**W**HEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of November, 1928 (C.W. 11087/28), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is

enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 10th day of June, 1921, to sanction regulations for the promotion and retirement of Officers of the Royal Marine Band Service:

"And whereas under the aforesaid regulations the Company Officer (Lieutenant and Quartermaster) at the Royal Naval School of Music, promoted from the Band ranks, is eligible, at our discretion, for promotion to the rank of Captain, Royal Marines, after eight years' commissioned service, but no provision exists for the advancement of the Company Officer (Lieutenant and Quartermaster) promoted from the general list of the Corps:

"And whereas we consider that the Officer who holds, or may hold the latter appointment should similarly be eligible for promotion to the rank of Captain, Royal Marines, after eight years' commissioned service, and that on promotion he should receive the rate of pay laid down for other Officers of that rank serving in the Royal Naval School of Music:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction this proposal, with effect from the 10th day of October, 1928.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

**WHEREAS** His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of November, 1928 (N.P. (2) 2532/28), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the Signalling Staff of the Admiralty Signal Station at Windmill Hill, Gibraltar, in addition to their ordinary Naval duties, perform certain services in connection with maritime commercial signalling for Lloyd's in consideration of which services Lloyd's has hitherto made to the Admiralty payments amounting to £130 per annum of

which sum £85 per annum is for distribution amongst the signalling staff by way of reward for the extra work performed:

"And whereas a revised arrangement has now been adopted whereby such payments will cease and Lloyd's agree, as from the 1st April, 1928, to pay to the Admiralty for the services of the Signalling Staff in question a sum of £300 per annum:

"And whereas we consider that this revised arrangement does not affect the claim of the Signalling Staff at Windmill Hill Signal Station to additional remuneration for the services performed by them for Lloyd's:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the allocation of an annual sum, in the form of extra pay from Navy Votes, of £85 as from the 1st April, 1923, to be distributed amongst the Signalling Staff in proportions to be decided at our discretion.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

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And whereas by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 Edw. 7. c. 29; 4 & 5 Geo. 5. c. 18; 9 & 10 Geo. 5. c. 80; and 18 Geo. 5. c. 3), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty Series No. 16 (1928)), comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Portugal has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention by Portugal the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Portugal or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1894 (S.R. & O. Rev. 1904, IX, Patents, &c. p. 5), Her late Majesty Queen Victoria has been pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (46-7 V. c. 57), should apply to Portugal and certain other foreign countries, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order, in so far as it applies to Portugal, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission in exercise of the powers conferred upon them in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Portugal confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Portugal or the territorial

waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to Portugal.

3. The Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1884, in so far as it relates to Portugal, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Portugal) Order, 1928.

1. The manufacture of an explosive consisting of an absorbent carbonaceous material impregnated with liquid air or oxygen with or without the addition of other substances shall be exempt from such of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the manufacture of an explosive subject to the conditions that no person shall manufacture the explosive unless he has obtained a licence from the Secretary

of State authorising him to do so and complies with any conditions which may be attached to the licence, and that no material, other than a carbonaceous material, is used unless it has been duly authorised in the said licence.

2. The Order in Council of 14th July, 1921, S.R. & O. 1921, No. 1194, is hereby repealed.

3. This Order may be cited as the Liquid Oxygen Explosives Order, 1928.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved on behalf of His Majesty at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Graveley shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Graveley having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate

right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Yelling having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ely has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved on behalf of His Majesty at a Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf affirm the said Scheme, and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And do further, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

**WHEREAS** His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We, Arthur Cayley by Divine Permission Bishop of Gloucester, do in pursuance of the Twenty-sixth Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the County of Gloucester and our Diocese of Gloucester the Vicarage of Longney the Parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about two hundred and ninety. The net annual value of the Benefice arising from investment of the proceeds of sale of Glebe Lands, Grants from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty and fees and other sources is two hundred and ninety-five pounds or thereabouts. The Parish Church of Saint Lawrence Longney contains one hundred and thirty sittings.

"2. There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke containing an estimated present population of about one thousand one hundred and two. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe Rentcharge, Grants from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty, dividends from investments representing proceeds of sale of Glebe Lands fees and other sources is four hundred and eighty-five pounds or thereabouts. The Parish Church of Saint Nicholas Standish contains two hundred and twenty sittings and the

Church of Saint Nicholas Hardwicke contains three hundred and fifty sittings.

"3. Those parts of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke which are known as Longney Cribb and Lapperditch are detached from the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke and are about four and a half miles from that part of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Standish with Hardwicke which is not in the Civil Parish of Hardwicke and about three and a half miles from the said Civil Parish of Hardwicke and are about three hundred yards or thereabouts from the said Parish Church of Longney.

"4. It appears to us that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the portions of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke known as Longney Cribb and Lapperditch which are delineated and coloured pink on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation be separated from the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke and annexed to the said Vicarage of Longney to which they are contiguous. If the said annexation is made the ecclesiastical boundary of the said Vicarage of Longney will coincide with the civil boundary of the said Parish of Longney, as altered by an order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

"5. The Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke is in our Patronage and as the person entitled to present thereto we consent to this proposal. The Vicarage of Longney is in the Patronage of the Lord Chancellor.

"6. The Reverend Andrew James Freeman, Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Music, is the present Incumbent of the Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke. The Reverend John Rees Rowland, Bachelor of Arts, is the present Incumbent of the Vicarage of Longney.

"7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the Twenty-sixth Section of the said Pluralities Act, we, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the portions of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Vicarage of Longney and the mode in which it appears to us the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithe Rentcharges and other Ecclesiastical Dues Rates and payments and in respect of Patronage, and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents. To the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents by your Report to His Majesty's Council.

“That the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Longney to which the said portions of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls therein.

“That the Parishioners of the said portions of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said Parish of Longney but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the said Churches of Saint Nicholas Standish and Saint Nicholas Hardwicke excepting nevertheless any person or persons possessing the legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Churches of Saint Nicholas Standish and Saint Nicholas Hardwicke and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

“That marriages baptisms churchings and burials shall be solemnized and performed for the inhabitants of the said portions of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke in the said Parish Church of Longney.

“That all fees dues and ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portions of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke so as aforesaid to be annexed to the said Vicarage of Longney shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Longney.

“That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

“That no alterations shall be made in the Endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

“CONSENTS.

“I, Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, being the Patron of or person entitled to present to the Vicarage of Longney in the County and Diocese of Gloucester in case the same were now vacant, the Reverend John Rees Rowland being the Incumbent of the same Benefice, do hereby signify to your Grace my consent to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

(b) In earthen graves, now existing in the said Churchyard, the burials may be allowed at their decease of the following relations of those already interred therein:—Clara Ann Carter, Kate Ford, Rebecca Jackson, Fanny Pearson, Caroline Porter, Sarah Rayment, Arthur Isaac Wiseman, Sarah Matilda Wiseman, Harriet Wiseman, Jacob Wiseman, and Walter Frederick Wiseman, provided that the coffins can be deposited at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains.

### FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 84).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

#### *Contraction of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 81) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

#### *Provision for movement by water through Infected Area to Manchester.*

2. Nothing in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Area Restrictions) Order of 1925, as applied to the area described in the Schedule to this Order shall affect or interfere with the transit by water through the said area of animals brought from Ireland or the Isle of Man in a vessel bound for the Irish Animals Landing Place at Manchester provided that the animals are not unshipped or landed at any place in the said Area.

#### *Commencement and Short Title.*

3. This Order shall come into operation on the third day of January, nineteen hundred

and twenty-nine, and may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 84).

### THE BLACK CURRANT MITE (NORFOLK) ORDER OF 1928.

DATED 31ST DECEMBER, 1928.

(D.I.P. 552.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, orders as follows:—

#### *Examination of Black Currant Bushes.*

1. If it appears to the Local Authority from a complaint made to it by a grower of black currant bushes that there is reason to suspect that any black currant bushes growing on any premises within the district are so affected with Big Bud that the affected branches thereof, if not forthwith cut down or treated, will be likely to cause Big Bud to spread to black currant bushes growing on his premises,

it shall thereupon cause an Officer (hereinafter called "the appointed Officer") to examine, as soon as may be practicable, the bushes suspected of being so affected.

*Prevention of Spread of Infection.*

2. After the examination of the bushes under Article 1 hereof the appointed Officer shall make a report thereon to the Local Authority, and the Local Authority, if satisfied that the bushes or any of them are so affected as aforesaid

(a) shall send to the occupier of the premises a copy of the report of the appointed Officer as soon as reasonably practicable after such report shall have been received by the Local Authority.

(b) having sent to the occupier a copy of the said report as required by sub-paragraph (a) hereof may serve upon him notice of its intention to serve upon him such notice as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (c) hereof, specifying therein a time within which objections may be made by him in writing to the serving of such last mentioned notice; and

(c) after serving such notice as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (b) hereof, and after considering the objections, if any, duly made by the occupier within the specified time, may serve upon him a notice either requiring him, within such time as may be prescribed in the notice, to cut down to the ground and burn or destroy all such branches of the bushes as are affected as aforesaid, or requiring him to treat the bushes in such manner as may be prescribed in the notice.

(d) Nothing in this Order shall prevent an occupier of premises, upon whom a notice has been served under sub-paragraph (c) hereof, completely destroying by fire or otherwise any bushes in respect of which a notice has been served upon him, and if he does so destroy them, he shall be deemed to have complied with the notice.

(e) Where a notice has been served under sub-paragraph (c) hereof, the appointed Officer shall, if so directed by the Local Authority, ascertain whether the notice has been complied with.

*Powers of appointed Officer.*

3. For the purpose of making an examination under Article 1 hereof, or for the purpose of ascertaining whether a notice served under Article 2 (c) hereof has been complied with, the appointed Officer, upon production if so required of his appointment, may at all reasonable times enter upon any premises in the district, and examine any black currant bushes thereon, and the occupier of the premises shall give to him all reasonable facilities for carrying out the examination.

*Reports and copies of Notices to be sent to the Ministry.*

4. The Local Authority shall furnish to the Ministry a report of any action taken by it under this Order, together with details of any complaints received by it, and a copy of any notice served under Article 2 (c) hereof.

*Service of Notices.*

5. For the purpose of this Order, a notice shall be deemed to be served on any person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business,

or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there, and a notice purporting to be signed by the Clerk to the Local Authority shall be *prima facie* evidence that it was signed by him as Clerk to the Local Authority.

*Appointment of Officers.*

6. The Local Authority may appoint such persons as the Local Authority may deem desirable to be appointed Officers for the execution of this Order.

*Penalties.*

7. Every person shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, or in the case of a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, who

(i) fails to comply with any notice served under Article 2 (c) of this Order; or

(ii) fails to give to an appointed Officer all reasonable facilities as required by this Order; or

(iii) wilfully obstructs or impedes an appointed Officer in the exercise of his powers under this Order.

*Definitions.*

8. "The District" means the Administrative County of Norfolk (excluding the Borough of King's Lynn) or the County Borough of Great Yarmouth as the case may be.

"Local Authority" means the Local Authority for the Administrative County of Norfolk (excluding the Borough of King's Lynn) or the County Borough of Great Yarmouth as the case may be.

"Big Bud" means the malformation of the buds of black currant bushes caused by the black currant mite *Eriophyes ribis*, Nalepa.

*Enforcement of Order.*

9. The provisions of this Order shall be enforced by the Local Authority.

*Notification of the Order.*

10. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority in accordance with any directions given by the Minister.

*Short Title.*

11. This Order may be cited as the BLACK CURRANT MITE (NORFOLK) ORDER OF 1928.

*Commencement of Order.*

12. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.
