The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Balliol College, in the University of Oxford, on the 6th day of December, 1928, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

BALLIOL COLLEGE, OXFORD.

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Balliol College in the University of Oxford duly made at a General Meeting of the Master and Scholars especially summoned for that purpose on the Seventh day of November One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight and passed at such meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

STATUTE for Balliol College made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

PRELIMINARY.

This Statute is supplementary to the existing Statutes of the College that is to say the

Statutes dated the 19th day of December 1925 made for the College by the University of Oxford Commissioners and the Statute dated the 18th day of March 1928 made for the College by the Master and Scholars.

VI.—PENSIONS.

Clause 2 (a) is hereby repealed and in its stead the following is hereby enacted:—

"The transference to the College of a policy upon the life of the Master or of an Official Fellow, being either a policy already effected under the aforesaid scheme or any other policy recognised for all the purposes of the scheme by the Council of the Federated Superannuation System for Universities, shall be deemed equivalent to the effecting of the policy by the College."

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the

Bank of England, on Friday, the 21st December, 1928, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 24th December, 1928, to Saturday, the 29th December, 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 11th December, 1928, he made a Scheme, under Section 47 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, providing for the payment of compensation by employers of workmen in cases of death or total disablement due to silicosis or silicosis accompanied by tuberculosis, in various industries and processes which are

known to expose the workers to the risk of this disease.

The Scheme, which may be cited as The Various Industries (Silicosis) Scheme, 1928, will come into force on the 1st February, 1929. It applies to all workmen employed in the processes at any time on or after 1st January, 1929.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT Standings for Hackney Carriages at the following places, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

APPOINTMENTS.

AT MAYFAIR PLACE AND STRATTON STREET, PICCADILLY.

In Three Portions.

Four Hackney Carriages :

First Portion. One carriage, by kerb, on the South side of Mayfair Place, to stand at a point fifteen feet West of the Western building line of Berkeley Street.

Front of vehicle toward the East.

Second Portion. One carriage, by kerb, on the South side of Mayfair Place, to stand at a point immediately West of the Western entrance to Devonshire House Flats.

Front of vehicle toward the East.

Third Portion. Two carriages, by kerb, on the West side of Stratton Street, commencing at a point in line with the centre of the carriageway of Mayfair Place and extending Southward as far as necessary for two carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

Note—The third portion of the Standing will be available between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. only. The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion, and the second portion by carriages from the third portion.

Further Contraction of East Sussex Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 76) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 78) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted

for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Release of East Sussex Area from Restrictions.

2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the twenty-fourth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 80).

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Southampton and Isle of Wight which, for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the county boroughs of Bournemouth, Portsmouth and Southampton, have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly cancelled the minimum and overtime rates of wages fixed by them and made effective by an Order of the Agricultural Wages Board dated 12th March, 1928, and have duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area, and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby cancel as from the 22nd December, 1928, the said Order of the 12th March, 1928, and hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 23rd day of December, 1928.

(ii) During the period commencing on 31st March and terminating on 6th April, 1929:—

41½ in the case of a worker who in lieu of a day's holiday during the period commencing on 24th March, and terminating on 30th March, 1929, is given a clear day's holiday during this period.

51 in any other case.

(d) During any other week in summer, 51.

2. Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker in respect of that week, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker.

3. For the purpose of the above minimum rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the first Sunday in November, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

4. For the purpose of the above minimum rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

5. The wages payable for employment of female workers shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment on Christmas Day except in the case of a worker, who, in lieu of a holiday on that day is given a clear day's holiday during the week of employment in which Christmas Day falls.

(d) All employment on Good Friday except in the case of a worker who, in lieu of a holiday on that day is given a clear day's holiday during the week of employment in which Good Friday falls or in the following week.

(e) All employment in excess of 40½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in the week commencing on 23rd December, 1928, and terminating on 29th December, 1928.

(f) (i) In the case of a worker who is given a clear day's holiday in the week commencing on 31st March, 1929, and terminating on 6th April, 1929, all employment in that week in excess of 41½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment).

(ii) In any other case, all employment in excess of 41½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in the week commencing on 24th March, 1929, and terminating on 30th March, 1929.

(g) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in winter, except as provided in clause (e) above.

(h) All employment in excess of 51 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in summer, except as provided in clause (f) above.

The Hampshire and Isle of Wight Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder do by this Order vary as from 23rd December, 1928, their Order of the 7th February, 1925, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rates of wages for overtime employment fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Southampton and Isle of Wight which, for the purposes of the said Act, shall be deemed to include the county boroughs of Bournemouth, Portsmouth and Southampton, so as to provide that such employment shall be as follows:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment on Christmas Day except in the case of a worker who, in lieu of a holiday on that day is given a clear day's holiday during the week of employment in which Christmas Day falls.

(d) All employment on Good Friday except in the case of a worker who, in lieu of a holiday on that day is given a clear day's holiday during the week of employment in which Good Friday falls or in the following week.

(e) All employment in excess of 40½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in the week commencing on 23rd December, 1928, and terminating on 29th December, 1928.

(f) (i) In the case of a worker who is given a clear day's holiday in the week commencing on 31st March, 1929, and terminating on 6th April, 1929, all employment in that week in excess of 41½ hours

(excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment).

(ii) In any other case, all employment in excess of 41½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in the week commencing on 24th March, 1929, and terminating on 30th March, 1929.

(g) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in winter, except as provided in Clause (e) above.

(h) All employment in excess of 51 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in summer, except as provided in Clause (f) above.

For the purpose of this Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be all employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the first Sunday in November, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

This Order shall come into operation on 23rd December, 1928, and shall continue in operation until 21st December, 1929.
