TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Thursday, the 28th March, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 2nd April, 1929, to Saturday, the 6th April, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the

amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 18th March, 1929, he made a special Scheme under Section 47 of the above Act, providing for the payment of compensation in respect of the disease known as Silicosis, for workmen employed in the Sandstone Industry. The Scheme, which may be cited as The Sandstone Industry (Silicosis) Scheme, 1929, will come into force on the 1st April, 1929, and applies to all workers employed in the Sandstone Industry on or after that date. It incorporates

the principles included in Section 47 of the Act and provides (1) for the establishment of a General Trade Compensation Fund to which all employers in the Industry will be required to contribute and out of which all compensation and other expenses under the Scheme will be paid; (2) for the appointment of a Medical Board for the purpose of conducting the medical examinations including the prescribed periodic examinations of workmen in the Industry and giving certificates under the Scheme; and (3) for the determination of awards of compensation by Joint Committees, representative of both employers and workmen in the Industry, presided over by independent chairmen.

The Various Industries (Silicosis) Scheme, 1928, so far as it applies to workmen employed in the Sandstone Industry, will be revoked as from 1st April, 1929, except as regards cases to which the Scheme applies and in which the workman has not been employed in the Sandstone Industry on or after that date.

QUARANTINE STATIONS (REGULATION)
ORDER OF 1929.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Authorisation of Landing of Animals from
Irish Free State for Exceptional Purpose.*

1.—(1) Subject as herein provided an animal shipped from either the port of Dublin, or the port of Waterford, Irish Free State, on a vessel trading to London may be landed at the port of London for the purpose of being

reshipped to a place of destination outside Great Britain after undergoing detention in accordance with the provisions of the Quarantine Stations (Regulation) Order of 1923 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), as modified by this Order.

(2) The provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, and of any Order amending it, of the Irish Animals (Marking) Order of 1923 (No. 2) and of Article 4 of the Principal Order shall not apply in the case of an animal to which this Order applies.

(3) For the purposes of Section 5 of the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2) the premises at East India Dock, London, now in the occupation of the Royal Agricultural Society of England, and approved by the Ministry as a quarantine station for the purposes of the Principal Order shall be deemed to be an approved landing place for animals from the Irish Free State landed under this Order.

Regulations Applicable to Animals before and on Landing.

2.—(1) No animal shall be landed under the provisions of this Order unless and until there has been produced to a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry the certificates and declarations prescribed by this Article, namely:—

(a) a certificate signed by a duly authorised Officer of the Government of the Irish Free State that during the three calendar months immediately preceding its movement to Dublin or Waterford for shipment the animal has been located on premises in the Irish Free State situate outside a radius of at least 15 miles from any place on which cattle plague, foot-and-mouth disease, or pleuro-pneumonia has been certified to exist during such period of three calendar months either by the Government of the Irish Free State or by the Government of Northern Ireland;

(b) a certificate signed by a Veterinary Inspector of the Government of the Irish Free State that the animal to be shipped and all other animals on the premises on which the animal was immediately before its movement to Dublin or Waterford for shipment have been examined by him and found to be free from cattle plague, foot-and-mouth disease and pleuro-pneumonia;

(c) a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Government of the Irish Free State that every vehicle used for the conveyance of the animal from the said premises to the place of embarkation at Dublin or Waterford was of a kind approved by that Government for the purpose, and that before the animal was loaded into any such vehicle the latter was cleansed and disinfected in accordance with directions given by the said Government;

(d) a certificate signed by a Veterinary Inspector of the Government of the Irish Free State that immediately before shipment from Dublin or Waterford he examined the animal and found it to be free from cattle plague, foot-and-mouth disease and pleuro-pneumonia, and that before being unloaded for embarkation on a vessel for shipment to London the part of the wharf and the gangways to be used by the animal, and also the pen or other accommodation set apart for its use on such vessel were cleansed and disinfected under his supervision and to his satisfaction;

(e) a declaration signed by the master of the said vessel that during the voyage from Dublin or Waterford to London no cattle, sheep, goats or other ruminating animals or swine not subject to this Order were carried on the said vessel;

(f) a declaration signed by the owner of the animal or by his authorised agent to the effect that to the best of his knowledge and belief the animal is free from any contagious or parasitic disease and that during the three calendar months immediately preceding its movement to Dublin or Waterford for shipment the animal has not been exposed to infection.

(2) No animal shall be landed under the provisions of this Order unless and until it has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and has been certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

(3) An animal landed under the provisions of this Order shall forthwith be moved in accordance with the provisions of a licence to be granted by an Inspector of the Ministry and under his supervision to the quarantine station described in Article 1 (3) hereof.

(4) On arrival at the said Quarantine Station the animal shall become subject to the provisions of the principal Order as modified by this Order.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the QUARANTINE STATIONS (REGULATION) ORDER OF 1929 and shall be read as one with the principal Order.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BY an Order dated the 7th day of March, 1929, the Minister of Health has declared that, on and after the 30th day of March, 1929, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Rural District of Orsett, namely:—

Sections 22, 24, 30 and 32, comprised in Part II (streets and buildings);

Sections 34 to 38 (inclusive), 43 to 46 (inclusive), 48, 49 and 50, comprised in Part III (sanitary provisions); and

Sections 52 to 60 (inclusive), 62 to 65 (inclusive), and 67, comprised in Part IV (Infectious diseases).

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject as regards Section 30, Part II, that the Section shall not apply to any wall or other structure used either for the support of any street or footpath repairable by the inhabitants at large, or for the protection of such street or footpath from damage or obstruction, by reason of the surface of the street or footpath being above or below the level of the surface of the adjoining land, unless the wall or other structure was built after the street or footpath became a highway repairable by the inhabitants at large, by or at the expense of a person other than the highway authority responsible for the repair of the street or footpath.

And as regards Section 35, Part III, the said Section shall have effect so far as it relates to the deposit of material, subject to the first proviso of Section 91 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and further subject to Byelaws made in pursuance of Section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not be of effect in a contributory place in which the said section is in force.

And as regards Section 38 of Part III, the said Section shall not prejudicially affect any power or right exercisable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of Section 22 of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of Section 18 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890.

And by the same Order the Minister has declared that on and after the 30th day of March the following Sections shall be in force in the contributory places of Aveley, Little

Thurrock, South Ockendon, Stanford-le-Hope, Stifford and West Thurrock:—

Sections 39 to 42 (inclusive) comprised in Part III (Sanitary provisions).
