Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, and of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall, both in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 11th day of January, 1859, and published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of the same month, part of the District Parish of the Holy Trinity, Tunbridge Wells, in the said County of Kent and at that time in the Diocese of Canterbury but now in the said Diocese of Rochester, was assigned as a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint John, situate in the said District Parish of the Holy Trinity, Tunbridge Wells, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 7th day of April, 1864, and published in the London Gazette on the 12th day of the same month, part of the Parish of Speldhurst, in the said County of Kent and at that time in the said Diocese of Canterbury but now in the said Diocese of Rochester, was assigned as a District Chapelry to the con-secrated Church of Saint Paul, situate at Rusthall, in the said Parish of Speldhurst, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Rusthall ':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Rusthall, have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her

said late Majesty, Chapter 94:
. "And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter

mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Paul,

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall, in the said County and Diocese, being:-

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, which is bounded upon the south west by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the north east and upon the north west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, crosses the fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Buckingham House, The Royal Chase, and extending thence first porth eastward and then northward along the said fence for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence which divides the houses and premises situate on the north eastern side of The Royal Chase from the house and premises known as Great Culverden House, and extending thence first north westward and then northward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 74 chains or thereabouts to a point distant 80 yards measured in a straight line from the north eastern side of The Royal Chase, and extending thence north westward in a line parallel to and at a distance of 80 yards from the north eastern side of The Royal Chase for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the north western boundary of the site for the Church intended to be erected on the north eastern side of The Royal Chase, and extending thence south westward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 80 yards or thereabouts to the point where it meets the north eastern side of The Royal Chase, and extending thence first south westward to and then north westward along the middle of The Royal Chase for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Earl's Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Earl's Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Rusthall."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:
