TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd March, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th March, 1929, to Saturday, the 30th March, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Devon, which for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the city and county borough of Exeter and the county borough of Plymouth, have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area, and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 26th day of March, 1929.

Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 52 from 22nd April to 6th October, or 50 from 7th October to 21st April, as the case may be, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to that worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker.

3. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

(d) All employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) during the period from 7th October to 21st April.

8. For the purpose of the application of the above minimum rates of wages the Devonshire Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated 12th March, 1928, defined the following as the only benefits or advantages which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of

payment in cash and the values at which they are to be so reckoned:—

1. Benefits or Advantages.

(a) Lodgings except in any case in which the Committee shall have determined that the lodging accommodation provided is so defective as to be injurious to health.

(b) Board, including any meals, but not including intoxicating drink.

(c) Cottage, including any garden hitherto given or let with the cottage, except where the cottage is one in regard to which the Medical Officer of Health has reported that it is in a state so dangerous or injurious to health as to be unfit for human habitation.

(a) All employment in excess of 6 hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment in excess of 52 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) during the period from 22nd April to 6th October.

(d) All employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) during the period from 7th October to 21st April.

This Order shall come into operation on the 26th March, 1929, and continue in force until 25th March, 1930.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Durham which, for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the county boroughs of Darlington, Gateshead, South Shields, Sunderland and West Hartlepool, have in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area, and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 14th day of May, 1929.

SCHEDULE.

1. *Horsemen of 21 years of age and over* :—

(a) The wages payable for employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over wholly or mainly as horsemen and being householders shall be not less than 32s. per week of 50 hours and in addition 7s. per week to cover all time customarily spent in attention to horses.

(b) The wages payable for employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over wholly or mainly as horsemen and not being householders and not receiving board and lodging provided by the employer shall be not less than 31s. per week of 50 hours and in addition 3s. 6d. per week to cover all time customarily spent in attention to horses.

(c) The wages payable for employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over wholly or mainly as horsemen and receiving board and lodging provided by the employer shall be not less than 31s. (which sum shall include the value of such board and lodging as defined by the Committee) per week of 50 hours and any additional time customarily spent in attention to horses.

2. *Stockmen and Shepherds of 21 years of age and over* :—

(a) The wages payable for employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over wholly or mainly as Stockmen or Shepherds and being householders shall be not less than 43s. per week for hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

(b) The wages payable for employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over wholly or mainly as Stockmen or Shepherds and not being householders and not receiving board and lodging provided by the employer shall be not less than 36s. 10½d. per week for hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

(c) The wages payable for employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over wholly or mainly as Stockmen or Shepherds and receiving board and lodging provided by the employer shall be not less than 35s. (which sum shall include the value of such board and lodging as defined by the Committee) per week, for hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

3. *Other Male Workers of 21 years of age and over* (except casual workers) :—

The wages payable for employment of other male workers of 21 years of age and over, except casual workers, shall be not less than 31s. per week of 50 hours (excluding Sunday).

4. *Male Workers under 21 years of age* (other than casual workers of 19 years of age and over) :—

The wages payable for employment of male workers under 21 years of age, other than casual workers of 19 years of age and over, shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates :—

5. *Casual Workers*.—The wages payable for the employment of male casual workers of 19 years of age and over shall be not less than wages at the rate of 6d. per hour.

6. For the purpose of the above rates a casual worker shall be deemed to be a worker employed by the same employer for any number of days, whether consecutive or otherwise, not exceeding 28 in any one year.

7. Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are :—

(a) In the case of a horseman of 21 years of age or over, less than 50 hours and time customarily spent in attention to horses.

(b) In the case of a stockman or shepherd of 21 years of age or over, less than customary hours.

(c) In the case of any other male worker of 21 years of age or over, less than 50 hours, or

(d) In the case of any male worker under 21 years of age, less than 50 hours and time customarily spent in attention to horses or stock,

the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker.

8. The expression "week" means a week of employment of the worker.

9. *Female Workers* :—

The wages payable for employment of female workers shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates :—

18 years of age and over, 2s. 6d. per day (other than Sunday) of 8 hours.

14 and under 18 years of age, 2s. per day (other than Sunday) of 8 hours.

10. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which by reason

(ii) All employment on a Sunday and on Christmas Day and Good Friday.

(iii) All employment in excess of 46½ hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment).

For the purpose of this Order employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on 1st November and terminating on the 14th February, and employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

(i) All employment in excess of 50 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in the weeks in which Christmas Day, Good Friday and Whit Monday fall.

(ii) All employment in excess of 58 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in any other week.

(d) In the case of all male workers (other than those specified in Clause (c) above), and of all female workers:—

(i) All employment on a Sunday.

(ii) All employment in excess of 40 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day falls.

(iii) All employment in excess of 44 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in the weeks in which Good Friday and Whit Monday fall.

(iv) All employment in excess of 52 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in any other week in Summer.

(v) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in any other week in Winter.

For the purpose of this Order, in reckoning the hours after which overtime employment shall be held to commence, absence during normal working hours covered by a Medical Certificate, or by the employer's permission, shall be included.

For the purposes of this Order employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and employment in Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.
