PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section thirty-three of the Government of India Act, as amended by the Government of India (Aden) Act, 1929, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council transfer to and vest in such person or authority as may be specified in the Order the superintendence, direction or control of the military government of Aden and that any such Order may contain such supplementary provisions as may be necessary for giving effect thereto:

And whereas it is expedient that such superintendence, direction and control as aforesaid should be transferred and vested in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The superintendence, direction and control of the military government of Aden, including every dependency of Aden whereof the military government was, immediately before the making of this Order, under the superintendence, direction or control of the Governor-General in Council, is hereby transferred to and vested in the Resident and Commander-in-Chief at Aden, who is, in the exercise

thereof, required to pay due obedience to all such orders as he may receive from a Secretary of State.

2. This Order may be cited as the Government of India (Aden) Order, 1929.

REVISED ROYAL WARRANT.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To all to whom these Presents shall come. Greeting.

Whereas We did, by Royal Warrant under Our Sign Manual, dated 3rd June, 1918, institute and create two decorations designated the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Force Cross, and two medals designated the Distinguished Flying Medal and the Air Force Medal to be awarded to Officers and Airmen in Our Air Force and in the Air Forces of Our Self-governing Dominions

beyond the Seas in recognition of acts of valour, courage and devotion to duty: and did make regulations governing the said decorations and medals.

And whereas the said Royal Warrant was subsequently amended by Royal Warrants dated 24th July, 1919, 27th August, 1919, and 20th April, 1921.

And whereas We deem it expedient that the said Royal Warrant dated the 3rd June, 1918, with the amendments aforesaid and those now promulgated, shall be incorporated in a Royal Warrant under Our Sign Manual:—

Now, therefore, We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, ordain that the following regulations shall be substituted for those promulgated in the said Royal Warrant dated 3rd June, 1918, as amended by subsequent Royal Warrants and We do hereby direct that the following regulations shall henceforth be the regulations governing the said decorations and medals:—

Firstly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Cross shall be granted only to such Officers and Warrant Officers of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us by or through Our Secretary of State for Air for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty performed whilst flying in active operations against the enemy.

Secondly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Cross shall be silver and shall consist of a Cross flory terminated in the horizontal and base bars with bombs, the upper bar terminating with a rose, surmounted by another cross composed of aeroplane propellers charged in the centre with a roundel within a wreath of laurels a rose winged ensigned by an Imperial Crown thereon the letters R.A.F. On the reverse the Royal Cypher above the date 1918. The whole attached to the clasp and ribbon by two sprigs of laurel.

Thirdly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Cross shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour violet and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-eighth of an inch in width running at an angle of 45 degrees downwards towards the wearer's left.

Fourthly, it is ordained that the award of the Distinguished Flying Cross shall entitle the recipient to have the initials D.F.C. appended to his name.

Fifthly, it is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be granted to such Officers and Warrant Officers of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us by or through Our Secretary of State for Air for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty whilst flying though not in active operations against the enemy, and may also be granted to individuals not belonging to such Forces who render distinguished service to Aviation in actual flying.

Sixthly, it is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be silver and shall consist of a thunderbolt in the form of a cross, the arms conjoined by wings, the base bar terminating with a bomb surmounted by another cross composed of aeroplane propellers, the four ends enscribed with the letters G.V.R.I. In the centre a roundel thereon, a representation of

Hermes mounted on a hawk in flight bestowing a wreath. On the reverse the Royal Cypher above the date 1918. The whole ensigned by an Imperial Crown and attached to the clasp and ribbon by two sprigs of laurel.

Seventhly, it is ordained that the Air Force Cross shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour red and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-eighth of an inch in width running at an angle of 45 degrees downwards towards the wearer's left.

Eighthly, it is ordained that the award of the Air Force Cross shall entitle the recipient to have the initials A.F.C. appended to his name.

Ninthly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Medal shall be granted only to such Non-commissioned Officers and Airmen of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us by or through Our Secretary of State for Air for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty performed whilst flying in active operations against the enemy.

Tenthly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Medal shall be in silver and oval-shaped, bearing Our Effigy on the obverse and on the reverse within a wreath of laurel a representation of Athena Nike seated on an aeroplane, a hawk rising from her right arm above the words "for Courage". The whole ensigned by a bomb attached to the clasp and ribbon by two wings.

Eleventhly, it is ordained that the Distinguished Flying Medal shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon of one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour violet and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-sixteenth of an inch in width, running at an angle of 45 degrees downwards towards the wearer's left.

Twelfthly, it is ordained that the award of the Distinguished Flying Medal shall entitle the recipient to have the initials D.F.M. appended to his name.

Thirteenthly, it is ordained that the Air Force Medal shall be granted to such Non-commissioned Officers and Airmen of Our said Forces as shall be recommended to Us by or through Our Secretary of State for Air for an act or acts of valour, courage or devotion to duty performed whilst flying though not in active operations against the enemy, and may also be granted to individuals not belonging to such Forces who render distinguished service to Aviation in actual flying.

Fourteenthly, it is ordained that the Air Force Medal shall be silver and oval-shaped, bearing Our Effigy on the obverse and on the reverse within a wreath of laurel a representation of Hermes mounted on a hawk in flight bestowing a wreath. The whole ensigned by a bomb attached to the clasp and ribbon by two wings.

Fifteenthly, it is ordained that the Air Force Medal shall be worn on the left breast pendant from a ribbon one inch and a quarter in width which shall be in colour red and white in alternate diagonal stripes of one-sixteenth of an inch in width running at an angle of 45 degrees downwards towards the wearer's left.

Sixteenthly, it is ordained that the award of the Air Force Medal shall entitle the

recipient to have the initials A.F.M. appended to his name.

Seventeenthly, it is ordained that Foreign Officers and gradings of an equivalent rank to those above mentioned, who have been associated in operations with Our Forces, shall be eligible for the award of the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Force Cross, the Distinguished Flying Medal, and the Air Force Medal.

Eighteenthly, it is ordained that in cases where an individual who has been awarded one of the above decorations or medals shall be recommended for a further act of valour, courage or devotion to duty, he shall be awarded a bar to be attached to the ribbon by which the decoration or medal is suspended, and for every additional such act an additional bar may be awarded.

Nineteenthly, it is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer the above decorations and medals shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Secretary of State for Air.

Twentiethly, it is ordained (1) That it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on a recommendation by or through Our Secretary of State for Air to cancel and annul the award to any person of the above decorations or medals and that thereupon the name of such person in the Register shall be erased; but that We, Our Heirs and Successors shall at all times have power to restore any decoration or medal which may have been forfeited when such recommendation shall have been withdrawn. (2) That the forfeiture shall involve the cessation of any gratuity or pension in lieu thereof to which the possession of any of the aforesaid decorations or medals might entitle the recipient, but no such forfeiture shall extend to any sum of money which has already been paid. (3) That when a forfeited decoration or medal shall have been restored, any gratuity or pension in lieu thereof which attaches to it shall also be restored. (4) That a notice of forfeiture or of restoration shall in every case be published in the London Gazette.

Lastly, We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these Regulations or any part thereof by a notification under Our Royal Sign Manual.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, this 31st day of August in the twentieth year of Our Reign and in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

COMPANIES ACT, 1929.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 8th November, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on

the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 30) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 33).

SUFFOLK SWINE FEVER INFECTED
AREA ORDER OF 1929.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Area to which this Order applies.

1. This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, referred to in this Order as "the Infected Area."

Restriction on Movement of Swine into, out of, or within the Infected Area.

2.—(1) The movement of swine into or out of the Infected Area, or along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Infected Area, is prohibited except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority in accordance with this Order. Provided that this Order shall not affect or prevent the movement of swine through the Infected Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

(2) No swine shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Infected Area.

Markets etc., of Swine in Infected Area to be restricted to Fat Swine only.

3. No market, sale or exhibition of swine shall be held in any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in the Infected Area, unless it is restricted to fat swine intended for immediate slaughter, and then only in accordance with the following conditions, namely:—

(a) A licence shall be obtained from the Local Authority authorising the holding of the market, sale or exhibition.

(b) All swine exposed at such market, sale or exhibition shall be removed therefrom direct to a slaughterhouse, and shall be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority specifying the slaughterhouse to which the swine are to be moved.

Licences for Movement of Swine into Infected Area.

4. Where the movement required is governed by the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, the licence necessary under that Order shall be sufficient authority for the movement of swine into the Infected Area. Where the movement is not affected by the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, a licence for the movement of swine into the Infected Area may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the swine are to be moved. The licence, which may be granted for movement for any pur-

poses, shall be in the Form C. with the necessary adaptation. No declaration is required to be produced to obtain the licence.

Licences for Movement of Swine within or out of the Infected Area.

5.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority for the following movements of swine from premises within the Infected Area to premises in or outside the Infected Area, viz.:—

From premises in the Infected Area (other than a market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition).

(a) to a licensed market, sale or exhibition in the Infected Area (licence Form C); or

(b) to a slaughterhouse in or outside the Infected Area (licence Form C); or

(c) to private premises in or outside the Infected Area (licence Form A, or, if for breeding purposes, Form C); or

(d) to a vessel direct for shipment or to any premises for detention until shipment (licence Form C).

From a licensed Market, sale or exhibition in the Infected Area.

to a slaughterhouse either within or outside the Infected Area (licence Form C).

(2) Before a licence (Form A) or (Form C) is granted under paragraphs (c) and (d) of this Article the owner of the swine, or his authorised agent, shall sign and produce or send to the Inspector a declaration in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order. The Inspector shall retain the declaration, and before granting the licence shall satisfy himself as far as practicable as to the correctness of the statements contained therein. No declaration is required before granting a licence for movement of swine to a licensed market, sale or exhibition, or to a slaughterhouse.

Conditions of Movement.

Detention and Isolation at Destination for 27 days of Swine moved with Licence (Form A).

Marking of Swine moved to a Slaughterhouse.

6.—(1) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) shall not, for a period of 27 days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved therefrom except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only if the swine are marked before the movement commences in the manner described in the next following paragraph of this Article, and are accompanied by a licence (Form C). Swine while detained during the said period of 27 days shall be kept separate from all other swine. This Article does not prohibit the movement of the carcase of a pig slaughtered on the premises during the said period of 27 days.

(2) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse, they shall, before the movement to the slaughterhouse commences, be marked by and at the expense of the owner, by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad

line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long, and on arrival at the slaughterhouse the swine shall be detained there until slaughtered.

(3) Swine while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other swine.

Provisions as to Licences.

7.—(a) Licences may be granted under this Order only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences;

(b) A movement licence shall not be granted by an Inspector if, in his opinion, it is undesirable to grant it, or for any movement of swine, which is prohibited by the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922;

(c) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(d) Licences must be delivered up at, or sent by post to the nearest Police Station or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences (other than licences—Form C—specifically marked “for Breeding purposes”), shall only be available for eight days including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement. Licences (Form C) specifically marked “for Breeding purposes” shall be available for 28 days, inclusive of the date thereof. If required for the purpose of service, the swine referred to therein may be moved under the authority of the licence to the same premises either on one or two occasions within the said period of 28 days and back to the original premises from which it was moved. The swine shall, on return to the original premises, be detained thereon for a period of 28 days from the date of return; provided that where movement on two occasions takes place under the licence the said period of 28 days detention shall commence on the date of return after the second movement;

(f) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the swine moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or Constable, and such person shall if required by such Officer give his name and address.

Forms.

8. The Licences (Forms A and C) required for use under this Order shall be in the forms set forth in the Second Schedule to the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, with the necessary adaptations. The declaration (Form B) shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Suspension of Regulations of Local Authority.

9. The Local Authority of any district comprised in the Infected Area is hereby empowered to suspend during the operation of this Order any regulations made by the Local Authority under the Suffolk (Swine Fever) Order of 1914.

Terms.

10. “Slaughterhouse” includes bacon factory; other terms used in this Order have the same meaning as in the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

11. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12. Any contravention of this Order or of the conditions of any licence issued thereunder, or the making of any false statement in any declaration required thereunder, shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Short Title.

14. This Order may be cited as the SUFFOLK SWINE FEVER INFECTED AREA ORDER OF 1929.
