WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 10th day of June, 1921, to sanction regulations for the promotion and retirement of Officers of the Royal Marine Band Service:

W HEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission dated the 4th day of December, 1928, to nominate and appoint Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., His Royal Highness The Duke of York, K.G., K.T., G.C.V.O., the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Right 'Honourable Douglas McGarel, Baron Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any three of them, during His Majesty's illness, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required: And whereas by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 Edw. 7. c. 29; 4 & 5 Geo. 5. c. 18; 9 & 10 Geo. 5. c. 80; and 18 Geo. 5. c. 3), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty Series No. 16 (1928)), comprising the said Convention as revised International \mathbf{at} Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Portugal has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention by Portugal the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Portugal or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1834 (S.R. & O. Rev. 1904, IX, Patents, &c. p. 5), Her late Majesty Queen Victoria has been pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (46-7 V. c. 57), should apply to Portugal and certain other foreign countries, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order, in so far as it applies to Portugal, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission in exercise of the powers conferred upon them in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to order and prescribe as follows:—

1. The manufacture of an explosive consisting of an absorbent carbonaceous material impregnated with liquid air or oxygen with or without the addition of other substances shall be exempt from such of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the manufacture of an explosive subject to the conditions that no person shall manufacture the explosive unless he has obtained a licence from the Secretary of State authorising him to do so and complies with any conditions which may be attached to the licence, and that no material, other than a carbonaceous material, is used unless it has been duly authorised in the said licence.

2. The Order in Council of 14th July, 1921, S.R. & O. 1921, No. 1194, is hereby repealed.

3. This Order may be cited as the Liquid Oxygen Explosives Order, 1928.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leonard, Bishop of Ely, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Graveley and Yelling duly made their report to the said Bishop of Ely and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Ely signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Graveley and Yelling are at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Leonard, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:--

"1. That the said Benefice of Graveley and the said Benefice of Yelling shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Graveley with Yelling' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Archdeaconry of Ely and of the Rural Deanery of Bourn but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Graveley shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Graveley having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Yelling having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ely has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved on behalf of His Majesty at a Council held under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf affirm the said Scheme, and order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And do further, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

"1. There is in the County of Gloucester and our Diocese of Gloucester the Vicarage of Longney the Parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about two hundred and ninety. The net annual value of the Benefice arising from investment of the proceeds of sale of Glebe Lands, Grants from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty and fees and other sources is two hundred and ninety-five pounds or thereabouts. The Parish Church of Saint Lawrence Longney contains one hundred and thirty sittings.

"2. There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke containing an estimated present population of about one thousand one hundred and two. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe Rentcharge, Grants from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty, dividends from investments representing proceeds of sale of Glebe Lands fees and other sources is four hundred and eighty-five pounds or thereabouts. The Parish Church of Saint Nicholas Standish contains two hundred and twenty sittings and the Church of Saint Nicholas Hardwicke contains three hundred and fifty sittings.

"3. Those parts of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke which are known as Longney Cribb and Lapperditch are detached from the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke and are about four and a half miles from that part of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Standish with Hardwicke which is not in the Civil Parish of Hardwicke and about three and a half miles from the said Civil Parish of Hardwicke and are about three hundred yards or thereabouts from the said Parish Church of Longney.

It appears to us that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the portions of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke known as Longney Cribb and Lapperditch which are delineated and coloured pink on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation be separated from the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke and annexed to the said Vicarage of Longney to which they are contiguous. If the said annexation is made the ecclesiastical boundary of the said Vicarage of Longney will coincide with the civil boundary of the said Parish of Longney, as altered by an order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

"5. The Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke is in our Patronage and as the person entitled to present thereto we consent to this proposal. The Vicarage of Longney is in the Patronage of the Lord Chancellor.

"6. The Reverend Andrew James Freeman, Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Music, is the present Incumbent of the Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke. The Reverend John Rees Rowland, Bachelor of Arts, is the present Incumbent of the Vicarage of Longney.

"7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the Twenty-sixth Section of the said Pluralties Act, we, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the portions of the said Vicarage of Standish with Hardwicke as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Vicarage of Longney and the mode in which it appears to us the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdic-tion, Glebe Lands, Tithe Rentcharges and other Ecclesiastical Dues Rates and payments and in respect of Patronage, and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. "That no alterations shall be made in the Endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

Contraction of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 81) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

Provision for movement by water through Infected Area to Manchester.

2. Nothing in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Area Restrictions) Order of 1925, as applied to the area described in the Schedule to this Order shall affect or interfere with the transit by water through the said area of animals brought from Ireland or the Isle of Man in a vessel bound for the Irish Animals Landing Place at Manchester provided that the animals are not unshipped or landed at any place in the said Area.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, orders as follows:---

Examination of Black Currant Bushes.

1. If it appears to the Local Authority from a complaint made to it by a grower of black currant bushes that there is reason to suspect that any black currant bushes growing on any premises within the district are so affected with Big Bud that the affected branches thereof, if not forthwith cut down or treated, will be likely to cause Big Bud to spread to black currant bushes growing on his premises, it shall thereupon cause an Officer (hereinafter called "the appointed Officer") to examine, as soon as may be practicable, the bushes suspected of being so affected.

Prevention of Spread of Infection.

2. After the examination of the bushes under Article 1 hereof the appointed Officer shall make a report thereon to the Local Authority, and the Local Authority, if satisfied that the bushes or any of them are so affected as aforesaid

(a) shall send to the occupier of the premises a copy of the report of the appointed Officer as soon as reasonably practicable after such report shall have been received by the Local Authority.

(b) having sent to the occupier a copy of the said report as required by sub-paragraph (a) hereof may serve upon him notice of its intention to serve upon him such notice as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (c) hereof, specifying therein a time within which objections may be made by him in writing to the serving of such last mentioned notice; and

(c) after serving such notice as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (b) hereof, and after considering the objections, if any, duly made by the occupier within the specified time, may serve upon him a notice either requiring him, within such time as may be prescribed in the notice, to cut down to the ground and burn or destroy all such branches of the bushes as are affected as aforesaid, or requiring him to treat the bushes in such manner as may be prescribed in the notice.

(d) Nothing in this Order shall prevent an occupier of premises, upon whom a notice has been served under sub-paragraph (c) hereof, completely destroying by fire or otherwise any bushes in respect of which a notice has been served upon him, and if he does so destroy them, he shall be deemed to have complied with the notice.

(e) Where a notice has been served under sub-paragraph (c) hereof, the appointed Officer shall, if so directed by the Local Authority, ascertain whether the notice has been complied with.

Powers of appointed Officer.

3. For the purpose of making an examination under Article 1 hereof, or for the purpose of ascertaining whether a notice served under Article 2 (c) hereof has been complied with, the appointed Officer, upon production if so required of his appointment, may at all reasonable times enter upon any premises in the district, and examine any black currant bushes thereon, and the occupier of the premises shall give to him all reasonable facilities for carrying out the examination.

Reports and copies of Notices to be sent to the Ministry.

4. The Local Authority shall furnish to the Ministry a report of any action taken by it under this Order, together with details of any complaints received by it, and a copy of any notice served under Article 2 (c) hereof.

Service of Notices.

5. For the purpose of this Order, a notice shall be deemed to be served on any person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business, or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there, and a notice purporting to be signed by the Clerk to the Local Authority shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him as Clerk to the Local Authority.

Appointment of Officers.

6. The Local Authority may appoint such persons as the Local Authority may deem desirable to be appointed Officers for the execution of this Order.

Penalties.

7. Every person shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, or in the case of a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, who

(i) fails to comply with any notice served under Article 2 (c) of this Order; or

(ii) fails to give to an appointed Officer all reasonable facilities as required by this Order; or

(iii) wilfully obstructs or impedes an appointed Officer in the exercise of his powers under this Order.
