middle of The Royal Chase for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Earl's Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Earl's Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Liston and Borley duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Liston is now full the Reverend Stewart Travers Fisher being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Borley is at present vacant:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Liston and the said Benefice of Borley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The

United Benefice of Liston with Borley’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Liston only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Borley and the then Incumbent of Liston shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Borley only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Liston and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Liston if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Borley shall have been instituted to Borley subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Borley before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Borley following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Liston and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Liston shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Liston shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Borley having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Liston having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under

the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Chelmsford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

The owner or person in charge of swine running at large on any unenclosed land which is situate within the area declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 68), as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 73), shall:—

(a) immediately furnish a return to the Police giving the number and description of such swine; and

(b) notwithstanding the restrictions imposed by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, cause the swine with all practicable speed to be moved to and confined within enclosed lands, yards, sheds, sties or other suitable buildings from which they cannot escape, situated within the said Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area. Provided that during such movement the swine shall not be moved out of the said Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area; and

(c) notify the Police as soon as the movement required by this Order has been completed stating the address of the premises to which the swine have been moved, and the number and description of such swine.

ORDER DEFINING THE BENEFITS OR ADVANTAGES WHICH MAY BE RECKONED AS PAYMENT OF WAGES IN LIEU OF PAYMENT IN CASH.

The Dorset Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder, do by this Order vary as from 3rd December, 1928, their Order of the 11th February, 1927, defining the benefits or advantages (not being benefits or advantages prohibited by law) which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of the application of any minimum rate of wages fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Dorset, so as to provide that such benefits or advan-

1. *Cottage*: A cottage including any garden provided with the cottage, 3s. per week, less any rent or rates paid by the occupier. 1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 70) as

amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 74) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the First Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 71) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 74) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Second Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(3) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Release of certain Infected Areas from Restrictions.

2. The Areas described in the First and Second Schedules to this Order shall cease to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the third day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 75).
