PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN CERTAIN AREAS AND TO CANCEL THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF WORKERS IN SUCH AREAS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers in the Area comprising the Counties of Cumberland, Durham and Northumberland, and the County Borough of Middlesbrough, the Municipal Borough of Thornaby-on-Tees, the Urban District of Estón and the Rural District of Middlesbrough, in the County of Yorkshire, and in the Area comprising the County of Yorkshire (except the County Borough of Middlesbrough, the Municipal Borough of Thornaby-on-Tees, the Urban Districts of Barnoldswick, Earby, Eston and Skipton and the Rural District of Middlesbrough), and TO CANCEL the Minimum Rates of Wages in these Areas in their application to Cutters, Trimmers and Packers.
