1. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the House of Parliament, Clergy of all

Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

2. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army, the Militia, and the Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and except Officers of the Indian Services and Indian Army and Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller. Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Special Reserve and Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through

the usual channels. Officers of the Reserve of Air Force Officers and Officers on the retired list of the Royal Air Force will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, Air Ministry, Kingsway, W.C. 2.

6. All Officers of His Majesty's Civil Service

6. All Officers of His Majesty's Civil Service will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the

Department under which they serve.

7. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Political A.D.C. to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

8. 10. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for the Home Department.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 1st February, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th February, 1929, to Saturday, the 9th February, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department announces that in response to an application from the National Federation of Freestone Quarry Owners and the Trade Unions represented on the Freestone Section of the Joint Industrial Council for the Quarrying Industry, he proposes to make a Special Scheme under Section 47 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, providing for com-pensation in respect of the disease known as Silicosis for workmen employed in the Sandstone Industry. This Scheme would provide for payment of the compensation out of a Special Trade Compensation Fund, generally would follow the lines of the Compensation Scheme made some years ago for the Refractories Industries. It would supersede the Various Industries (Silicosis) Scheme which was made on the 11th December last, so far as the Sandstone Industry is concerned, and for the purposes of the new Scheme, it is proposed that the Sandstone Industry should be defined as meaning all processes in or incidental to the getting or manipulation of sandstone with a view to manufacture or sale, which are carried on at or within the close or curtilage of any mine or quarry or at any premises worked in conjunction with a mine or quarry, wherever situate. Certain exceptions would be provided for, and in particular it is proposed that the Scheme should not apply to a mine or quarry in which sandstone is worked occasionally only and where no explosive or mechanical power is used.

The draft Scheme, which has been prepared in consultation with the Joint Industrial Council, has now been issued, and any employers or others affected who may desire to submit any observations upon it for consideration of the Secretary of State are asked to do so in writing to the Under Secretary of State, Home Office, London, S.W. 1, by the

14th February.
