The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

Provision for Removal of Manure etc. from Slaughterhouses in the City of Glasgow.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 7 of the principal Order as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) (Amendment) Order of 1929 manure or waste meat trimmings or any other refuse may be moved from any slaughterhouse in the City of Glasgow for conveyance by barge to a

point five miles south of Ailsa Craig for dumping, provided that permission for such movement is given in writing by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City of Glasgow, which permission shall only be given if the manure or waste meat trimmings or other refuse has been thoroughly disinfected.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 36) and shall be read with the principal Order.

3. Regulation 4 of the principal Regulations shall be read as if the words "the Executive Committee of the National Union of Agricultural Workers and the General Executive Council of the Transport and General Workers' Union" were therein substituted for "Executive Committee."

(Provision and Working of Trolley Vehicles in the Urban District of Haydock; Fares, Rates and Charges; Incidental Provisions; Abandonment or Discontinuance of Existing Tramways; Borrowing of Money; Incorporation, Repeal and Amendment of Acts.)

6. To authorise the taking of fares, rates and charges for the use of and for the carriage and conveyance of passengers and goods by such trolley vehicles, and the making and enforcement of bye-laws and regulations in relation thereto.

7. To enact that the provisions of the Town Police Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1889, and of the Tramways Act, 1870, with respect to the licensing of hackney carriages, omnibuses and light railway cars, and the drivers and conductors thereof, and with respect to the making by a local authority of bye-laws for regulating the use of such vehicles shall not apply to the trolley vehicles of the Corporation, and to provide that these matters shall be dealt with by the Minister of Transport or by some other single authority.

10.
