The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in the letterpress printing department and the paper bag department at the works of Messrs. Clarke, Doble and Company Limited, Commercial Road, Plymouth, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, facilities for warming food and boiling water, washing facilities and seats, shall be provided.
